Talking of birds, I sponsored a migrating cuckoo through the British Trust for Ornithology (see the article on page 5) and have been delighted by the regular tracker updates as they fly north to join us for the summer season. A couple of weeks ago Ellis flew the whole length of Spain, 489 miles, between 4 am and 9 am; he was speeding at nearly 100 miles an hour, quite extraordinary!

We adopted Kit, a little border collie cross, from a rescue centre in Uckfield in 2015. He was estimated to be about a year old and had been abandoned at a vets in Ireland and then shipped over here to find a new home. As with many rescue dogs, we had a few issues to overcome as he was not quite house trained, had a penchant for chewing computer cable leads and was adept at escaping from our garden.

On the plus side, he was very affectionate and bright. I decided that he might enjoy agility and happened to mention this to a group of friends and one of them recommended that I contacted Jane at Clever Paws dog training in Blindley Heath. We went along for our assessment and Jane told me that, while she felt he would be good at it, we needed to do some obedience training first as instant recall was necessary for agility and Kit was still getting used to the name we had just given him and settling into our lives. I signed up and for the first time in my life I went to a formal dog obedience training and loved it.

We then started a beginner's agility group learning all the hand signals and commands required to get your dog around the various obstacles in the correct order, touching the contact spots on the

dog walks and seesaws, and trying to master the dog weaves- we are still not quite there yet. We recently went to our first agility competition, a low-key beginner's event, and competed in three runs. We were eliminated in two runs but came second in the third.

On the obedience side, we had enjoyed it so much that we kept going and recently Kit was awarded his Gold good citizens award from the Kennel Club. The gold award builds upon the skills learnt in the silver award. The gold award introduces new concepts such as sending a dog to bed, relaxed isolation, an emergency stop and heelwork off the lead, all of which provide greater understanding and control. Kit had to complete nine exercises faultlessly and I had to correctly answer ten questions on responsibility and welfare.

I have made some great friends at my classes and I am sure for a budding writer there is a great comedy TV series waiting to be written on dog training!

What I do

When you retire it should be a wonderful time, because you are on your own time with, hopefully, a pension so that your own desires can be followed. Experience says you need a plan.

In 2010 I was a retired computer geek and emergency planner, ie what to do when it all goes horribly wrong (no shortage of toilet roll in this house). Judi had just retired as a specialist nurse. Some years earlier we had been to London and toured the newly recreated Shakespeare Globe that was in rehearsal before opening. There was this balcony scene being tried out. Juliet says "no, no, no. I can see Romeo out there on stage, it would be much better if he were under the balcony so that I cannot see him but the audience can". Realtime adaption of the scene by the players and in what a gorgeous space. We were sold.

When we retired, Judi inquired about being a volunteer steward. Ex nurse (first aider?) with free-time for weekday performances. She was in, with me tagging along. Judi determined nurses do not necessarily make good first aiders, so booked on a St Johns course, with me again tagging along. Our first outdoor summer season started in April 2010 and we became part of the Globe volunteer family of some 500 souls.

Our very first stewarding shift was Macbeth, and it started with Mother Nature providing wind, thunder, rain and hail to the entry of the 3 witches through the standing audience and passing me onto the stage. It was cold, wet and unforgettably

wonderful. In subsequent years our first aid training proved invaluable especially for plays directed by the delightful Lucy Bailey which prove to be particularly graphic. Notably Titus Andronicus has some 17 gruesome deaths in the play but during one performance we had 46 audience members collapse and we had them overflowing the first aid room and laid out on the piazza outside the theatre. None were injured, just temporarily overcome.

There are many stories about the Globe and as a steward you get to hear about them, experience them and meet some fascinating people. If you can stand up for a couple of hours (break for tea and biscuits) it is a great experience and you learn a lot. Here is a tip. Best seat in the house is £5, always has been since 1997, and is standing stage front. You miss nothing and you can be the unintended love interest of Falstaff in Twelfth Night, as I once was!

12 years later we are still part of the Globe now including the Sam Wanamaker Playhouse, a beautiful candlelit indoor Jacobean theatre tbc.

The Cuckoo sang in June and May

I recently came across a website called "Tweetapedia" which, as a big fan of Wikipedia, I immediately fell upon. I wanted to know about cuckoos because this is their time of year, and now I have quite a bit to share.

Apparently there are 54 species of cuckoos but only two live in Europe, most in Africa. Asia and Australasia. Only the male cuckoo calls cuckoo and he does indeed change his tune in June! Their favourite diet is hairy caterpillars and the word "cuckold" to describe a betrayed husband is a reflection of the cuckoo's mating habits. This is where we get to the bad bit about cuckoos - they lay their eggs in other birds' nests and do away with the progeny of the host bird. A weird sort of loyalty is shown by female cuckoos as they lay their eggs in a nest belonging to the same species of bird that reared them.

