

profile: Ann Greig



Ann Grieg was brought up in a large house in Portman Square, a prestigious London address just behind Selfridges. They had eight servants, including a butler and footmen, and led the grand life that her father's career, as a successful property developer, had earned him. Queen Mary was a regular visitor, the hazard being that if she liked a particular piece of furniture the convention was that she had to be given it!

But then tragedy struck. When Ann was only 13 the Second World War broke out and both her naval brothers were killed and her mother died of cancer. Her father was to die soon after of a heart attack.

In 1944, aged 18 and alone in the world Ann decided she need a job as she did not want to lead the life of a lady who lunched and so she wandered down Baker Street and fell into a job with the Special Operations Executive, also known as the "Baker

Street irregulars" or the "Ministry of Ungentlemanly Warfare".

It was top secret work and she cannot remember how she was recruited but she loved it and was part of an operation sending secret agents into occupied Norway via Scotland to help the Norwegian resistance and, as Ann puts

it, "to sort out the Germans". Ann enabled a network of radio operators in Norway and by 1945 there were 64 operators spread throughout sending back vital information to the Allies. After the war Ann went to Norway to help clear up and was delighted to meet some of the agents who she had known so well on the airwaves. She still remembers quite a bit of Norwegian.

When staying at St Margaret's Bay near Dover where the family had a holiday home Ann met her future husband. Dennis Greig, who had been invalided out out of the Airforce with TB. They were married in 1948 and started life together farming above the white cliffs. However, family duty soon ended that way of life. Dennis came from the family which ran the David Greig supermarket chain (founded by Dennis's grandfather in 1870) and although he had chosen not to go into to the family business, he was forced to pack up farming and work there when his elder brother died unexpectedly.



The Greigs moved to a farm on Five Fields Lane in Four Elms in 1953 to be near London and Ann has been there ever since. When Greigs was sold to Key supermarkets which became Somerfield the Greigs started a chicken farm and ran that for many years. They were also heavily involved in the early years of the Cheshire Homes. They knew Leonard Cheshire well and Dennis was on the

Board. The Greigs hosted many fundraising events at the farm and even had a special swimming pool built to make it accessible to disabled people. Sadly Dennis had a skiing accident from which he never fully recovered and he died in 2004.

Ann had five children and now has countless

grandchildren and great grandchildren. She loves Four Elms and has been a great benefactor of the Church and the Fete. At 92 Ann is still a force of nature, full of enthusiasm and energy, she says her role was always to support her husband and work behind the scenes to enable him and bring up the family. What a partnership it must have been.

aircraft noise

The campaigning group Gatwick Obviously Not (www. gatwickobviouslynot.org) has issued this report.....

Gatwick has just confirmed that they wish to:

- Use new technology to build capacity and resilience on the main runway;
- Bring the existing standby runway into routine use, for departure only, alongside the main runway by the mid-2020s:
- Recommend that planning policy continues to safeguard land for an additional runway.

Taken together these proposals would increase flights using the airport by about 40% and passenger numbers by over 80% with inevitable consequences for noise, emissions and congestion, while retaining the possibility of a new third runway too. Given the environmental concerns for the Planet, so powerfully stated by Greta Thunberg, we think they're in Cloud-Cuckoo land. White elephant anyone?

"Sweden's departure lounges are looking less crowded as more

Swedes are deciding to take the train rather than fly. Passenger numbers at Swedish airports have dropped 8% so far this year. The fall-off coincides with the rise of Sweden's latest buzzword: "flygskam", or flight shame."

However, no one is complacent. Gatwick means business. GON recently met with the newish Independent Aircraft Noise Commission, ICCAN, in Penshurst. It's not the new Regulator which this spoilt industry so desperately needs but a group looking to 'take control of the noise agenda'. It was a constructive meeting and we look forward to their plans taking real effect.

MPs have formed a 'co-ordination group', Chaired by Tom Tugendhat MBE MP and this is an extract from their statement:

"Gatwick has grown significantly over the past decade. It has offered greater numbers of flights to more destinations and created jobs in the process. However, the benefits of growth have not been well distributed with the local community.

More people are impacted by Gatwick's noise operations than 10 years ago, both close to the airport and many miles away under flightpaths, creating health issues for local residents and congestion through inadequate infrastructure.

"Over the past few years Gatwick Airport has continually under invested in the local amenities and social infrastructure that would be required to support a project of this size and scale. We cannot support expansion of the Airport without a comprehensive investment in the local area which would ease pressure on the over-stretched road and rail systems serving the airport.

