Then, if you want to give a virtual gift this Christmas the Woodland Trust has a variety on sale including a "Hedge Fund" - for only £30 you help to restore Britain's hedges, or you could buy a Bee Good gift from the Bees for Development Trust. And I have just taken delivery of an eco-duvet made by Eve Sleep from recycled plastic bottles.

More traditionally, here is a nice recipe for a slightly different type of Christmas cake:

1.5 cups shelled whole brazil nuts

½ lb stoned dates

1.5 cups walnut halves 2/3rd cup candied peel ½ cup red cherries and ½ cup green or just red ones(drained of syrup)

½ cup seeded raisins

34 cup flour

½ tsp baking powder

½ tsp salt

34 cup sugar

3 eggs

1 tsp vanilla

Grease sides and base of a large loaf tin (8in x 5in) and line with a layer of greaseproof paper. Place the unchopped nuts, dates. peel and raisins in a large bowl. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together 2 or 3 times, then mix thoroughly. Make into a stiff mixture with beaten eggs and vanilla. Spoon into the prepared tin, pressing and flattening with the back of a spoon. Bake in a slow oven for 2-2.5 hours. Leave in the tin for 10 mins, loosen around the edges and turn out on to cake rack, then remove the paper. When completely cold wrap in foil and store in the fridge.

Remembering Ann Greig (1926 – 2021)



Ann was brought up in London and had an exciting war in the Special Operations Executive, also known as the "Ministry of Ungentlemanly Warfare". She and her husband Dennis (who died in 2004) moved to Five Fields Lane in 1953. He ran the David Greig supermarket chain, later Somerfield. They had five children, countless grandchildren and great grandchildren and many friends. Some of those friends remember her here............

From Daphne Owen-Jones: Over 60 years ago Alan and I, with Pete an infant, first arrived Edenbridge with nowhere to live. Alan's senior partner in the doctor's practice mentioned our predicament to the Greigs who immediately, with what we came to learn of as typical generosity said we could use No 1 Owl's Court, one of two cottages on their land. We stayed for at least a year, maybe almost two, rent free as they wouldn't accept any payment.

They were such fun and asked us

round often. Ann became Godmother to S-J and I became Godmother to Ben. Ann taught me a lot about gardening and cooking, she let S-J ride her ponies and both children swam in their pool. When Alan died we were given a chicken and a dozen eggs from their model farm every Saturday! She was my best friend.

From Christina Hodson: To say Ann Greig was an exceptional ladv who was well known and wellliked by everybody is a bit of an understatement. Several years ago, a friend and I decided it would be nice to give Ann a party to celebrate her 90th birthday. "We will keep it small - just a few local friends" was our mission. Of course, word spread and we had quite a gathering. The reason wasn't just a nice tea but a genuine desire to say "Happy Birthday" to Ann. Ann was the consummate entertainer. Carol Singers of Four Elms village have very happy memories of trudging around the houses on cold evenings and then returning to the Greigs for delicious mulled wine and trays and trays of mince pies. Very many years ago (63 in fact) Ann and her family were among the first stallholders in what is now the Four Elms Village Fete. She bought the hoopla stall which survived for 50 years until it was deemed too much of a hazard to erect (health and safety at the village fete!) For all the memories, Ann, Four Elms village thanks you very much.

From Margaret Bates: Ann and Dennis were among the first people who we met coming to the village over 40 years ago. They had such outgoing natures that charmed us all. She and Dennis in those early years involved themselves hugely with so many activities. Raising money for the Cheshire homes and every summer she would invite the residents to a tea party in her garden. Memorable travelling dinners for the church with the main course in their barn. Cooking for the fete, her famous merinques!

When anyone was in trouble, she was the first to be on their doorstep with posies of flowers, sympathy and support. Her garden was her joy and she created a delightful little garden at the Old Stables where we had many a happy gathering. So skilled. She also enjoyed bridge and we had hilarious chatty games in the kitchen.

Her passing leaves a big hole in our village. She kept smiling to the end of her long life.

From Pat Erasmus: One of my first jobs when I arrived in April 2018 was to make some flapjacks from Ann's recipe – I passed the test and after that we cooked, baked and entertained endlessly.

Ann had the most amazing zest for life – "What's happening today?" she would say "Let's make something happen!". She would sit in the porch after church and invite people back

for refreshments, whether it was convenient or not, which could be a little exasperating for me, but that was our Ann.

