

Welcome to the Link for July and August

We must learn to love our slugs. Slugs are our friends, or so many naturalists would have us believe, they munch their way through dead and rotting materials and provide food for birds, especially thrushes, and for toads.

That is all fine, but my slugs are far from sluggish as they prepare to devour my very un-dead hostas and love is very much not in the air. Without chemicals we are doomed as I realised on a visit to the Doubleday organic gardens in Yalding some years ago (now sadly closed due to lack of funding) only to view rows of holey cabbages surrounded by egg shells and glasses of beer in a vain attempt to stem the slimy tide.

But of course slug pellets have taken a dreadful toll and when they wash into local watercourses, water treatment works such as the one at Bough Beech have to spend untold sums to purify the water with carbon filters. The effective but bird and hedgehog lethal slug pellet metaldehyde is being banned from 2022 (except for use inside permanent greenhouses) and some farmers fear that this will spell the end for their crops because the replacement, ferric phosphate is less effective. However, Kevin Agate of Hever Countryside Services, who runs training on the new regulations, says that old fashioned practices such as crop rotation has the slugs scurrying from field to field in search of their favourite tucker and this really helps to keep them under control, so there is hope.



And so the love-hate relationship continues - my car will not be carrying an "I Gastropods" sticker anytime soon - but maybe I should just give up on the hostas.

But it was March 2020 and we all know what happened next. So two weeks into training my team returned the BA iPads and left our uniforms in Hangar Six. We hadn't even stepped on a plane.

Miles and I had moved into a converted garage on our landlord's drive to be nearer to Gatwick - we didn't think we'd need a garden anymore as I'd be flying and there'd be little time for growing the wonderful vegetables we used to. A few dark weeks followed then I literally went back to the drawing board. Edenbridge Water Meadows Nature Reserve

Edenbridge Water meadows – a small 'nature reserve' of 15 acres – is sandwiched between the River Eden, in the east, the Edenbridge Town Council's Recreation ground to the west, and the Environment Agency flood bund in the north, just alongside Mont St Aignan Way.

The water meadows are privately owned by the Great Stone Bridge Trust (GSBT) by whom they are managed for the benefit and protection of all forms of wildlife present in this small area. Whilst there are no footpaths across the meadows, the GSBT extends an invitation to anyone who wants to see the wildlife whilst respecting this little 'jewel' which nature has been so kind to provide for our enjoyment.

Together with the adjoining farmland, the water meadows comprise a key part in the rich mosaic of wildlife. In any one year the area will be visited by somewhere in the region of 84 different species of birds, 22 different species of butterflies, 10 different species of dragonflies and damselflies, 8 different species of mammals, and have growing in this relatively small area 132 species of angiosperms (flowering plants).

Unique habitats have been created to provide shelter and protection from both the weather and predators and whilst these specific habitats look like 32 piles of old wood, covered with oak leaves in autumn, nothing could be further from the truth. They provide a 'safe haven' for insects and other



species which do not hibernate during the cold winter periods; shrews and voles are obvious examples of this group of vulnerable creatures.

Other than regular mowing of certain grass swathes for the benefit of ground-feeding birds and access by the larger mammals, nature is left to get on with managing itself, the only intervention being during the winter months when there will be a slight need to keep all aspects of the meadows 'in balance'.

Now in its twelfth year of management, this last year has been the meadow's busiest in terms of human footfall, with unprecedented numbers visiting for their Covid 'daily exercise' and, more recently, a recognition that getting out into the countryside is good for your health and for your soul! Many of the visitors - from Edenbridge and beyond, as far afield as Guildford, Maidstone and Catford – have been extremely complimentary. To stand in the meadows in the not-too-early morning, or later in the afternoon, and to listen in the guiet to the most exquisite birdsong, restores one's faith and sense of well-being. It is, truly amazing, what miracles nature can work.

The Barn at Falconhurst

Charles Talbot, the current proprietor of the Falconhurst estate, fondly remembers the farmer Willy White and his mixed herd of twelve cows that used to graze the parkland and then be milked in The Barn.

In the 1970's Charles' parents, Cynthia, and Tom, decided to merge all the tenant farms on the estate into Horseshoe Green Farm, and since then The Barn has been lying dormant...

The Barn is now very much awake and its new purpose it to help us

entertain the local community with a variety of events. The focus will be on food, art and music so expect to see information on upcoming pop-up restaurants, markets, exhibitions, and concerts soon!

