

## Welcome to the January edition... and a happy New Year

As our animals munch through their winter feed, I thought I would talk about haystacks. I was brought up in London but spent many weekends in Bedfordshire where my grandmother lived. Shortly after arriving my brother and I would get on our bikes and pedal fast to the local farm and ask Roger the farmer if we could go and climb on his haystacks. We must have expected that Roger (who was one-armed due to an accident with the PTO on his tractor and a bit scary) would say yes because we often brought our roast dinner in a tupperware box which we ate with our fingers dripping with gravy high up on the stack.

But the thing is that they weren't hay stacks, they were straw stacks, much more resilient, crisp and golden but less fragrant than hay. Hay is grass which has dried on the field - farmers used to pile it high and weave a rudimentary thatch for the top to protect it from the weather as best they could. Straw is the stalk of wheat and barley, the rectangular bales being ejected systematically onto the field by the combine harvester which also threshed as it drove along. The difference between hay and straw is further complicated by the existence of haylage and silage. Haylage is semi-dried hay which ferments when wrapped (often



in pale green plastic) and smells deliciously like malt. Silage is wet grass or maize which also ferments, often wrapped in black plastic or buried in a clamp under a covering or old tyres and it is very delicious to cows and sheep over the winter.

Now, sadly, hay and straw stacks are mainly a thing of the past as most farmers make large round bales which are too big and dangerous for children to climb on and slide down. And there you have it. Like the Archers I have given you a story and also some agricultural information which I hope was interesting. The picture above is bales of haylage on the field.

## what I do

### **I'm Charlotte Desorgher and I'm a full-time professional dance teacher.**

Reading that, you might well be feeling a bit sorry for me right now – many of my friends assume I've been unable to work during 2020. And it is indeed true that most of the things I did in the past have been impossible this year – touring a dance show around the UK, teaching large groups of women in dance studios in London and the south east. Bringing the joy of dance to groups of women traumatized by sex trafficking, domestic abuse and rape.

But strangely enough, this year has been one of the most productive and exciting I've experienced, in what had already been a very productive and exciting career in dance.

I've been a dancer all my life – I'm 62 now and my first ballet class, at the age of five, is one of my very earliest memories. I went on to take a degree in dance and education and then, in 1981, I saw a bellydancer perform and fell in love with the dance style that was to become my passion and my career.

It was a late blossoming career – after having spent a few years as a performing dancer in my 20s, I spent twenty years building a successful graphic design business with my award-winning designer husband Paul Houlton (who now designs the Link!) But in 2001 some of my Markbeech friends discovered that I used to be a bellydancer and asked me if I would teach them to dance. And from tiny beginnings in the village hall in

Markbeech, has grown an international career as a dance teacher with students from every corner of the world!

Bellydance, despite its silly name and even more foolish reputation, is actually a rich and varied dance form which is practised by millions of women world-wide. In countries as varied as Argentina, Russia and China, bellydance is taught from an early age, and is taken seriously as an art form.

Last year I felt it was time to take advantage of the miracle of technology and look into teaching online. The main reason was that I wanted to give as many bellydance students as possible the opportunity to study with me (I only teach experienced dance students these days). Teaching in person limits me to teaching dancers in my geographical area, whereas teaching online makes my classes accessible to everyone.

Not only that, but at this late stage in my career (I'm planning on teaching for at least another ten years) I had a strong desire to pass on as much of the knowledge I've gained from 60 years as a dancer as possible. Online teaching gives me unlimited potential to do just that.

So, in January I launched my online bellydance school. I had no idea at the time, just how serendipitous that would prove to be!

There were many months of hard work involved in setting it all up at the end of last year. Members of my dance school

pay a monthly subscription to access videos of dance classes which have been filmed in advance and uploaded onto the site, which means they can be accessed at any time of the day or night. I probably have around 75 classes and specialist courses on there right now, and it took me several months to do the initial filming to get enough content to launch the school.