At a time of increasing concern about the environmental impact of global aviation growth, the proposed expansion plans would see a marked increase in carbon emissions, with clearer environmental consequences for us all. We should not be looking at unchecked expansion at our local airports but seeking managed growth that is proportionate to our other national priorities."

Please continue to tell us your concerns, we have been delighted to see more of you at the meetings, please keep coming. The dates are on the website hever.org, Facebook and the four noticeboards (at Hever station, Hever parish field, Markbeech centre and the Four Elms bus shelter).

LATEST NEWS:

- The Four Elms bus shelter that was damaged last year by a vehicle will be replaced in August with an improved version – complete with bench and community noticeboard.
- We have won grants from Kent County Council towards the total refurbishment of the eastbound bus shelter in Four Elms (with new bench and new noticeboard) and the one in Markbeech too.
- With Hever Residents Association, we have reported to GTR on how to spend the £30,000 allocated to Hever station (see the full report http://hever.org/hpchra-report-on-how-to-spend-30000-athever-station). Thanks to everyone for their ideas, we asked for the following (in order of preference);
- 1. Canopy over the ticket machine
- 2. Landscaping of the platforms (weed removal, native species planting and maintenance)
- 3. Refurbishment of the existing passenger shelters
- 4. Artwork on the platforms to reflect the historic nature of the village
- 5. Additional seating on London bound platform

Continuing with a transport theme the latest Gatwick plan set out on page 7 will be considered at the next Council meeting and also at the next HWCAAG meeting, of which the Council is a member.

We are happy to report that we have passed another year with a clean bill of health from the Govt. appointed external auditors (PKF Littlejohn) of our accounts and management. We start planning for the 2020 – 2021 (yes, really!) budget at the next meeting – do you have a view on what the Council should spend money on?

Sevenoaks council news

Change, particularly improvements, can sometimes pass one by. So from time to time it's worth reflecting on where things once were.

Cowden and Hever Stations are a good example. Both are witnessing record use – nearly a hundred thousand passengers each year. And over half a million in Edenbridge. It may not always feel like it but that growth has coincided with enhancements.

In recent years we've received additional carriages, gained trains, and secured the introduction of ticket machines and live departure boards.

We might be on the right track but there is further to go. Punctuality, reliability and capacity continue to top the list; replacement bus improvements, and that elusive electrification too. However there is no doubt our rail service is a draw for villagers as well as those further afield.

It was therefore welcome to see some

new money come our way earlier this year, with passengers setting priorities on how to spend the £60k. Shelters and canopies at Hever took first place in the list of your requests, closely followed by visual improvements and seating. And it is no surprise the priority at Cowden was parking. These I have echoed and endorsed with Southern.

Covering Cowden's parking problems requires more attention than column inches allow but this funding is a rare chance to look again at this issue. So I have urged Southern to match the scale of this opportunity with a suitably ambitious proposal, and offered to lead a steering group to deliver a scheme. Let's hope they rise to this challenge.

In the meantime, as ever, please do not hesitate to get in touch if there's anything with which I might be able to assist.

Hever footpaths

Hever Parish Council have considered in recent years, in response to residents' and walkers' requests, how to promote and enhance the experience of walkers by having dog and user friendly pathways with clear access and signposting. This supports a positive, healthy, active lifestyle and local tourism. We have worked with local landowners, tourist attractions, walking groups and the Kent County Council public rights of way officer.

Landowners are responsible for maintaining stiles and gates in a safe condition and to the required standard of repair in accordance with Section 146 of the Highways Act 1980.

Kent County Council are obliged to contribute a minimum of 25% towards the reasonable cost of maintenance. This contribution has traditionally been through the provision of the materials necessary for repairs.

To assist in reducing the burden on landowners the County Council is willing to provide a self-closing gate (cost price £130.00) for the landowners' installation. Due to the additional costs KCC ask for a minimum contribution of £30.00 towards the cost of the gate and administration. The gates provided are of a very high quality, constructed from galvanised steel, and have an expected life of approximately three times longer than a stile.

Responsibility for the maintenance of the gate will remain with the landowner.

Some Ramblers groups, for example, have given money to have gates installed to replace existing authorised stiles in memory of one of their members, and put a plaque up on the gate. The maintenance of the gate would still remain the responsibility of the landowner/tenant.

The installation costs vary between about £150 to £250 depending on the location, ease of access and the terrain.

Hever Parish Council wish to encourage landowners to consider replacing any unsuitable stiles with more durable, accessible ones and costs incurred could be requested via our grant application process. Please contact clerk@hever.org with any queries.

