## HEVER CASTLE SNOWDROP WALK FROM 8 FEBRUARY 2020

A heavenly carpet of snowdrops will provide a magical trail for visitors to follow at Hever Castle & Gardens from 8th February.

Around 80,000 snowdrop bulbs have been planted in the Gardens over the past few years including a mix of single and double snowdrops, interspersed with some unusual varieties such as the yellow tipped

'Wendy's Gold', a giant *Galanthus* called 'Colossus' which at 9 inches is one of the tallest snowdrops you can find and *Galanthus* 'Green Brush' with its unusual green tipped flowers.

Award winning garden writer Val Bourne will also be giving a talk entitled *The Wonderful World of Galanthophilia* on Saturday 8th February at 1pm.

## remembering Anne Simmonds

Elly Heard delivered a tribute to Anne at her funeral on 23 December. Here is part what she said:

“Anne lived all her life in the South East of England. Born in Crowborough in 1937, an only child, her childhood was marred by the death of her father whom she adored. As she grew up she stayed at home to help and support her mother. Eventually she met and married Geoff and in the early 70s they moved into Terry’s Farm in Rectory Lane.

Anne was a devoted wife and she loved her home, which was always immaculate. She was wonderfully hospitable and produced mouthwatering eats at her parties. She also loved her garden and took endless delight in the fabulous display of roses, wisteria and the glorious ornamental cherries which she had planted.

She had a wide range of interests, perhaps the most important was her love of acting. For many years she belonged to the Tunbridge Wells Amateur Operatic and Dramatic Society and the Pantiles Players and had major roles in many of the productions as well as working on costumes and scenery. She became passionate about opera and classical music, making regular trips to London, Glyndebourne and the Barn at Leigh. She was critical of any soprano or tenor who did not meet her exacting standards.

Anne was also a great country lover. She was able to identify many species

of wildlife as her father had taught her so much about nature. She frequently carried a camera to record what caught her eye. Of course she loved walking with her dog. After the demise of a particularly wild English setter she got Oliver, her first springer spaniel, followed eventually by Ben. Ashdown Forest, Hartfield or the sea shore – all favoured places for walks. The space, the peace and quiet were very precious to her. That was one of the reasons why she loved Africa. It was a great disappointment to her that she never did get to Uzbekistan.

After Geoff’s death in 2010 her spaniel was her constant companion. She was devoted to her animals and had a great empathy with them. The arrival of the donkeys was a real joy, it was a dream fulfilled. And she adored horses. We spent many happy hours ringside at the South East Shire Horse Association Show enjoying watching the heavy horses. All this accompanied by a glass (or two) of wine and smoked salmon sandwiches. She was a great supporter of the Brook Hospital for Animals in Cairo.

As a widow Anne refused to be reclusive. Instead she blossomed into the Anne we all knew and loved. The conversion of the barn was a project which she revelled in - planning it exactly as she wanted it and moving in about six years ago. Another of her talents was art. She was very artistic and she held a regular painting group in her house. She recently went to Vienna to see the Monet and Brueghel

.exhibitions with her friends Rosemary and Una.

Anne also became more involved with St Peter's Church - doing the cleaning and organising the flower rota. She also organised the distribution of the Link Magazine in Hever.



She treated herself to a new car, the Mini, which she thoroughly enjoyed. Whilst Geoff had a succession of classic sports cars, Anne had a modest Ford Escort in which she provided the rescue service with her sensible car, and a certain amount of smugness I'm sure, when his broke down. She did eventually have an orange MG which she loved.

Anne was a very private person, always interested in other people but never giving away much about herself. She was fiercely independent and had a wicked sense of humour, and it was this

strength of character that sustained her through the relentless onset of disability during the last two years. In her quiet way she made a great impression on all who knew her. She is greatly missed."

