#### An ant we won't be seeing in Hever

The Guardian reports that the sand dunes of the northern Sahara are home to the fastest ants in the world, according to researchers who clocked the insects foraging for food in the blistering midday sun.

Video footage reveals the ants galloping across the scorching sand at speeds approaching one metre per second, the equivalent of a house cat tearing about at 120mph. The faster the ants ran, the more they took to the air, in gallops that brought all six legs off the ground at once. At full pelt, the insects travelled 108 times their body length per second, the researchers found. "They fly through the air with no feet on the ground from stride to stride," even at relatively slow speeds, said Sarah Pfeffer, who studies animal behaviour at Ulm University in Germany. There is a reason Saharan silver ants, or Cataglyphis bombycina, have evolved to be fleet of foot. Unlike other desert creatures which shelter from the intense noon heat, for the ants it is a prime time to scavenge. When the desert is at its hottest, they emerge from their nests and zip about looking for food – often the carcasses of less fortunate creatures that have succumbed to the brutal temperatures.

To survive, the ants have silvery hairs that reflect the sun's rays. But even with this coating and other adaptations, the ants can barely survive the 60C (140F) heat and need impressive speed and navigational skills to find food and return to the nest before falling victim to the heat themselves.

## **Drake Oil Syndicate** win win

Over the years the people of Four Elms, Hever and Markbeech have supported the Drake Oil Syndicate and in so doing have enabled Drake to give annual donations to our three churches [£970 last year] and local Edenbridge charities.

If you have to buy oil for your home heating then joining Drake could almost be regarded as a NO BRAINER!

The syndicate was started some years ago by my neighbour Campbell Sim and I am now at the helm. Both Campbell and I live in Four Elms.

Every quarter I check oil prices with a number of local suppliers and then negotiate with Certas Energy to get the lowest price I can. Certas then notify everyone on the syndicate to see if at this price they want a fill up and if so advised the delivery is made. This price is normally competitive as we are buying for just under 700 members. Certas agree to donate to a charity account 5p per litre delivered. In the last year the total figure will be just under  $\mathfrak{L}10,000$ . This sum is then distributed among the parish churches where syndicate members live and a number of Edenbridge charities.

In this way everyone gains and the more people that are in the syndicate the bigger the charity pot!

But my horsey friends were appalled!

Horses are pack animals, they live in herds, they will be miserable on their own, Sophie MUST have a companion. So, Shetland pony perhaps? Then someone said 'what about the little Falabella, Toffee?' So, I met Toffee, and I couldn't resist. He had been kept in a tiny back garden and then in a very tiny dark

stable space. He was so small that I took him into the garden shed during a storm in case he was frightened. We arranged for stables to be built. I asked the vets to 'see to' his bits. But this is ME remember. Toffee is a 'RIG. 'What's that? His bits are not in the right place, somewhere in his body cavity. Unless

they are removed, he, all 2 foot of him, thinks he is a stallion!

Horse lorry arrives for the move to Brooke Cottage. We take Toffee to the Equine hospital (costs me a fortune BTW). So, the back of the lorry comes down and they ask me to lead him off. ## remembering Kenneth Seal

## Ken died on 10 January - here is his eulogy by his wife Mavis.

"Dear Ken was a cheerful hard worker most of his life. He was born in Hever in 1923 where he lived all of his life, attending school in the teacher's garden, now Ghyll Cottage, until the new school was built.

We met in 1945 as the war was coming to an end. He had failed his medical and was assigned to work on the Castle farm doing essential work like ploughing and sowing seeds. He also joined the Civil Defence.

We married in 1946 after which we lived in Hever and he stayed working on the farm until the doctor advised him to ask if he could work inside as he had suffered from bronchitis. That is how he became valet, then chauffeur, then butler to the Astor family - learning all the necessary skills from the previous butler.

Every year we travelled to Scotland in August to work in their house in Aberdeenshire. We loved the journey and met many lovely people while we were there. We spent many of our days off visiting different parts of Scotland - driving on quiet roads with beautiful scenery. He continued to work and drive for the Astors until the Castle was sold.

When he retired we moved from the Tudor Village to Mill Cottages and

we had some 32 years of exploring the countryside and working in and enjoying our garden. We also enjoyed family celebrations and several trips abroad.

His last seven years were a fight against dementia but he still managed to laugh and tell jokes. He was an attendee at Edenbridge Hospital Day Centre which he enjoyed. He also loved watching the birds flock to the many feeders in the garden.

Now I must carry on with only my memories, it will not be easy, but I have family and friends to support me. Ken will be sorely missed."

#### what I do

#### **Hannah Harris**

Reception Class Teacher and Forest School Leader at Hever CEP School.

I joined the team at Hever in September 2018 to teach Reception and I completed my forest school level 3 training at Circle of Life Rediscovery in Lewes last spring. Previous to Hever, I was teaching and then leading Nursery and Reception in an Inner London School for 9 years.

