

Tina Jobson

Tina, the much-loved landlady of the Kentish Horse died suddenly on 31 January at the early age of 63. Over 200 people attended her funeral at Markbeech on 1 March and her children and husband, Trevor, put together the following eulogy:

"Trevor and Tina met while in the same class at Holy Trinity School in Crawley, when they were 12 years old. When they were 15, and had both already left home to go to work, Trevor one day spotted Tina walking in the town wearing only one shoe, holding the other broken shoe in her hand and he persuaded his friend who was driving to stop and give her a lift home. They courted off and on for their teenage years until one day Tina said "we either get married or I'm off to Belgium", so in 1977 they married in Warnham Church, and lived in Horsham. Tina, working in Mr Doughnut - the start of her catering career!

They moved to Ashdown Forest in 1978 where Kerry and Gary were born. Tina ran her own outside catering company and ran a pub kitchen. They had 23 wonderful years on the forest, Tina insisting on having ponies, dogs, cats and various other animals!

In 2000, they took on The Old House at Home in Dormansland and had 11 busy, fun years and made many good friends. Turning the pub into a vibrant business, driven by Tina's fantastic, home-cooked pub menu and large portions! If Trevor ever put the food prices up, she would go out and buy bigger plates! Her creative flair didn't stop in the kitchen,

every year Tina would create an amazing float for Dormansland carnival. One year painting Trevor's tractor the colour of a fairground ride – by hand!

Her hard work and traditional menu. have once again turned the Kentish Horse into a thriving community pub. It presented different challenges to The Old House at Home due to the sheer scale of the building and all-day opening, but this did not deter Tina, she relished the challenge and, as we all know, was never one to shy from hard graft! The common thread between both pubs was Tina's caring approach to the staff, making them feel part of the family - there was always time for a chat and cup of tea and she even managed to find time and took pleasure in caring for animals or housesitting, to help others.

Trevor and the family would like to thank you for all of your support during this difficult time. We have been overwhelmed by the amount of cards, flowers and offers of help we have received."

What I do...Christine Thompson works as a volunteer advisor for one day a week at Citizens Advice.

Volunteering opportunities include giving advice to clients, fundraising, admin, media, trusteeship and more. It is not necessary to have specific experience or qualifications to volunteer. Training and information are provided to enable volunteers to carry out their roles. Through courses you are given a chance to develop skills in communication, problem solving and analysis.

Citizens Advice makes a positive difference to people's lives, both for the clients and the volunteers. You feel valued working as part of a team. It gives an awareness and knowledge of your local area, the issues affecting daily lives and community. country life

'Bring me sunshine in your smile, bring me laughter all the while'. Spring is here! Well, not quite. Or is it?

I am back to write to you about spring. But what is spring? When does it start? The short answer would be: a season that starts with the summer equinox in March. And yet...

As a child I was told that spring was the flower's season. We still excitedly expect the spring flowers to arrive in our garden, although through gardening we stretch the blooming of flowers for as long as possible throughout the year. So, in one way I was told the right thing.

Yet, as I was growing up I understood that spring is not only about flowers. All forms of life, including flowers, have a distinct purpose: reproduction and, through it, eternity. In this regard a plant's success depends in many ways on insects, birds and mammals. Plants and animals both depend very much on light and temperature.

So, spring to me is the fantastic combination of warm days, a colourful garden, the noise of busy bees and the excited flights of birds preparing nests, singing to attract partners for the season. But to a farmer Spring is all about lambing and calving.

Well, if spring has so much to show and to give, when does it start? In March when the daffodils are already making space for the coming of tulips and primroses, or much earlier when snowdrops are in full bloom alongside crocuses and hellebores? Bees may be drawn to early activity due to rising temperatures, but will they survive a late frost? Where will migratory birds find delicious grubs to feed the next generation if insects are emerging much earlier in the season?