Her friend and executor, Vicki Ellinger, wrote this:

"I got to know Anne in 1985. She drove an orange MG and she and Oliver [her dog], in the passenger seat, cut a bit of a dash. We walked the dogs together and put the world to rights, saw each other through operations and the less attractive side of life and after Geoff died she joined the singles. Her energy and determination were formidable and she did not tolerate fools, she was very special and generous.

I have been completely bowled over by the kindness of the Hever residents in all that they have done for Anne during her illness and in particular the close neighbours, who could have done no more.

Anne so wanted to get to the beach again this Christmas day, so Rosemary and I will endeavour to get there and toast her with her chosen King's Ginger. The lady had style!

Joanna Wade writes: "Although I only knew Anne a short time, she made a big impression. Her ashes are to be interred in the churchyard at St Peter's next to Geoff and her infant daughter Lucy whose death, many years ago, she bore so stoically. Finally, many thanks to Anne for introducing us to King's Ginger - which is delicious."

## what Anne Boleyn and I do

I'm a full-time researcher and author specialising in Tudor history, and particularly the Boleyn family, who, of course, are a big part of Hever's history. I began the Anne Boleyn Files website in 2009 and this, in turn, led to me starting the Tudor Society and writing ten history books, including *The Fall of Anne Boleyn: A Countdown* and *George Boleyn: Tudor Poet, Courtier and Diplomat* (co-written with Claire Cherry).

I also run a very active YouTube channel, The Anne Boleyn Files and Tudor Society, where I vlog about Anne Boleyn and do "on this day in Tudor history" videos on a daily basis.

Queen Anne Boleyn has always been my historical heroine, and Hever was a big part of her life. Anne spent her formative years at Hever Castle, before being sent to Mechelen and then the royal court of France, and then retreated to the castle when King Henry VIII started pursuing her. She also suffered sweating sickness there, as did her father, Thomas Boleyn, Earl of Wiltshire and Ormond. Hever was her safe haven and home. It is also where

the Thomas and Elizabeth Boleyn would have grieved after the brutal executions of Queen Anne and her brother, George, Lord Rochford, in May 1536.

St Peter's Church would have been the Boleyn family's place of worship and it is also the resting place of Anne's father, Thomas Boleyn, and her brother, Henry, who sadly died in infancy. Another child, Thomas, was laid to rest at nearby Penshurst.

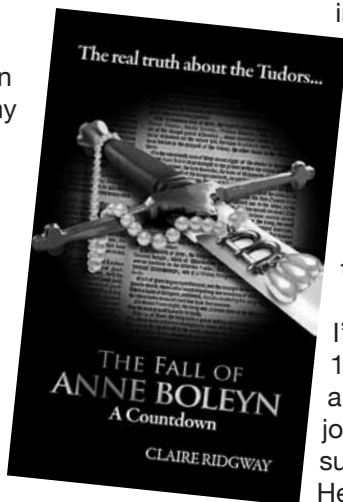
I love visiting Hever, the castle and the church, and paying my respects to the Boleyns. I also bring tours here as I feel that walking in historical people's footsteps gives us insights into their life and brings

history alive. It gives us such a connection with the past. I much prefer visiting Hever, where Anne would have spent happy carefree times, to visiting the Tower of London, where she spent those awful last days.

I'm presently working on my 11th book, *Hever: A Castle and its People*, which is a joint project with Hever Castle supervisor, Owen Emmerson. Hever Castle has such a rich history and we want to tell

its story through the very different people who owned it and resided in it, who all put their stamp on it in some way.

## Sevenoaks council news

It's about putting the right houses in the right places with the right infrastructure. That's how I described the Local Plan some seventeen months ago, as it approached its conclusion. If approved by the Government's Inspector, their Plan would deliver housing, jobs and infrastructure investment, whilst protecting the environment and seeing no sites proposed for development in the three villages in our Benefice.

Submitted for the Inspector's consideration in April, she proceeded to conduct the public hearings. However, as you may have heard, these came to an abrupt halt in October. The stated reason being a failure to comply with what is known as the Duty to Cooperate.