It was such a steep learning curve, especially for someone of my age largely working alone. I had to learn professional video editing, website design and building, automated payment technology, automated customer relationship systems and of course social media marketing, because that's where sales happen these days.

But when Covid 19 hit and dance classes had to shut down, I had already moved all my classes online

and built a healthy initial membership of around 50 subscribers. Later I added weekly zoom classes and a Facebook group to help overcome the isolation so many people were feeling. Dance classes are about so much more than just learning a skill – they are also an important social activity and many women form long-lasting friendships through their dance classes.

And now my membership has grown to encompass dancers from all over the world! I now have dancers joining me every week from Brazil, Guatemala, Argentina, France, Italy and the US as well as from every region of the UK. It's exciting, challenging, financially rewarding and enormously satisfying.

Our world has been brought together by the global trauma of Covid and the magic of technology. 2020 has been a dreadful year for sure, but it's also been a year of shared experiences and for some like me, new beginnings.



## The Mapleton story part 3

In 1926 Mapleton was purchased by Captain Harold James Pilbrow, an architect and surveyor born in 1882, one of 12 children in Ipswich, Suffolk. He had married Jessie Pynegar in Bromley, Kent in 1911. Having been a second lieutenant in the Queens Regiment before his marriage, at the outbreak of the First World War he joined the Suffolk Regiment and was sent to Jamaica from 1917 – 1922 where by 1919 he had reached the rank of captain.

Once he left the army Harold became interested in real estate. When Mapleton came up for sale he was living in Chislehurst. He settled quickly at Mapleton taking on the mantle of country squire. We know something of his comfortable lifestyle from an autobiography written by one of Harold's kitchen maids, Florence Copeland, who went on to work in many grand houses in England, including Hatfield House. She writes that she was allowed a bath once a week and had half a day a week off and every other Sunday. Mr. Brickett, the butler, captained the estate cricket team.

When Florence contracted diphtheria in 1933 she was sent to the isolation hospital in Edenbridge and was visited every week by the housekeeper who would bring her little treats. She didn't return to Mapleton but went home to Norfolk to recuperate.

The Mapleton estate contained

a thriving dairy farm with its own large dairy. Harold Pilbrow became quite an expert on Guernsey cattle, winning many prizes at agricultural shows across the country. He purchased a prize cow with the magnificent name of Honoria's Consequence in 1928 for the sum of 250 Guineas, a considerable amount. He decided to expand in 1929 and bought a 170 acre farm south of Chartwell for £7,000. He sold it to Sir Winston Churchill in 1941 for £14,000. It became a home for Churchill's daughter, Mary Soames.

Over the years Harold Pilbrow and Churchill corresponded regularly on various practical matters. They were not friends but had an amicable working relationship on matters that jointly affected them as neighbours. Churchill once described the main house at Mapleton as 'hideous'. These letters can be seen at The Churchill collection in Cambridge.

After purchasing Chartwell farm Captain Pilbrow spent much less time at Mapleton. He decided to put the house up for sale in 1936 but it attracted very little interest. Harold had become more and more involved in the hotelier business and he sold his dairy herd in 1936 presumably to finance other enterprises.

In 1936 he purchased The Haymarket Hotel in Jermyn Street in London and changed its name to The Winston Hotel. It was renowned for its 'comfort and good food'. A few

years later he bought a much bigger hotel in Coventry Street which he named The Mapleton Hotel. It earned a reputation for being a reliable and

friendly place to stay. During the blitz two bombs fell on the Café de Paris opposite the Mapleton. It was on March 8th 1941 when many people in the café were dancing to the music of Snakehips Johnson who was performing there. He and many others were killed that night and many guests and staff from the Mapleton ran across the road to pull people from the wreckage. There were many casualties and they applied first aid until help arrived. In the 1950's and 60's the Mapleton Hotel was home to the Flamingo Club, a Jazz venue attracting performers such as Ronnie Scott


and his band, Sarah Vaughn, Ella Fitzgerald, and in 1954 Billy Holliday herself. The hotel is still there but with a different name and part of the BestWestern Group.