We must enjoy the coming season and delight ourselves with the colourful sight of our gardens, but we must keep a careful eye and helping hand out for others. On this little planet we are all linked, in one way or another.

Have a great time throughout this wonderful season.

a potted history

The Hever Rose and Horticultural Society: On 6th August 1901, a small group of local inhabitants sat down to establish the 'Hever Cottage Gardening Society', and 118 years later, with a couple of name changes, it is still going. Its stated objective was to promote cottage gardening in Hever* and that 'a minimum annual subscription of sixpence be paid in advance by all members'. The first President was the Rev. Latham Browne, vicar of St. Peter's from 1890 to 1920. A flower show was held on the 29th August with each class winner receiving a prize of three shillings, worth about £13 today! The show was considered a great success with a total of 50 entries and for the 1902 show Mr Meade Waldo offered an additional prize of £1 shared between the best cultivated gardens. The Meade Waldos owned Hever Castle from 1750 to 1903, although they lived in Stonewall Park and let the property to a series of tenant farmers.

The schedule for the summer show of 1914 still exists, so we can conclude that the Society continued successfully until then. The show that year was held on Wednesday, August 12th, eight days after Britain declared war on Germany. There were a total of 51 separate classes, divided into vegetable, flowers, fruit, best cultivated gardens and an 'Industrial Section'. Many of the fruit, vegetable and flower classes would be recognisable in our own shows but some clearly belong to that earlier period. For example, the

Industrial Section included a prize for 'Darning of stockings or socks' for women and girls over 14 years of age and 'Best washed, starched and ironed shirt, collar and cotton dress' for women over 20. Records after 1914 are sadly missing and there does not seem to have been any activity during the twenties and thirties, although there was a West Kent garden competition and an estate garden competition initiated by Lady Violet Astor.

Minute books from 1948 show that the Society had reformed to become the Hever Horticultural Society with Lady Astor as President. Committee meetings were held in the Henry VIII and in 1949 a large summer show was held in the grounds of Hever Castle with children's sports



and sideshows. There were 86 classes including one open only to local WI branches, including a prize of 2/6 for the best jam sandwich. Hever Castle continued to be the venue until 1955, when shows were held in the Hever School field. In 1974 Lord Astor sponsored a garden competition and in 1979 he suggested the Society hold a rose show in conjunction with the South East England Rose Society. This was held in the Castle Pavilion and the following year the Society held its own show in Hever Village Hall, where shows have been held since. From 1979 the Society became what it is today, the Hever Rose and Horticultural Society. The Society is always seeking new members so why not help it keep going for another 118 vears.

*Cottage gardens were in vogue in 1901 as exponents such as Gertrude Jekyll and the Arts and Crafts movement had rejected the more formal gardening of the Victorian era. The watercolourist Helen Allingham, painted many romantic cottage gardens in front of thatched cottages, full of hollyhocks, daisies, sweet william and also vegetables in the Eden Valley.

Exotic visitors

When Una Higgs spotted a mob of parakeets on her bird feeders we feared a Hitchcockian invasion of the birds. The south London parks are already full of their tropical colour - is Hever next, with the worry that their rapidly expanding numbers deprive our native birds such as starlings and nuthatches of the best nest holes?

Well, according to the RSPB we should not fear - this area is not their ideal habitat and the charity do not support a cull although any expansion should be monitored. The government is obliged to ensure that non-native species do not adversely affect native wildlife and has developed a policy framework for addressing the possible risks associated with such species becoming established. Ring-necked parakeets, like all birds living in the wild in the UK, are protected by law. The species can be controlled under licence in England, but only in isolated cases where the birds pose a serious threat to conservation of a native species, are causing serious damage to crops, or for air safety purposes.

So we should appreciate the marvellous ability of these birds, native to a broad belt of arid tropical countryside stretching from west Africa across lowland India south of the Himalayas, to survive our cold winters and bring some winter colour to our trees. An immigrant worth tolerating, if not welcoming - for now(??!!)