After having a very successful June with 'Art in June' and Flora Smith taking over The Barn with their respective exhibitions, we now turn our heads towards to July and to the upcoming events there. We have two supper clubs, on the 10th & 20th, hosted by Freddie who runs Wild Seasoning, a catering company based near Sevenoaks. We also have a jazz night on the 24th where a local artist called Dulcie May and her quintet will be showing us all a good time. Great Stone Bridge Trust

Whenever you travel through Edenbridge you are likely to pass over a great stone bridge at the bottom of town. The story is that the bridge was built following complaints by two ladies of the parish who found it inconvenient to use the stepping stones previously provided.

In 1511 a fund was established to care for the maintenance of the bridge and to provide charitable assistance to the residents of the town. This role was formalised in 1978 when the charity commissioners permitted the trustees to spend the income generated by the trust for the charitable benefit of the inhabitants of Edenbridge.

Last year the trust awarded grants in the region of £60000 to almost

50 local institutions, clubs, societies, schools and students. It has been able to help activities in our parish where there has been a majority of Edenbridge children involved.

As well as being able to support local needs the Trust also owns and manages the meadows on the other side of the Bridge [behind the fire station] which are available for all to walk and enjoy at absolutely no cost to themselves.

The Great Stone Bridge Trust is a group of 11 local people, 2 of whom are nominated by Edenbridge Town council, coming from a diverse range of backgrounds. I am very proud to be the current chairman. For further information please look at the Great Stone Bridge Trust website.

- a tribute by her husband Cad

My beloved Jean who died on 10 May was beautiful, in every sense of the word: and so brave, on many occasions, during over half a century of our marriage. Many of the sympathy cards refer to her kindness. enthusiasm and energy. She was happiest supporting the community in roles including PTA, WI, Tourist Information, Edenbridge Museum, Sevenoaks District Council (EdenbridgeOffice), Edenbridge Library and of course Twinning. Jean was also a committed environmentalist. living the principles of Friends of the Earth, The Soil Association, R.S.P.B. Sustrans and Edenbridge Sustainability.

Jean was born in 1950, an Essex girl and proud of it. She had great respect for her parents, Eva and Jack Dennis, and what they had done during the War. Her father was a merchant seaman, freighting across the Atlantic. His vessels were torpedoed twice but he was saved by people who put their lives at risk to do so. Jean was a lifelong supporter of the RNLI. Her mother served in the ATS. However, after the war her father's profession took him away for months at a time and the marriage broke down. Jean grew up under her grandfather's roof. The only child in an elderly household created an introverted teenager and education at a distant grammar school meant few local friends.

In 1968 she secured a job in the Westminster Bank, in the City and this time in her life was fun with lots of new friends and excitement. I cannot recall the date when I first saw Jean but I have the same sensation of wonder, thinking of her now. I was one of the computer boys. We were soon dating and in

September 1969, standing outside a jeweller in West London I suggested I could buy her a ring, if she would marry me. I am the eldest child of a large Irish family and was playing rugby at a senior level and often needed A&E after a game, Jean would turn up expecting me to take her out and when told that I was in hospital went out with one of my brothers! We were married in her village church at Hadleigh in August 1970. Intelligent, knowledgeable and adaptive Jean became the matriarch of my family and then we started

our own. Our three children are the most beautiful creatures on earth; I suspect because of inheritance.

We arrived in Hever at Easter 1979. Hazeldene then had a toilet, bath and kitchen sink in a lean-to at the back. Jean had three young children to cope with and a husband working all hours trying to build a career in London. And for Jean it just got better. Throughout the building works she would welcome family and friends to the sitting room, and not mention the elephant in the room: the chemical toilet. I didn't know anyone in Hever, I am dysfunctional, yet for over 40 years Jean tried to integrate me because she said the people of this community were worth it.