She had many great qualities, but for me the key ones were her generosity, her positivity and her stoicism. She had a saying which made us laugh "CDB CDW" – "could do better, could do worse"

I loved working for Ann, because we became real friends, we laughed endlessly and this made my stay a very happy one. I was also touched by the kindness of her friends who were so welcoming – thank you. She has touched my life for the better and like many of you I will miss her enormously

From Wendy Izod: Ann would often describe herself as "a lost soul". She wasn't of course. In fact she was far from lost - to say she was the life and soul of Four Elms might seem an exaggeration, but she did seem to exemplify all that the village stood for, and could always be relied on to arrive with meringues and flapjacks (even if she hadn't been asked).

I remember her support for the Café service in her later life, she said it appealed to her because she could join in, sing the hymns and complete the Wordsearch! Such was Ann – always modest, always encouraging and importantly always there. We shall miss her.

At the Royal Opera House he has worked as rehearsal pianist on


productions of operas from Handel to Henze, and is about to start rehearsals for the revival of Richard Eyre's production of La Traviata which opens next month.



The Boyles

Gold, frankincense and.... diamonds!

Tim and Mary Boyle have been married for 60 years and have been living in Markbeech for 55 of them. They met when they were still at school. Mary had come back from Australia in 1945 (see her and Tim's war stories in our May and June 2020 editions, still available on www. hever.org) and was at Channing in north London. Tim had moved from Lancashire to East Anglia aged 12, and went to Felsted school, but the two schools were linked because they had been evacuated together in the war. At a reunion event, Mary picked Tim's name out of a hat to partner her at table tennis. Neither of them wanted to play and they did not get on. Mary was therefore surprised when the boy she had

thought rather rude turned up at the Seymour Hall swimming pool, which the girls were waiting to enter in their neat crocodile, and presented her with a box of After Eights. She was, of course, then the talk of the school - and you could say that the rest is history.

After that they stayed in touch, Tim paying six shillings and sixpence to travel from Colchester to London, once to take Mary to Tchaikovsky's 5th at the Proms which, being very musical, she loved. Tim left school in 1954 and did national service in the navy, visiting every country in the Mediterranean except Albania and Israel. He then studied history at Queen Mary College London followed by a post-graduate course at King's College, Cambridge. Mary was not interested in university as she had a great passion to be a



nurse. Her father asked her if she would please do secretarial training first in case the nursing didn't work out, which indeed it did not. Instead, she found a job which she loved working for Ruth Railton, the inspiring founder of the National Youth Orchestra, though she did regret not having gone to university.

The Boyles got engaged on Mary's 21st birthday in 1958 and married on 12 August 1961 in Limpsfield because Mary's mother was living in the area. The newlyweds honeymooned with a trip to St Malo by ferry and bus, intrepid in those days when travel abroad was rarer and set up home in north London. By this time Tim was teaching at Goldsmiths College in south London and they wanted a more permanent and rural home for their new family, so they started to hunt within a 30-mile radius of London Bridge station. They came to Markbeech quite by chance when a two up, two down cowman's cottage came on the market in 1966; they fought off gazzumpers and became the proud owners of "Jersey Cottage". Over the years they have doubled it in size and made it a comfortable and happy family home.

Although there were 13 buses a day in and out of the village, before Mary learnt to drive living in the village with two small children wasn't easy. The village did have two shops, including Mrs Seymour's Post Office in Cow Lane which sold sweets, and Malcolm came by twice weekly

in his van selling groceries. There was also another shop down at Horseshoe Green. But they soon made friends and threw themselves into local activities, Mary was parish clerk for eight years and Tim sat on both the parish council and the village hall committee and wrote a definitive history of Markbeech for the millennium. They also travelled all over the world and kept up their shared love of music.

Mary did "the best thing" aged 70 when she earned a degree in comparative literature from Kent University. She was amused to be approached by an usher when standing in the queue at the degree ceremony - he thought she must be in the wrong place. but no! Meanwhile Tim retired from Goldsmiths in 2001 after a distinguished 35-year career specialising in British foreign policy in the 19th and 20th centuries, including being elected a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society in 1987. Both their children live guite nearby, Nick a surgeon and Robert a lawyer and Tim and Mary are proud to have seven grandchildren.