We are so fortunate that our school is located in a rural setting with beautiful woodland nearby. We were inspired to embrace this opportunity for learning and make Forest School a core part of our school. With the kind support of

our neighbours, Claire and Martin Longley, we have use of their wonderful woodland site which we have named 'Hever CEP Forest School, Fostel and Church Gill.' In September we began our weekly Forest School sessions with Reception and Year 1.

At Forest School the children are taught in the woodland. We take what we need with us for each 2 hour session and leave no trace when we leave. We are there in all weathers, other than high winds.

Forest School provides a unique learning experience and opportunities for pupils to develop self-awareness, self- confidence, form positive relationships and develop strategies in order to take risks within the boundaries of safety. Forest School offers pupils opportunities to engage with the natural world and initiate and learn through play, make choices and learn from their mistakes. They learn to collaborate and work together. The children's wellbeing and involvement is a fundamental part of their learning experience, and so this is monitored and nurtured, to ensure that every child is content and engaged. I have noticed that being out in the woods can give a huge confidence boost to individuals and in simple terms it makes them happy.

Observing the children as they play I am able to find out where their interests lie. These interests can then be built on

over time and revisited during future sessions.

There are opportunities to learn how to make fires, cook, use tools for woodland crafts, tie ropes and build shelters along with woodland games and songs. This week, for instance, the children have been hunting mini -beasts with

their magnifying glasses and making traps for bears. As it was chilly they also had hot chocolate round the fire.

We are currently seeking new volunteers to come and support our Forest School. Please get in touch if this is something you would be interested in. We look forward to hearing from you.

#### Sevenoaks council news

It transpires it is now five years since Hever Residents' Association invited me to present on 'A Week in the Life of a Councillor' – how time flies! Given the passage of time and The Link enjoying a broader circulation than just Hever, I thought I would touch on the subject again.

In the strictest sense, councillors are volunteers elected by the community they serve to set the policies and priorities of the authorities on which they sit – that applies at parish, district or county level. Those are then enacted by the officers of that authority. But just as with ministers in Government, the role is inevitably more hands on than leaving implementation to the local equivalent of the Civil Service.

As well as representing the interests of their community, councillors sit on a host of committees with responsibility for different service areas. Others instead scrutinise and oversee the work of the executive body of the authority, the Cabinet, or perform statutory duties such as Audit. There's no direct equivalent in the commercial world but the closest parallel is that councillors function as non-executive directors of the organisation.

In May my Cabinet responsibilities changed from environmental matters such as waste and recycling to financial ones. Despite sitting on the Cabinet, like all councillors, I am not an employee of the authority though the hours, predominantly evenings and weekends, make it akin to having a second full time job.

Recent weeks have seen some of the work including undertaking a Radio Kent interview on fly-tipping; discussions about markets - a source of vitality for the District's towns, a draw for visitors, a first step for some businesses, a career for others, and a source of income which reduces the Council Tax burden on residents like vou and me: review of the Council's investment policy; the finishing touches on this year's budget - the only ten year balanced council budget in the country and one which now makes provision for our Net Zero 2030 commitment; speaking at meetings of the two parish councils in the patch; planning permission granted for the new Edenbridge Health Centre; correspondence and calls on planning and parking, trees and taxis, footpaths and finance. leisure centres and licensing; and, of course, penning this monthly column!

It's an enjoyable and rewarding role, not to mention a great privilege and honour to represent one's community. If it's one which is of interest to you then do get in touch.

Did you know that Hever Parish Council has distributed over £15,000 since 2015 in grants to local groups? This does not include money spent on the new(ish) Four Elms playground, defibrillators or noticeboards etc.

All community groups are encouraged to apply for grants for suitable projects – forms online

The Council and Clerk are always busy with a number of ongoing projects which are discussed at the meetings, do come along to hear what is going on locally and how to get involved or give suggestions. The Clerk is going to attend a roundtable meeting regarding Gatwick Northern Runway Project on 19th February 2020 in East Grinstead and will report back next month.

The Chair, John Hodson, and Link reader Pam Gilchriest attended the cramped Edenbridge Medical Centre briefing at the Eden Centre on 7 February. Pam says that the most noteworthy thing to emerge was the date of another public meeting, with greater capacity, on 17 April! The site in Four Elms Road has been purchased and planning permission has been granted. The War Memorial hospital will be sold by the NHS to the highest bidder and Edenbridge Town Council, the British Legion and the War Memorials Trust will decide on a new site for the War Memorial. The building will have to be able to cope with the 14,400 patients anticipated by 2024 and the plan is



to provide community activities on the same site, so plenty of parking is needed. The X-ray unit and the MIU will move across and a new Friends will be set up, with a new name for the hospital, decided by a public vote (from a shortlist so there is no danger if it being called Hospy McHospface).