Between the children leaving university and the responsibility of being grandparents, Jean and I bought a small, but very seaworthy, vacht. We were occasionally caught in a storm and I would have to go below and calculate a course to a safe haven. Jean would simply take the helm and I can still hear the little childhood songs she sang whilst engulfed in breaking waves. I knew she was scared, but she bravely stuck to her task, sometimes for hours. We would also go away for months to remote places and did things I would never have dared to without Jean: facing down a puma in the Andes; donkey riding in the Sahara; standing in respect watching funerals of HIV dead crossing the track outside a township in South Africa: coping with me when I

nearly died of diarrhoea in Bolivia; swimming 20kms offshore along the Australian great barrier reef, with the ever-present sharks; going the wrong way up the River Iquazu rapids in a 400 Horsepower Rigid Inflatable Boat(RIB) near the Argentinian and Brazilian border. Some of the things Jean did could fill a novel. I quote from Roy Batty's Tears in Rain: "I've known adventures, seen places you people will never see, I've been Offworld and back... frontiers! I've stood on the back deck of a blinker bound for the Plutition Camps with sweat in my eyes watching stars fight on the shoulder of Orion... ". Not bad for an introverted teenager from Essex.

Following round after round of chemotherapy and three major operations, when the treatment started to take its toll, we had a new routine. When we were in bed ready to nod off, one would say "Love you" the response would be "Love you", then "Kiss Kiss" and in the darkness the other would reply "Kiss Kiss".

Jean was brave and beautiful to the end. On the 9th May Jean had a number of episodes which required medical intervention from the Hospice staff. In the evening she was semi-conscious as they had fitted a morphine drip. Jean told me she "wanted to go".

I squeezed her hand and said "Love you, Love you, Kiss Kiss" and the last words Jean whispered were "Kiss Kiss".

The Drake oil syndicate

After all the bad news it was a pleasant surprise to receive cheques from Certas energy payable to St Pauls Church, Four Elms and the other churches on the patch. This was because many of you are members of the Drake syndicate.

How it works is that every time a member buys heating oil, a half pence per litre delivered gets added by Certas to the Drake charity pot. At the end of the year the total is distributed amongst local parish churches and a number of Edenbridge charities. You generate somewhere between £8-10,000 annually.

our rector's thoughts

As I write this, I hope we are at last in the final throes of the pandemic. So I wonder looking back what things we might all agree that we love, value and appreciate afresh. Here are some suggestions.

The first is the beauty and value of the human face, which we have become used to seeing covered. The creation story describes humans as 'made in the image of God' (Genesis 1:26-27) and in the bible God is described as having a face that we can seek (Psalm 27:8); that we have seen in Jesus (2 Corinthians 4:6); and will one day see, face to face (1 Corinthians 13:12).

Second is singing. How we've missed not being able to worship God in song! There is a rich variety in church music of all kinds and we are fortunate in the Three Spires to have an enthusiastic choir in Markbeech which we are hoping can be expanded to form a Three Spires choir. Third is freedom from fear. The pandemic has been a time of uncertainty and fear where at one point we even feared social contact. There are many things that cause us fear and anxiety. It is said that there are 365 verses in the Bible calling us not to fear – one for every day of the year. St.Thomas Aquinas taught,

following St.Paul in 1 Corinthians 13, that 'perfect love casts out fear' by seeking the Christian virtues of faith, hope and love.

Fourth is fellowship and the proximity of others. What a joy it is to be able to meet together again such as at the Hever lunch in June, the Art in June and many other gatherings. Susie and I will be inviting anyone to our open home in Penshurst as soon as the lockdown is lifted for teas and fun for all ages - swimming and bouncy castle! Watch for details once we've agreed a new date.

Finally there is the Christian message of eternal life which we bear as Easter people. Many writers, such as the historian Tom Holland and scientist Karol Sikora, have pointed out the fear of death has been the largely unspoken reality in this crisis; one which the Church is uniquely placed to address. Speaking of the resurrection, St.Paul writes that death is the last enemy to be destroyed (1 Corinthians 15:26) and I've seen the impact of that assurance on the faces of many who have died in the faith.

May we continue to be people of faith, hope and love as we emerge from this crisis.

spallieri, meaning 'resting on the shoulder', a reference to the trellis on which the trees were originally grown, and is a technique going back to Roman times. It is a very efficient method, basically growing in two dimensions and therefore takes very little space, so is ideal for smaller gardens. I have Braeburn (picture with the blossom) and Discovery apples and a Conference pear and it looks as though they will be very prolific this year.



In an earlier piece I mentioned my attempts to take rose cuttings. I have now lost a couple more but one, at least, has flowered, a lovely red with a pinkish tinge at the end of the petals. I think the expert advice is to not let the cuttings flower for the first few years, so that the root system gets a chance to develop properly, but I could not resist seeing what it would look like






