### News of the new medical centre in Edenbridge

Residents in the Edenbridge area are one step closer to getting their new, combined hospital and GP surgery after the NHS agreed on its preferred location on land next to the Eden Centre on Four Elms Road. The NHS will canvass views on what the new centre might look like, ahead of seeking planning permission and purchasing the land from the KCC.

Dr Simon Morrison, from Edenbridge Medical Practice, said: "There is clear evidence that having a new combined hospital and GP surgery will enable us to recruit the best GPs, nurses and other staff, and to work with the hospital teams and others, to deliver improved, holistic healthcare for the people of Edenbridge and the surrounding villages. We are excited that this project has taken a real step forward."

### Mince pie pastry

As taught at Bread Ahead, a bakery in Borough Market – this pastry is delicious and very easy to handle

For the pastry:

**375g strong white bread flour**, plus extra for dusting

**225g cold unsalted butter**, diced, plus extra for greasing

150g caster sugar

1 whole egg

1 egg yolk

1 egg, beaten, to glaze

2 tbsp demerara sugar

Rub the flour and butter together until you have the texture of ground almonds. Add the sugar and mix well. Separately whisk together the egg and yolk and gradually add to the flour mix but stop when the

mixture comes together and gently knead for 30 seconds. Wrap in clingfilm and rest in the fridge for at least 3 hours (you can leave it overnight).

Remove the pastry from the fridge about 90 mins before you want to use it. Butter a deep 12 hole bun tin. Dust with flour. Turn upside down and tap to remove the excess. Roll out the pastry on a floured surface to about 6mm. You now want to cut 24 discs for use as the bases and lids for your pies. The bases need to be large enough to overhang the individual tins. Typically a 10cm base and 7cm lid should work but do a test run. This pastry can be re-rolled as necessary. Once lined spoon in about 3 heaped teaspoons of mince meat and cover with the lids. Eggwash and then seal by bringing the overhanging pastry up onto the lids. Crimp closed with your finger tips and sprinkle with demerara. Cut a steam hole in the lids and rest in the fridge for a couple of hours.

Preheat the oven to 160°C/fan 140°C/gas 3 and bake for about 40 minutes, until golden brown. Let them stand for 5 minutes and then with a small knife, loosen gently and turn out onto a rack to cool.

Hever parish council part 2

Last month I talked about the local council structures and this month I describe the work we do for Four Elms. Hever and Markbeech.

Hever Parish Council owns and maintains the following:

- Four Elms recreation ground (the field and playground behind Four Elms Primary school)
- Hever Parish Field (opposite Hever Primary school) including the "hut"
- And also benches, bus shelters. streetlights, dog bins, defibrillators (one in Four Elms and one in Hever).

Council is kept busy ensuring their administration is executed properly and within budget whilst keeping up to date with changes and plans from District and County statutory bodies such as Sevenoaks District Council. Kent County Council and many more. Parish Councils also comment on planning applications and can be represented at public inquiries.

In the last few months we have been busy including the following projects:

- Complete replacement of Four Elms playground. The Clerk was able to source grants of ~ £15.000 and thanks to lots of practical help from local firm Willerby's. a fantastic new playground has been installed – do go and have a look!
- New website for www.hever.org for the Community - complete with Calendar and many areas for many of the local groups and facilities.
- Responding to County or District wide consultations that will affect us here in West Kent e.g. SDC Draft Local Plan and KCC waste consultation.

Plus many more – e.g. Free family fun days over Summer, Easter litter picks, bulk refuse freighters, the Village Screen film club etc. etc!

Coming up in the next few months:

- We will be planning for the 2019 2020 budaet.
- Reviewing the long history of traffic calming attempts across the parish and considering whether/ where a 20mph zone / limit would be effective or perhaps there are other solutions?
- Reviewing the results of the compulsory Housing Needs survey (undertaken every 5 years by every parish / town council) to consider affordable housing needs locally and what we can do.

We also work collaboratively with local groups, notably the Hever Residents Association. In this way we ran the successful Queen's 90th party in Hever Castle, and fund the Hever Carols in the church and the Four Elms carols round the tree. This year we are supporting the 1918 concert.