The Duty to Cooperate is an obligation to work with neighbouring planning authorities on matters of common interest and, all importantly, establish whether a neighbouring borough might be able to take part or all of an unmet identified housing need. Sevenoaks have engaged with neighbouring authorities, and those further afield, for years. It is, the District Council believes, fundamentally untrue for the Inspector to either state or imply that the Council did not satisfy the Duty to Cooperate and in any case if she had such concerns, why did she initially continue with the hearings – at public expense – when the Duty to Cooperate was considered on the very first day?

Regrettably there exists an impasse and the Inspector now threatens to

reject the draft Plan having expressed an unwillingness to engage further with the authority. The Council could withdraw its draft Plan, begin again, at great cost to taxpayers like you and me, and develop a political plan without the evidence base on which local authorities are obliged to produce these documents. But that would be to set ourselves up for failure.

Equally, the Council could have developed a plan which would accept wholesale the imposition of housing and permit the desecration of the precious local landscape we all so hold dear. But these are an inheritance of which we as a community, and we as a Council, are custodians. Anything which jeopardises it should not be contemplated.

This is why the Council is standing by the draft Local Plan. A Plan supported by evidence and which is the product of your constructive and patient engagement over nearly four years. And a plan which both satisfies the Government's requirements and defends our Green Belt and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

# Hever Parish Council

The last meeting of Hever Parish Council was in November, draft minutes (to be approved at next meeting on 21st January) are online <http://hever.org/draft-minutes-of-meeting-of-hever-parish-council-21-11-19>. It was a very interesting and varied meeting (all are welcome to all the meetings), with an update from the Senior Planning Enforcement Officer, Sevenoaks District Council (SDC).

Did you know that SDC has the biggest enforcement caseload in Kent? Enforcement can be a civil (e.g. beds in sheds, caravans, permitted development) or criminal matter (e.g. listed buildings, Tree Preservation orders, advertising).

The budget plans were considered and decided on. The budget for 2020- 2021 will lead to a tiny increase in the parish councils part of each household's council tax – from £65.91 to £66.89 per year per band D household. Village halls are to receive £500 each and each church £1,000 before the end of this financial year and £1,000 to Hever school towards their sensory garden. We await details of the Four Elms school grant application.

Next financial year (2020-2021) the Council decided expenditure including:

- £500 to each school and £1,000 to each church for the year (which will be instead of any further grant applications)
- to increase spend on “environmental works” e.g. bulk refuse visits to £1,000 / year (4 visits), litter picking in Oct / Nov ~ £250 (in addition to the Community Easter one), hedge cutting etc. Other plans are:
- to gradually fund the restoration of some old wrought iron fingerposts and replace others

support a parish wide Victory in Europe picnic for the whole community at Hever Castle on 8 May. For information about the celebrations nationwide see [www.veday75.org](http://www.veday75.org)

All community groups are encouraged to apply for grants for suitable projects – forms online at <http://hever.org/parish-council/hever-parish-council-community-support-grants>

The Parish Council continue to work with the Rural and Community Housing Manager (Action with Communities in Rural Kent) [www.ruralkent.org.uk](http://www.ruralkent.org.uk) and the English Rural Housing Association to consider the parish wide need for affordable housing. See <http://hever.org/hever-parish-council-call-for-sites-for-local-needs-homes> for more information.

The free summer family fun days the Parish Council organises and funds (in conjunction with Sevenoaks District Council) were another success last Summer - 16 children attended the Markbeech session (31st July) and 63 in Hever (12th August). We hope to organise more this summer.

Do come to a Parish Council meeting, and particularly the Annual Assembly on Thursday May 28 in Hever village hall

## Falconhurst Farm Shop

“Finally, you’re open!” This is what we’ve been hearing constantly as people have stepped through the door of the shop since we opened on 18th December. It has been a very, very long road to get to the point we are now.