But despite their dog in the manger habits, cuckoos are becoming increasingly rare. Part of the reason for this is the dangers they face during their astounding migration which they make down to Africa every year as soon as they have laid their eggs. They don't even wait until the young are reared because the host bird is doing that for them, indeed young cuckoos never see their parents, only their confused adoptive mother.

The British Trust for Ornithology has been tracking cuckoo migration since 2011 and, if you can forgive them, you can sponsor a cuckoo through their website. As at the end of March, according to the tiny tracking devices attached to them, Calypso had reached the Ivory Coast and Ellis had crossed the Sahara. If you have a moment you can watch their progress on the Trust's website. There is special mention for a cuckoo called PJ who arrived back in his Suffolk home in early spring becoming the first tracked bird to complete his fifth annual migration cycle!

I hope that by the time you have read this article you will have heard a cuckoo and, as is traditional, written to The Times to report it. You will certainly have seen the Cuckoo flower or Lady's Smock which is in the meadows everywhere at the moment. Its leaves taste of hot mustard and the flowers of cress. Worth a try?

gardening

I can't believe we've reached May already! As I write, the Easter Bunny will be preparing to deliver chocolate eggs and in glorious sunshine and warmth! April is synonymous with being an unpredictable month for the gardener. This year was no different with snow, a hot spell and damaging frosts! We look forward to May with it's more settled weather that acts as a catalyst for the plants.

We're currently very busy here at the nursery with our garden designer customers and their wonderful garden projects. I've also been very pro-active with giving talks to garden societies again. I say again, as Covid put pay to these for two years. (Ironically I had to cancel my Hever Hort. talk recently because of it!)

One thing has struck me on my return to the circuit is a worrying decline in the numbers who are subscribing to societies. This seems to be going against the trend of the numbers of people who have 'found' gardening during Lockdown. Reportedly 3 million extra people are now active in their gardens. What's going wrong? Please don't be offended if I say that gardening has always had an age barrier - it's always been seen as an older generational pastime. I think this is where the problem lies.

We know there are plenty of young people and families who enjoy their gardens but there isn't enough education to show the benefits both physically and mentally that gardening brings. We also see it first hand with recruitment here at the nursery. Pardon the pun, but it's a perennial problem filling vacancies - why is this? I strip it right back to schools. Horticulture is not offered as a core subject and certainly not seen as a career option. Back in my day I studied agricultural science once a week Eden Valley! An insight into both farming and horticulture.

It's something I feel very passionate about and I'm booked in to my four year old daughter's nursery school to talk about the horticultural industry - could be a tricky audience! It's an extremely rewarding career both in terms of interest and financially - reportedly worth billions in this country if you include the garden design and landscape sector.

A recent talk to the High Halden Horticultural Society, I saw a very interesting development. To encourage more generations to the society they reached out to their local school. A fantastic success with many children and parents taking part in their society shows and competitions. Is this the way forward? Yes!!

There's a bright future for the industry in this country - we've just got to get the kids on board!

Along with the much hoped for sunshine, May is a busy month for the Parish Council with the Annual Meeting on Tuesday 10th May and the Parish Assembly on Thursday 26th May. Please do come along and join us for the Assembly. We have local speakers followed by the chance to socialise and enjoy the refreshments provided. You should receive an invite through your door to the event, plus an invite to the exciting Queen's Platinum Jubilee Garden Party on Thursday 2nd June.

April saw our Parish Litter Pick and luckily the sun was shining. In Four Elms the team, armed with high viz vests, litter pickers and an assortment of colourful rubbish bags, managed to pick litter along the lanes and the field behind the school and around St Paul's Church. The litter pickers were rewarded with doughnuts, pastries, teas and coffees and a lovely morning walk in the sunshine.

In Markbeech the litter pick was attended by a handful of pickers, and also very generously by Cllr Matthew Dickens. Five full bags of rubbish as well as various ironwork and signage were collected! Quite a number of residents are also in the habit of regularly collecting rubbish when they are out walking.

At the time of writing, Hever has yet to do their litter pick, but I am sure that too will be well supported and fruitful. A big thank you to those residents who turned out to help collect litter.