We are very pleased to award small grants to local groups, for example Edenbridge Voluntary Transport and the Samaritans.

We often debate our name because "Hever PC" does not reflect the whole parish. It is hard to think of a better name - FEVERbeech doesn't do it - do let us have any ideas.

You are always welcome to attend meetings - the next one is Tuesday 15th January 2019 at Markbeech village hall.

### Sevenoaks council news

One of the many great privileges of serving as a councillor is the range of people one meets. Everyone has a different story, bringing to meetings or events their own experiences and expertise. Often it emerges in conversation that they are quietly putting their talents to good use supporting our community through volunteering.

Our cricket clubs, our village halls and our churches are all supported by committees of residents beavering away to sustain these local institutions. We benefit from residents' associations, horticultural societies, litter picks, a citizens advice bureau, fetes, a parish council and plenty more – all led by volunteers.

A community's strength is derived in no small part from those within it and it is therefore a testament to ours that there are so many people who are able and willing to give of their time.

Recognising this, three years ago the District Council established with kind support from sponsors – and a small army of helpers – the inaugural Making It Happen Awards. I was privileged to attend the prize-giving and hear stories of truly transformative work touching the lives of thousands of people, which simply would not have occurred were it not for the generosity of others.

Duly inspired, the following year I nominated one of our own local success stories, which counts amongst its volunteers and beneficiaries many in our villages.

In a moment of particular pride, the Edenbridge Voluntary Transport Service (EVTS) went on to win Charity of the Year in appreciation of the invaluable contribution it makes to our community. In testament to their characteristic modesty and dedication, the EVTS team was not present to receive their prize at the awards ceremony as they were assiduously attending to their AGM!

I am pleased to say the awards for unsung heroes across our patch are back with a greater number of categories than ever before: charity project of the year; community arts or sports group of the year; youth group of the year; best business in the community; individual community champion; carer of the year; equalities champion; lifetime achievement; community safety; dementia friendly initiative of the year; outstanding volunteer for local attraction; and, older persons group of the year.

### **Christmas with the Astors ...and the Churchills**

Pat Humphreys worked for the Astors at Hever Castle for 20 years and then for the Guthries for another five. She was born in Cork in Ireland. Her father died when she was in her early 20s and as the unmarried daughter she was expected to stay at home and look after her

mother. But, encouraged by her sisters, she realised that she needed to live her own life and so, with only £5 in her pocket, and no family money behind her, she arrived alone in London in 1952 and got work as a secretary. Her aunts and uncles never forgave her for leaving. In 1963, after ten years of living in "ghastly" bed-sits she was offered a job in the estate office at the Castle which had recently opened it doors to the public and moved down here. She lived in a flat in the Tudor village.

hurchill, and members of their family were present at Chartwell on histmas Ray, 1955 when Rarols were sung by the Rorge Singers of Comments of Charter Reserved.

The Astors loved Christmas and every year an enormous tree was erected in the inner hall which reached right up to the ceiling. Lady Irene would decorate it (with a little help from her staff) and presents were piled underneath. Highlights were the visits of local choirs who came to sing carols. Lord Gavin Astor would lower the drawbridge as the singers approached and the family and staff would gather to listen to the singing. Afterwards sherry and mince pies were offered round - wine was not drunk much in those days.

Pat says that at the time she did not realise what a privilege it was to work at the castle. The Astors were good employers and the staff loyal, and it seemed an almost everyday experience to see the Queen and other grandees visiting, especially in the autumn for the famous Hever shoot. Pat enjoyed a happy retirement in Pigdown Lane and was busy as a churchwarden and a leading member of the Horticultural Society for many years. Her 90th birthday party at the golf club this year was a great success with locals and many relatives gathering to celebrate.

Una Higgs was singing for the Astors well before Pat was there to hear her. She recalls: "In December 1938 I was asked to join a local choir for some carol singing. Loving singing, carols and Christmas I looked forward in anticipation. Our destination was Hever, our transport an open backed lorry used for delivering coal, which for our use had been swept and fitted with wooden benches (few people had cars in those days)! There had been an early fall of

snow, and the landscape sparkling in frost was lit by a low full moon in the sky, a Christmas card scene giving just the right atmosphere as we were driven along. Arriving at the castle we were set down by the drawbridge which we crossed to a warm, well lit Christmassy interior. There was a beautifully decorated tree reaching to the ceiling and huge swathes of evergreens crisscrossing above our heads.