Four Elms Fete

Since 1953 there has been a celebration in Four Elms, started by the Vicar originally for Queen Elizabeth's Coronation.

Now, in 2019, here is a reflection on this year's Four Elms Village Fete after the 66th successful year.

The Committee (Fete) are responsible for the infrastructure and services that allow the Fete to continue year on year. We have a not-for-profit policy, our objective being to provide a fun, affordable community event..

There are essential annual costs such as insurance, first aid, toilets, entertainments and so forth and also we investment in marquees, tables and equipment for ongoing operations. We have also, over the years, gratefully received gifts, for example from the Parish Council which supplied storage facilities for our equipment.

Since about 2003 the operation of the infrastructure is separate from the fete attractions (stalls and so forth). Typically the School and Church run their own stalls and retain any profit, for example the ever popular dog show is a Church attraction.

The Fete itself runs car parking, bar, Willerby maze, and groups such as, this year, pony and miniature train rides and welly wanging. We supply a free fete programme which carries paid advertising.

Other stalls are welcome but the Committee keeps it a traditional village fete with stalls or attractions that demonstrate local skills, support groups or Charities and games in the main ring which are all free. There is a small charge for external groups.

We have been fortunate, although hard work has helped, to run an excess of revenue over cost. Our Committee distributes this excess to support those that help us and deserving causes. Records show that we have helped Edenbridge hospital, local charitable and emergency services, the school and church and many other good causes. This year we are supporting:

- RAF Benevolent Fund (BBMF flypast)
- ReBuild (car parking squad)
- Edenbridge Bonfire (stage and sounds)
- Lewis Project (live music)
- Girl Guides
- Four Elms Village Hall

Over the years we have received so much hidden help that has gone unnoticed or unrecognised. This year we established an "Unsung Hero" award that recognises those individuals that support the fete year in year out, setting up, pulling down, putting away, fixing broken things, and generally making us ready for the best Fete in the area. This year the recipients of the award are John Pearce and Richard Bennett with a donation to the Charities of their choice, an Animal Rescue centre and the Kent Air Ambulance.

I hope you find this report useful and will be looking forward to the 2020 fete on Saturday the 11th July.

Gardening from How Green

My goodness how this year has flown! It only seems like yesterday when we were embroiled with the Chelsea Flower Show, working around the clock without enough hours in the day! We now find ourselves in September and worryingly spiralling towards Christmas!

September can be a fantastic month in the gardening calendar. If the weather behaves and we get an Indian Summer it can be a lovely and productive time. The sunshine can still have enough strength to allow us to sit and enjoy and it's also one of the best times to plant for the following season. There are also plenty of plants that give late season colour and interest that can go through until November and beyond. Here are some ideas for plants that will enhance a garden in September:

Rudbeckias – a broad genus that includes low growing, mid and tall flowering varieties. Our pick of the best at the nursery are deamii, 'Summerina Orange' & a fab tall variety called 'Prairie Glow'!

Salvias – again, a huge range with some stunning late flowering varieties. We love 'Amistad' a tall majestic plant brooding purple flowers with black calyx – also looking forward to a brand new variety of Amistad with magenta flowers called 'Amante'!

Asters (now reclassified as Symphiotrichon) – common name Michaelmas Daises give lasting colour from shades of pink, purple, blue & white. Our pick of the bunch are 'Little Carlow', 'Monch' and 'Beth Chatto' Agastache – also known as giant Hyssop, a fabulous plant with aromatic foliage, long flowering season and attracts bees and insects. Be careful as a number of varieties are not hardy. We offer the following that are more reliable. 'Blue Fortune', 'After Eight', 'Black Adder' & a great new variety called 'Blue Boa'.

Anemone japonica – Japanese Anemone are great for late season colour. Our best sellers are 'Honorine Jobert', 'September Charm' and 'Dainty Swan'.

Ornamental Grasses – A huge range including front, mid and back of the border plants. Used in conjunction with flowering perennials they offer movement, height, transparency and add interest throughout the Winter months. We recommend Miscanthus 'Ferner Osten', Panicum 'Squaw', Pennisteum 'Karley Rose'.

September is a great month for planting perennials and shrubs. The ground is warm and hopefully some moisture in the ground after Autumn rain. This in turn leads to good root growth making the plant strong and sturdy ready for the Winter months. Come and see for yourself at our final public open weekend of 2019 - our last hoorah for the gardening season and the nursery will be rammed to the gunnels with lots of new & desirable plants! There will also be delicious home-made tea and cake served up the surrounds of the nursery garden. Open September 7th & 8th from 9am-5pm both days.