As I'm sure you local walkers know, Public Footpath SR577 is temporarily closed between Hever Lane and the connecting path to the bridge over the railway due to the likelihood of danger to users following a landslip. There is no alternative route. Please see https://webapps.kent.gov.uk/countrysideaccesscams/standardmap. aspx for all issues/routes of public rights on way.

## schooltime

## news from Hever

We have reached the halfway point of the year and the promise of spring is in the air! After what seems like the longest half term we have arrived at half term break. The children have worked so hard through the year and have made good progress. There has been much to celebrate and a lot to look forward too.

Students in Year 6 have embarked on a six-week unit of work based around the artist Banksy. Children have been encouraged to appraise street art and learn stencilling techniques. They have used internet based tools to create a Banksy inspired piece with a moral message.

Wherever appropriate and possible Hever staff enable children to contextualise their learning by getting away from the school site and making educational visits. We know children learn best when they can apply their learning to real life experiences.

Year 6 are looking forward to their Language School Tour to the classical city of Seville. Storm Ciara threw our original travel plans into chaos as strong winds of up to 100mph caused airlines to cancel hundreds of flights. Our students showed such patience and resilience in a difficult situation and they have been keenly following the weather forecasts on Storm Dennis.

Science, technology, engineering and mathematics are at the heart of the curriculum. Year 5 students. have been considering how weather forecasting plays an important part in their daily lives. They have learnt about the history of weather forecasting, from old weather proverbs to modern forecasting equipment and how improvements in weather technology have saved lives by providing advance warning of natural hazards. The learning outcome was for students to produce a forecast that they could present to the class. The children loved being videoed and it gave them time to show off skills in many aspects of their learning

This week we celebrated Safer Internet Day 2020 in true Hever style! Our children explored a wide range of activities all linked to supporting them with keeping themselves safe online! Our children learnt a wonderful song; created online safety posters to inform how to use the internet in a safe way and KS2 developed their understanding of the dangers of fake social media accounts. Keeping our children safe is our number one priority!

## news from Four Elms

#### New year new experiences

We have started 2020 with a host of exciting new experiences to engage our children with learning in creative and fun ways.

Class 1 had a visit from the fire service which kicked off their experience based on the emergency services. The children learnt about what to do in the event of a fire and had lots of fun using the fire hose. As part of this experience they were also visited by a representative of the RNLI and learnt about the role of lifeboat volunteers and the service they offer to the communities near the sea. A nurse working in the Accident and Emergency Department also came to school and taught the class how to make a sling and to use a bandage. The children then enjoyed putting bandages on each other.

Class 2 completed a geography experience about the United Kingdom. This experience took the class from England to Scotland to Northern Ireland and on to Wales. Along the way they discovered what makes the United Kingdom special. First, they enjoyed strawberries, cream and a cup of decaf tea whilst learning about England. The children wrote about landmarks such as the Tower of London, the London Eve, Buckingham Palace, the Shard and St Paul's Cathedral. Next, they learnt about Edinburgh, its location and popular landmarks whilst sampling delicious shortbread. Another highlight was learning about Northern Ireland and trying some Irish dancing. After learning about all the countries, they used their knowledge to create a radio advert to persuade people to visit the United Kingdom.

Class 3 loved their visit to the local Four Elms café as part of their maths-based experience. The children were allowed to bring money to buy a small snack and a drink. They were also allowed to buy a small bag of sweets which were specially provided by the café for this occasion. Addition and subtraction are two of the four mathematical operations which are essential in order to function in the real world. This experience helped them to put into practice these core skills to ensure they had sufficient money to afford the items they wanted and received the correct change.

Class 4 have been helping out the teachers by planning the Year 6 residential trip to the Isle of Wight later this year. The class used their problem-solving skills to calculate all the expenses of the trip; including the cost of the ferry for all the children and adults, the price of the fuel and the cost of the accommodation. This helped the class to use all four mathematical operations and use decimal numbers in a real-world scenario. The class also had to work to justify their costs to the teachers. presenting what they have found out and justifying the decisions they have made.

With one of the wettest Autumns on record and equally appalling Winter, it can stop now! On a serious note the weather patterns of late are a worrying fact of global warming.

Narcissus Minnow - charming miniature Daffodil with pale yellow, scented flowers. Clusters of up to 5 flowers/stem.

Brunnera Jack Frost - fantastic shade loving perennial forget-me-not. A mass of blue flowers above majestic foliage with silvery overlay.

Pulmonaria Blue Ensign - brilliant cobalt-blue flowers that last through until May.

Daphne Jacqueline Postill - fabulous Winter, early Spring shrub with pink, very highly scented flowers.

Viola odorata Queen Charlotte - Sweet Violet, this dainty little plant packs a punch with highly scented purple flowers.