In the great hall we were greeted by J J Astor and his wife Lady Violet where we sang the carols in a very relaxed atmosphere, our hosts chatting with members of the choir in between. After about half an hour we made our farewells to the family and went to the kitchens where the French chef waited eagerly to join in our singing and rewarded each of us with a large orange.

By the next Christmas, 1939, there was no more carol singing as the war had overtaken us, but in 1949 I thought the time had come to revive old traditions and I gathered together a few friends, rehearsed, discovered that Hever was delighted to have us and set off.

The next year we did the same and it was during our rehearsals that the idea of singing through the year and perhaps give a charity concert was voiced and that was how the Forge Singers began and they are still alive and active locally. As more and more people joined the singers we became more ambitious and undertook musicals and an annual pantomime. The highlight of the Singers story must be the visit to Chartwell in 1955 to sing carols to Winston Churchill

and his wife on Christmas Day. We were asked to time it at 5 o'clock which meant we had to reshuffle a lot of our own family arrangements, but we all agreed it was something we had to do, and seeing the great man in his siren suit and slippers enjoying our singing is something none of us will ever forget."

And, as Helen Francis, PR Executive writes, Hever Castle continues it's Christmas traditions today, with rooms of the Castle beautifully decorated and themed around tales including the Nutcracker, The Tailor of Gloucester and 'Twas the Night Before Christmas' with twinkling lights and welcoming log fires. Outside visitors can enjoy a festive interactive trail themed around Charles Dickens' 'A Christmas Carol'. As dusk falls, the gardens are illuminated with uplighting and colour washes.

Christmas activities also include a carousel and vintage fairground and on selected dates visitors can pose for a picture with a husky.

### news from Hever

This month, the children have been busy learning and remembering our fallen soldiers.

In year 6, all the children made tissue paper poppies to create a splendid wreath. ### Country and gardening

#### Dear friends,

There is smoke in the chimneys, fires are lit every evening and the smell is cheerful and welcoming. Wood ash is good stuff to spread on your flower and vegetable beds, or your pots, rich in potassium (pot-ash) and good for your fruiting plants next year.

This time of year is already too cold and too wet. Plants feel the change as much as us. Nothing seems to dry out before spring comes round again, and it is time to put the garden to bed for the winter. Nevertheless, even though it is warming and cosy to light a fire, you must beware while stockings go up in the fireplace: because "Santa Klaus is coming to town". But Christmas is much more than that, it is about feelings and good cheer, a very special season.

In the southern hemisphere the monsoon brings good cheer (I don't mean that Christmas is not well celebrated there as well!). The greatest river on earth moves in the air, and with it big herds travel thousands of miles to get to water. Many plants cope for long periods without rain, but sooner or later they will all need a good drink. Without rain plants cannot survive and we know all life depends upon plants. The vegetation in the northeast of my home country, Brazil, seems dead during the dry season - you can only see leafless trees with contorted trunks over hot, dry, soil; any green

is just from cactus trees. Mandacaru (Cereus jamacaru) is a tree cactus that comes into flower just before the rain arrives. How it times the bloom with the rain is anyone's guess. But some cactus are epiphytes, and one of them takes pride of place in many households during Christmas, the Christmas cactus (Schlumbergera truncata). Our May flower, as it is known back home, is native to rainforests, where it is humid and warm but protected from direct sun, making it a perfect house plant.

In Brazil it flowers in May when winter is just arriving, so here it flowers between November and January ideal for the Christmas table. They need to be fed and watered regularly, but not excessively: cacti are not fond of too much water except during their growing season. Despite coming from the tropics they enjoy cooler temperatures. Apart from that, repot them every 2 years and enjoy their colourful cheer throughout Christmas, alongside all the activities drawing us to the mother church to join our neighbours in the divine blessings.

Really, spirit of Christmas is found in our hearts, not down the chimneys. Merry Christmas!