Amazingly in 1939 there was an advertisement in the British press:

MAPLETON HOUSE HOTEL,

( Two stations – 45 mins Victoria )  
Delightful Pleasure Grounds  
Home Farm Produce  
Central Heating

Terms from 2 ½ Guineas weekly  
Apply Resident Manager

The house as hotel did not last long, only a matter of weeks or months as it was requisitioned by the army soon afterwards and was destined never to be a single dwelling again.

Captain Pilbrow had two sons. Ashleigh was an Oxford Blue and an international hurdler. In the picture overleaf, you can see him seated with Harold Abrahams of 'Chariots of Fire' fame. His other son, John, studied law but became a hotelier in his father's business. In 1983 he was living in Surrey in a house called 'Puddledock', presumably a nod to the lane that bisected his father's two estates. A frequent visitor to Mapleton in the 1930's was Harold's nephew, Richard Pilbrow. The family would put on shows and entertainments and Richard may

today ). It was the well established and prestigious Mount Lavinia Hotel. Whilst visiting in 1955 Harold became ill and died. His body was repatriated and he was buried at Underhill, Ditchling, Sussex where he had lived for several years. A year later the hotel was used for the filming of The Bridge Over The River Kwai. Soon afterwards his sons sold both hotels.

have developed a love of theatre there for he became a famous lighting director of stage and film. He worked on Showboat, A Funny thing happened on the way to the Forum, Fiddler on the roof, and Cabaret. He knew Lawrence Olivier and Elizabeth Taylor well describing them as demanding in the case of Olivier and charming in the case of Elizabeth Taylor who would go the pub with the crew after a show. He wrote 'Stage Lighting Design: the Art, the Craft, the Life.' It is still a standard work of reference today for students in the field.

Captain Pilbrow had been a keen traveller all his life and in 1948 he purchased another hotel, this time in Colombo in Ceylon ( Sri Lanka as it is

Mapleton House was converted into 8 flats in the 1950's and remained so until the 1990's when it was purchased by a development company. They built an extension of five new apartments and refurbished the old ones. All were sold by about 2008 and in 2010 the owners purchased the freehold from the landlord. It is a stable and thriving community.

A very Happy New year to you from everyone at the Parish Council. The Parish Council consists of 10 elected or co-opted volunteer Councillors from across the villages of Four Elms, Hever and Markbeeche who work tirelessly to make improvements for residents and spend the modest sum of money we receive through the Council tax in an efficient and meaningful manner. The Councillors are supported in all the administrative, legal and statutory functions by the part time employed Clerk. We are acutely aware of the financial pressures placed on everyone in 2020 so have made savings which mean we will not need an increase in the precept (the money we request from council tax) for the financial year 2021 – 2022.

The Council last met on 26th November and minutes, as always, can be found on the [hever.org](http://hever.org) website.

The main news of the evening was frustration at the placement of the whole of Kent in December into Tier 3 and desire for Kent County Council to have argued the case more forcefully with central Government. County Cllr. Peter Lake and MP Tom Tugendhat are aware of the strength of views locally. Hopefully by the time you read this we shall be in a more

locally focused proportionate scheme to manage the threat from covid.

The Council resolved to award a £5,000 grant towards the redevelopment of Hever village hall, whose plans and fundraising efforts are going full steam ahead.