What is the secret of a successful long marriage? Keep on keeping on and laughter. And remembering that all of the experiences you have in your life are worthwhile in the end.

our rector's thoughts

Hopefully after the disappointment of Christmas cancelled last year, this time we will be able to enjoy Christmas lunch with our nearest and dearest. For me this is usually followed by a short walk and then the family sits down to watch the Queen's Christmas broadcast. This one may be rather poignant as Her Majesty looks back on a year in which she said farewell to her husband, Prince Philip.

I was born in the year after Queen Elizabeth was crowned and, in a sense, she is part of all our lives – her head on stamps and coins, the royal crest on the post box and on businesses who have the coveted words: 'by appointment.'

The Queen is known for many things: for being Head of State, confidante to 14 prime ministers, mother, great grandmother, horsewoman and still working at 95 years of age! One striking thing is her continued Christian faith. In all the years she has demonstrated a consistency of character, a commitment to service, a concern for others and a clear dependence on Christ that is all the more remarkable because it is at once ever-present but never domineering.

Brilliantly, in an age that is on the one hand increasingly secular and, on the other, fraught by religious conflicts, her approach is winsomely inclusive. She is the head of the Church of England but in her speeches never

tell anyone they must attend. Rather she points to Jesus and how he expands her capacity to love people: 'Christ's example has taught me to seek to respect and value all people'

Here are some more words from a recent broadcast - words which are less an argument and more a personal testimony: 'I hope that, like me, you will be comforted by the example of Jesus of Nazareth who, often in circumstances of great adversity, managed to live an outgoing, unselfish and sacrificial life. Countless millions of people around the world continue to celebrate his birthday at Christmas, inspired by his teaching. He makes clear that genuine human happiness and satisfaction lie more in giving than receiving; more in serving than in being served. We can surely be grateful that, 2,000 years after the birth of Jesus, so many of us are able to draw inspiration from his life and message, and to find in him a source of strength and courage.'

Last month at Remembrance we sang a prayer that God would 'save our gracious Queen'! God has saved her and she has been gracious and 'noble' in her hope and faith. There's certainly no doubt about the identity of the King our Queen serves. I pray that you too will encounter Jesus the King this Christmas.

Gardening and beyond at Hever Castle

I always think that the Castle looks really splendid when dressed up for Christmas inside and out. It is also great fun - I really enjoyed my ride on the carousel a couple of Christmases ago.

Sarah Cole, Marketing and Communications Manager at the Castle loves the gardens in December and writes: "As the sun rises over the lake and loggia in December, the light catches the architectural splendour of the trees, bare of leaf, and begins to melt the dusting of frost on the banks of the outer moat, where sometimes, if it's cold enough, the water will have frozen in places. And while the cold sends much into hibernation, there's still plenty to see and do in the gardens at Hever Castle."

The gardeners at the castle are busy, she says, with the "tidying of the herbaceous borders, maintenance of our extensive tool collection, pruning of trees and shrubs and the ordering of seeds and plug plants keeps the team busy.

Colour is provided by the first blooms on the camellias sheltered on Pergola Walk, the flowering of the hellebores (or Christmas lanterns), the bright reds and yellows of the Cornus (dogwoods) in the Winter Garden and 'Early Sensation' daffodils popping up beside the whites and purples of the heathers."

The Christmas extravaganza is quite something, heralding the start of Christmas proper. Preparing this is quite a mammoth task and the planning starts 13 months ahead. Sarah says: "It is a real team effort with staff from all departments involved and all the props for the festive trail made bespoke in house





or repurposed from a previous year. This year the theme is Pinocchio and visitors can take a magical journey along the immersive Christmas trail in the grounds beginning in Geppetto's workshop surrounded by his woodcarving creations and finishing when the blue fairy grants Pinocchio's wish of becoming a 'real boy'.

As dusk falls visitors can witness the enchantment of the Castle, gardens and lake festooned with fabulous colours and twinkling lights as part of the Twilight Christmas event. Decorating the castle with all its lights and traditional decorations takes 10 people two long days to complete. All the christmas trees in the castle are from Hole Park in Kent and each year 50-100 small Christmas trees

are planted on the Estate so in about 10 years' time the site will be more sustainable. On average each tree has a minimum of 200 lights on it.

The Hever events team works closely with Maidstone-based STL installing light fixtures and effects to create a magical display for visitors. New for 2021 is a ferris wheel offering visitors

> spectacular views across the grounds."
