


pet of the month

John Harris

The end of the war

John Harris, with the Second Derbyshire Yeomanry, had landed in Normandy on D+6 and in the course of battle had been awarded a Military Cross. His story continues....

"The breakout from the bridgehead came at last in early August 1944, the Germans suffering immense casualties at Falaise, then drawing back over the Seine the bulk of their forces. As the reconnaissance unit to the 51st Highland Division, we took part in the battle for Le Havre then crossed the Seine and helped chase the enemy across Belgium into waterlogged Holland. After several months of minor scraps in appalling conditions we reached Maastricht in December.

Then Hitler made his last throw. All the best of German armour was massed for a thrust through the Ardennes on the American front, the aim being to cross the Meuse, get behind the allies and attack Antwerp. On Christmas Day 1944 we were in a British force sent (just as Christmas dinner was ready) into the area of Marche to help the Americans to seal "The Bulge". The Yanks suffered badly in the extreme cold. They would exchange a Jeep for a bundle of our warm battledress and I did several such deals. I then drew my own name out of the hat to proceed on home leave.

When I returned from leave in a bitter January to Regimental HQ it was already dark and I elected to stay there overnight rather than rejoin my squadron and to sleep downstairs in the warm rather than in the communal cold

bedroom upstairs. That last decision may well have saved my life for during the night the Germans dropped antipersonnel bombs which exploded on the windowsills of the upstairs room where slept all the HQ officers except one on duty by the radio and me.

We returned from the Ardennes to Holland, re-equipped and crossed the German frontier to take part in very severe fighting for the Reichswald forest in early February. This was the area of the Siegfried Line. The Germans were defending their native land and did so defiantly. We seemed to be in action nearly every day, suffering a steady stream of casualties - but we were inexorably making way toward the last great obstacle before entering the heart of Germany - the Rhine. We reached that great river in March and 2 DY went over, on a floating Bailey Bridge hastily erected under fire by our engineers. We streamed on eastward, of course not welcomed as in France (sometimes) or Belgium and Holland (always) but by sullen bewilderment.

We had had a little light relief in Bentheim on the Dutch/German border, where at the station siding an engine was found with steam up and an ex engine driver in our ranks got it moving up and down the line to loud cheers. Then we found a magnificent black Mercedes in a garage carrying a huge swastika on its bonnet so clearly belonging to a high Nazi official. We kept it until war's end, then our miserable control commission insisted all such perks must be handed in. A friendly naval officer had earlier offered to take it home for me via Cuxhaven but I missed the boat!

May 4 was a day of triumph. Odd pockets of die hard Germans gave fight but we had our tails up. That evening one of my troop leaders came up on the radio to say that he had a German major carrying a white flag with him who said his superior officer wished to surrender the 15th Panzer Division. along with the 21st - the best armoured divisions in the Wehrmacht, with which allied soldiers from throughout our then Empire had done battle from Alexandria to Tunis, from Normandy to Bremerhaven. I thought, at first, my officer was pulling my leg, but not so. Similar approaches were being made on other fronts. The war in Europe was over.

Postscript

There followed six months of occupation, stationed near Hamburg. The official policy was one of "non-fraternisation" with the Germans. Whoever conceived that did not know the British soldier! For myself there was little to do. I spent a lot of time organising horse racing at Stade with captured Russian ponies. Having joined at the beginning of the war I

was in an early release group and was demobilised in mid December.

My regiment had finished the European war quite close to Belsen and I talked to many of our people who had been there. What they said left me in no doubt that our war was one of the most just in history. The cliché that the Allies saved civilisation just happens to be true. I am proud of my country's contribution – of course modest compared with America's men and materials, not to mention the Russians, but let it never be forgotten that but for those airmen in 1940 there would have been no chance to earn those subsequent victories."

Major John Harris was awarded a bar to his MC for his leadership in the chase through Germany. He said "I had had a 'good war' without a scratch". A master of under-statement. He went on to have a distinguished civilian career as editor of the Farmer & Stockbreeder and later Chairman of IPC Agricultural Press and lived in Swan Lane, Edenbridge until his death in 2009.



A tale of the full Monty

My father had two cousins who both served during the Second World War. The eldest was Ronald, aka Ronnie or Nonnie. He had a most distinguished war record, about which a book should have been written. His younger brother was Dudley, who told this story, unlikely to feature in war diaries.

Without further research, I cannot give details of his regiment, suffice it to say it was an armoured car regiment that found him sitting on his armoured car in the middle of the desert.

An approaching cloud of dust revealed General Montgomery's staff car with the General on board. The great man approached Dudley's armoured car and enquired "When did you last see a newspaper?"

Dudley gave the obvious answer of "long time ago, Sir." "Here, have mine" said Monty, and a staff officer handed Dudley a very recent copy of The Daily Telegraph. On the top right corner was written, in pencil -Bernard Montgomery, much as might be expected from a local newsagent. Remarkable, one might think, were it not for this whole scenario being repeated two weeks later (Dudley sitting on his armoured car, in possibly another piece of desert; staff car arrives in a cloud of dust; Monty asks same question and a copy of the personalised DT handed over).

Opinions are divided on Monty's skill as a commander, but he was clearly well up on minor morale boosting practices. I wonder if Rommel ever handed out copies of Der Telegraf?

lockdown diary

26th April to 13th May

I've been recycling my path. I don't like using weed killers so the hoe was my tool of choice for the annual clean up. Dandelion, daisy and grass to be banished.