We first fell in love with the idea of opening a deli style shop over 15 years ago after spending endless hours browsing the wonderful delights of similar shops local to us as well as seeking out new ones wherever we visited. The usual distractions of jobs, mortgages and children overshadowed our great plans but they stayed in the back of our minds ticking away. We moved back to Markbeech in 2014 into Falconhurst Farmhouse and spent the following years exploring various farm

buildings on the estate and assessing their suitability for transforming into a farm shop and deli.

Work started to convert the former garage at the top of Falconhurst drive in Spring 2019. We naively thought this would be a quick straightforward process! After completing the planning application process the water, drainage and electricity all had to be updated but we were very lucky to receive funding through the Rural Development Programme for England (RDPE) towards part of the building work and equipment to fit out the shop. When fitting out the shop we tried

to repurpose as much as possible from the estate – apple crates, trestle ladders and leather trunks are all put to good use, with a very heavy solid old workbench taking pride of place as you enter.

The farm shop has a fantastic cheese counter with a mix of local and well-known popular cheeses along with all the little extras to go with them. Fresh bread with all the other essentials of milk, eggs, butter, yogurt, fruit and vegetables as well as numerous other items to tempt you, including Weald Smokery products, ByRuby frozen meals and Rowdy & Fancy chocolates.

Our alcohol licence came through a day before opening (phew!) so we are pleased to stock local beer, cider, wine and spirits.



Having got to grips with the till system and improving our cheese cutting and wrapping skills our first challenge of 2020 will be mastering our beautiful (but rather intimidating) Faema espresso machine. With a small seating area inside the farm shop the warmer months will enable people to take their drinks with them to explore the wildflower garden, pond and woods behind the farm shop or sit on the patio and soak up some of those much-needed rays of sunshine. We are open Monday to Saturday from 10am to 5pm and you can find us on Cowden Pound Road in Markbeech. Pop in and say Hi!

### From the register

#### Funeral

December 23rd Anne Simmonds Hever

2019 was, from a gardening perspective, a mixture of successes and failures at our house. On the plus side I was particularly pleased with how our espaliered fruit trees are developing. These are Braeburn and Discovery apples and a Conference pear. This is a great way of making the most of space, and their shapes can be quite attractive when covered in blossom. Ours are about five years old and gave a good crop last year. I am now in the process of winter pruning them; taking out unwanted horizontal branches and cutting the vertical ones close to the main horizontals, just to create the overall shape I want. In the summer they will need pruning again to maximise the fruit yield.

The main downside was that my second attempt at creating a wild flower area was not successful. The seeds germinated and started growing but flowering was very sporadic and the area (only about ten square metres) succumbed to the weeds. It was probably due to a lack of proper preparation on my part, so it is back to the drawing board, probably to try something else.

I guess lots of us have our favourite horticultural book and mine is 'the complete food gardener', by John Seymour. My copy is forty years old but I still refer to it regularly. I was wondering where to spread the wood ash from our wood burners to get the most benefit and according to Seymour one of the best uses is on

broad beans, so that's where it is going! The potassium in the ash has to be 'fixed' to be useful so I have dug it in already. I am about to start the broad beans in the greenhouse so the bed should be ready by the time they are planted out.

The first event of the Hever Hort year is on Wednesday, 19th February, with a talk called 'The story of English Cheeses', which should be very interesting. All talks start at 8pm in Hever Village Hall and you are all welcome. We sadly lost some long standing members in 2019, in particular Rosemary Bayford, Cecil Paynter, Pat Humphreys and Anne Simmonds. They all contributed a great deal to our Society, and they will be missed.

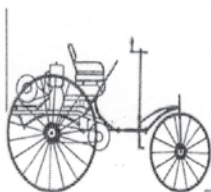

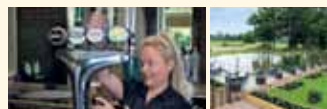