On the subject of being outside, there have been reports of public footpaths in the Parish that are in need of repair. If you notice a footpath that needs attention, please report this via this link on the Kent County Council website: https://www.kent.gov.uk/environmentwaste-and-planning/public-rights-ofway/report-a-problem-on-a-right-ofway . Here you can log any issues found and upload photos etc. Please note KCC has limited funding for maintenance. Responsibility also lies with the landowners and KCC will liaise with them to determine the best course of action.

I have been out and about getting to know the layout of the Parish. I visited the Hever bus stop with Councillor Lindsay and a member of the public. The bus stop will be having a much needed spring clean. Whilst out, it was noted some of the trim trail equipment on Hever Field is damaged so a repair will be looked into.

district council news

Accompanying Council Tax bills this year was a leaflet about the Government's £150 rebate scheme. The District Council was asked to include the flyer but detail was a little light since the initiative had yet to be fully developed. Although seemingly a humdrum topic, this column provides a convenient opportunity to provide an update on what I know is an eagerly awaited payment.

First a little background. Earlier this year the Government announced a raft of measures designed to keep a cap on energy costs. These included the Home Upgrade Grant, a £200 reduction to bills described both as a discount and as a loan, a discretionary pot of money administered by councils, and this £150. It's easy to get into a muddle about all of these, which is why we're looking at only the last one today. This is a one-off lump sum made to ratepayers in properties in Council Tax bands A to D. That's a couple of hundred homes in our patch.

Now, if you pay your Council Tax by direct debit, haven't moved home recently and live at only one address then things should be straightforward – you can shortly expect to receive a payment of £150 into your bank account. If it hasn't arrived by the end of June then do please feel free to chase.

Things are a little more complex for everyone else. If you've moved, the key date is 1 April, with the ratepayer at the time being the one who is eligible. Unoccupied or second homes do not qualify. And for those who do not pay by direct debit, you'll receive a letter from the District Council offering a few choices, including a discount to your Council Tax account or payment of the sum to a nominated account.

As ever, be mindful that some disreputable sorts might try to take advantage of all this. We haven't seen any evidence of fraudsters impersonating local authorities seeking bank details, nor of firms offering to claim the sum on your behalf, but it's always wise to be careful.

The most important thing is that you call Sevenoaks District Council and only them if you're in any doubt about the validity of any letters you receive, or if you have a question or concern. The telephone number is 01732 227 000. My hope and expectation is, though, that all will be well.

our rector's thoughts

On 17th May at 7.00pm in St.Peter's, I am to be instituted as Rector of the Three Spires Benefice by the Bishop of Tonbridge. Many ask what difference this will make and the reality is not much. However, having been licensed in April 2020 by Zoom, I am delighted and honoured that we can hold this celebration of all that is good about our lives in the Three Spires, notwithstanding the difficult times in which we live

I've been asked to write a slightly longer piece to give you some background about me and my wife, Susie. Susie and I are local, grew up and were educated in Sevenoaks. As a seven year old I learned to ride and horses became a key part of my life. I competed mainly in eventing and for a short while was a dressage judge. So I'm always interested to have a horsey chat with the many riders I see around the parishes! My parents were not church goers but when I was sixteen I went to a youth club at St.Nicholas church. Sevenoaks where I made the decision to become a follower of Jesus. My aim in attending the youth club had been to meet girls - which I did - I met my wife Susie and we were married in 19801

I read history at Cambridge and afterwards started a career in accountancy, which continued with the same firm (KPMG) for thirty-three years. I became a partner in 1988 and lead the firm's work in social housing. I retired from the firm in 2009 when I was ordained but continued to work as a consultant and non-executive director. Until very recently I was Finance Director of a regional YMCA in Sussex.

Susie and I have lived in Penshurst for thirty years, so we know the local area and rural life. We have three grown up children and five young grandchildren. All live fairly close to us and some of you may know our daughter Zoe and family who moved into Uckfield Lane, Hever last June. In addition to spending time with our expanding family, I continue to ride occasionally and we



both enjoy swimming, gardening and tennis. We're fond of the arts, theatre, opera, socialising and entertaining.

My life started out inauspiciously as I was born in London to a young single German woman who became pregnant. I was then adopted a few

How did I come to be ordained? For Susie and me, following Jesus is the most important thing in our lives. We have been heavily involved in five churches of different types and styles: leading Bible studies and working with youth and children. Nearly twenty years ago I began to sense that God might be calling me into the ministry. There then followed a rather lengthy period of discernment and eventually I was accepted to train on a part time threeyear theological course before being ordained in 2009. I was then a curate and later associate vicar at St.John's Hildenborough before my move to the Three Spires.

Susie and I have been wonderfully welcomed into the Three Spires and feel this is where God has called us. We look forward to seeing what he has in store for all of us in the years ahead.