I decided to try a new tool I had

inherited, a shorthandled item with a sharp triangular head. It proved remarkably efficient at removing the impacted clay and gravel, revealing the sandstone edging to its proper depth and exposing a chalk foundation with a camber to it as well. I also found a 1945 penny and several handmade nails in my mini archaeological dig.

Several sessions later the issue from this labour was a stock of about twenty bags of soil and gravel. I sieved it all! The

outcome this time was 200 litres of soil and 130 kilos of dull gravel. A third round of activity saw me washing the gravel in two buckets to save water: wash and rinse! This produced four bags of clay sludge. Are there any potters in Hever? The lovely clean gravel was returned to the 6m2 section of path. The soil will be returned to the garden.

One of the first evenings warm enough to sit outside so late. It is 9.30 pm and I am writing this under a cloudless sky; there is no traffic on

Sevenoaks council news

Across the country, headlines read 'Council's Covid Cash Crisis', or an equivalent. Even adjusted for sensationalism, there are very real concerns about the solvency of the bodies which supply our essential services, from bin collections to the care of our elderly and vulnerable.

Local government is, of course, not alone. It is only right to recognise that recent months have been a period of acute hardship for many people and organisations. And it would be a failure to leave unacknowledged too the great uncertainty which lies ahead for many more.

Nonetheless, figures last month illustrated how at a time of crisis the District Council is relied upon more than ever in housing the homeless, distributing emergency food boxes, hauling hundreds of tonnes more waste each week and fielding thousands of coronavirus related enquiries.

Now, I proceed with a degree of caution because when politicians, whether national or local, talk about money, their references can seem rather dry, intangible, arbitrary – even, you might say, a little out of touch. "What difference does it make to me?" is a familiar and often understandable response.

But I wrote last year of the three reasons why the District Council's finances matter to us all. To recap: first and foremost, because it's your money; second, because the things the District Council do are in many respects the marks of, for want of a better term, a

civilised society; and third, but by no means least, because the Sevenoaks approach is seriously different to pretty much any other authority up and down the country.

So when in July, wearing my finance hat at the Council, I presented to colleagues the figures for the impact COVID-19 has had on the organisation. it was a message of two parts. Broadly speaking, the financial hit this year alone is expected to be around a third of the Council's £15m revenue budget. That is a shortfall most businesses, most households and most councils could not overcome. However, whilst in no way downplaying the seriousness of the situation, Sevenoaks entered this crisis in a better position to weather storms than any other local authority which comes to mind. Its financial management is underpinned by a widely praised yet still unique balanced ten-year budget, allowing peaks and troughs to be smoothed out. And we've received some funds from the Government and are working to secure more.

My message this month is therefore not one of 'Council's Covid Cash Crisis' but one which, though perhaps rather dull, is of cautious positivity about the ability of your Council to continue to work for you.

The National Garden Scheme raises over £3 million a year for nursing and garden oriented charities including Macmillan, Hospice UK and Perennial and these charities will suffer terribly from this year's lack of funding. Slowly the lockdown seems to be being relaxed and we can return to something closer to normality albeit now wearing a face mask.

The Castle's CEO Duncan Leslie has been spotting butterflies in Park Wood, a part of the grounds which has only recently been opened to the public. I am pretty impressed by both his knowledge and his eyesight - he reports that he saw "Silver Washed Fritillary, White Admiral, possibly Purple Emperor (very difficult to tell from a White Admiral when they fly so fast and high!), coppers and browns (not certain exactly which kinds) and a few other, mostly moths". He says it is "interesting that I did not see, other than the Large

White, any of the butterflies we see a lot of in the gardens – this year is very good for Small Tortoiseshell. I have also seen Commas, Red Admiral, Peacock, Orange Tip (earlier in the year) and some other Browns/Ringlets? I have also enjoyed seeing quite a few Burnet Moths."

The Castle has erected large wooden butterflies painted very much like some listed above so Duncan says that at least we will see something in Park Wood!

gardening

At this unusual time, thank goodness most of us have a garden. It doesn't matter if it consists of acres or just a few tubs by the back door, or even a window box. It is ours to care for. We are so fortunate to have a reason and opportunity to go into the open space and take a breath of fresh air. I feel so very sorry for those who have been cooped up in a small flat in one of the many tower blocks.

I find gardening very relaxing and enjoyable, even weeding, when the bed is once again free of them. Even though you know more will be there in the morning! My favourite plants are **Alstroemerias**



and Penstemons.



The many different colourways that Penstemons produce are amazing and its so easy to take cuttings. This should be done now, in the Summer, ready for planting next year. Cutting back is not done until about December, leaving the dead foliage to protect the plant during the cold weather. Then cut back to about 6" from the ground – yes, I am still in the Imperial Age! I think the most spectacular Penstemon is Pocahontas, tall and elegant with mauve bell like flowers tinged with white.

The flowers that Alstroemerias produce, I think, look as if they are made of silk. So delicate and the colours which range from white, pale pink to vivid orange are amazing. These, too, are reasonably easy to propagate with their soft white roots. When picking these flowers remember to pull the stems from the base, the same action as picking rhubarb, not the usual cutting.

I was given a small cutting of a plant looking like a thistle! My advice is to check on the growth of any unfamiliar plant. This was a Berkheya Purpurea, with attractive mauve flowering thistle heads. Unfortunately, it would be more at home on the Scottish Highlands, rather than in the front of a small border in my front garden, as it grew to about four foot. An error that had to go!

Try to make time to sit in your garden and appreciate the results of your hard work, but not for long as there is always something that needs to be done!!

Happy gardening and enjoy!