Our next meeting is planned to be on Zoom 7th January 2021 7pm. Please see noticeboards or website / Facebook for link details and full Agenda nearer the date. Members of the public are always most welcome to attend. Our main topic will be the small scale affordable housing project we have been considering for the past 3 years – any proposal would be only for those with a local connection, at an affordable price. We shall be holding a full public consultation in January so keep an eye out for the banners, leaflets and notices or website / Facebook page – with opportunities to comment online, in person or on paper and to attend virtual events. ## our rector's thoughts

I hope you all have had a joyful, peaceful and safe Christmas. A big thank you to all those who helped make Christmas so special for so many this year and all those – the wardens and Ana Roxburgh to mention a few - who worked so hard to ensure our churches have continued to function notwithstanding the restrictions.

Hopefully we can look forward to some good news in 2021 and a possible return to whatever the new normal will be. But we don't know the future and it is easy to feel anxious as we follow the news.

One of the most popular Bible stories is that of David and Goliath. Our Family service in January will be on this theme. It's popular because we love to see the underdog triumphing against the odds. We all have Goliaths in our lives. Those big giants that seek to dominate and control us, casting their darkness over us. It might be our health or that of our nearest and dearest, the impact of Covid, the economic situation and financial challenges, or mental health and relationship issues. All these can fill us with fear, worry and anxiety – like a Goliath threatening and taunting us. What all these Goliaths have in common is fear: fear of failure, fear of death, fear of being alone, fear of the unknown and of

what we cannot control. 'Don't be afraid' is God's most common phrase in the Bible. David defeated Goliath by believing in his own abilities as a young shepherd who had fended off lions and wolves. But above all he trusted God.

## gardening

Happy New Year to you all. I have always known the benefits of my garden and wildlife but so many people have said it was their sanctuary last year and that the joy of nature kept them going.

I love every season but there is something special about the winter months. You get to see the garden in its naked form - I really get to appreciate trees such as *Prunus Serrula* which is fab all year but comes into its own right now with its peeling bark which reveals deep coppery bands that glisten when the low sun hits it. Like a lot of things, it gets better with age. Another amazing tree is *Betula utilis* 'Snow Queen' with its white bark which glows in the moonlight. Both these trees I planted within my first few months of moving to Blunts Brook. When doing a new garden, I always get the main structures in first so they can grow with the garden.

I always smile when I hear people say "roll on winter so we can have a rest" - none of it in this garden. After weeks of leaf raking and acorn collecting (the only downer of living amongst an oak woodland), I start the gardening year. I prefer to prune my apples and pear trees now as you can see their growth more easily when they are bare. I also have two large herbaceous beds and I will start on them but leave the grasses and plants with large seed heads as when they get frosted it is a sight to behold. Also, the birds love seed heads, especially teasels, and to see a flock of gold finches feeding is magnificent and the bases of the grasses make lovely little nests for mice and bank voles.

By January I have normally weeded my vegetable plots but I save the hardest job for after Christmas to help shift the extra pounds gained. I begin barrowing the compost onto all four veg plots giving it the time to do its job and although back breaking it pays off.

Any days I cannot be in the garden I head for the greenhouses where I take cuttings of my fuchsias and pelargoniums which strike easily on the hot bed. January is also the time I start to sow seeds. Sweet peas and broad beans go into a cold tunnel (cover as mice love the new shoots) but basil, chillies and tomato seeds get started on the hot bed in the greenhouse. Also, at the end of the month I start my onion sets off in the tunnel. Although I lift in or build cages for my many tender plants, as soon as winter starts to bite, I cover them with extra fleece for protection. I do open the doors on days above 5 degrees for a few hours to stop too much condensation with causes botrytis.

Other delights for this month are the snowdrop – what a toughie it is, performing whatever the weather, *Lonicera purpurea* (shrub honeysuckle), the scent so powerful that I always cut a few stems to bring indoors to enjoy. Also, *Cornus mas*, a tree smothered in yellow scented flowers which any emerging bees love, and it truly lifts your spirits on a dull day. Remember too this month to cut the leaves from *Epimedium* and *Hellebores* so when the flowers emerge you can see them in their full glory.

Most importantly, continue to enjoy our green spaces and wildlife.






