# Hever's coronation celebrations

## Just before Christmas in 1953, Rev Foster, the Rector of Hever, was turning out his cupboards.

On an envelope marked 'Coronation Celebrations Q Elizabeth II' he wrote 'Some future social historian may be interested, possibly, in details of the Village Celebrations on 2nd June 1953'. At some point, the envelope was passed on to the Eden Valley Museum and 70 years on a volunteer historian has indeed found something of interest in those most mundane of items: invoices – a window onto a vanished world.

Milk and cream came direct from Truggers Farm in Chiddingstone, ice cream at sixpence a tub collected on the day from the Negresco Café (the Negresco was the now-long-defunct Edenbridge Cinema). Tomatoes and cucumbers cost 8 shillings and sixpence from the Model Fish and Fruit Stores in Edenbridge and cut loaves, bridge rolls, and 3 gross of cakes from Smarts Hill Bakery in Penshurst cost £6 .3s. Clearly tea was the main beverage of the day, with just £1 spent on 'minerals' to toast the Queen, plus £1 on squash, both purchased from the Greyhound Inn. All was done properly: paper doilies from Woolworths adorned the cake plates and trifle was served in 144 waxed paper jelly cases.

When it came to publicity, Durrants of Edenbridge printed 12 posters for the

exorbitant price of £16.9s. For menus and programmes the committee turned to Mrs Hoster's Typing, Shorthand and Translation Offices in Telegraph Street EC2, more reasonable at £2 and 6d.

The great novelty of the day was, of course, the live showing of the events in London through the amazing new medium of television. For this they turned to TC Hillier, Electrical Engineer of Oxted for the hire of two televisions and one radio, though with the average size of television screens at about 12 inches (30cm) how the entire village managed to see them is open to question! Anyway, Hever School offered its premises for the showing and for teas 'for Children and Old Folk'. Quite what happened to the ages in between is unclear. Children also had the excitement of a sports day, but what else went on is sadly lost in the mists of time as what were not preserved were programmes, menus or any photos.

But they must be out there somewhere! So has anyone any memorabilia of Hever's Coronation Celebrations? If so, the Eden Valley Museum would be delighted to receive them as loans or donations, ASAP, to display at their forthcoming Jubilee Event. 

# **Among the Wolves of Court**

a talk by Dr Lauren MacKay in St Peter's Church Hever Saturday 25 June 8pm



Anne Boleyn's story is famous, but that of her father, Thomas Boleyn, is less known. Thomas is usually portrayed as a grasping courtier who sacrificed his daughters to the royal bedchamber but there is far more to his story. For over three decades Thomas enjoyed a successful career as one of the Tudor period's most highly skilled ambassadors, served as one of Cardinal Wolsey's right-hand men and was respected throughout the courts of Europe. A man of intellect and spirituality, he was also a patron of some of the greatest minds of the age, including the great scholar Desiderius Erasmus.

Lauren will spend an evening delving into Thomas Boleyn's life and career, moving beyond the myths and stereotypes to establish his place in Tudor history.

# remembering Pauline Scott

Pauline's funeral service in Hever Church in April was packed and the Scott family did us proud with refreshments in the Henry afterwards. It was a time to celebrate Pauline as well as mourn her.

She was born in Douglas on the Isle of Man in 1941 and had enduring memories of fish and chips on the promenade and rushing home from school to watch the TT races. The family moved to the Wirral when she was about 13 where her father Dick worked as an engineer with the post office, now British Telecom. As her mother had passed away when Pauline was young, she was brought up by Dick and her Auntie Mae.

Riding had already become a huge part of her life and when she left school, and her father had helped her get a job in the Post Office drawing office, Pauline determinedly set about saving up to buy herself her first horse, Kerry. She worked hard at riding and went on to compete in the Working Hunter class at the Horse of the Year Show at Wembley.

After a time, and much to her dad's

annoyance, Pauline left her job to follow her passion for travel and joined British Eagle as a stewardess – then moving on to BOAC and British Airways; there were many tales of far flung places and room parties. Possibly the high point of her career was being selected to crew one of the

Queen's flights.

Meanwhile she met John Scott, born and bred on the Wirral, at a party. They courted for six vears whilst she flew and he farmed. She was a keen member of the Birkenhead Operatic Society and managed to persuade John on stage at the Liverpool Empire - leading on an equally unwilling donkey. They were

married on 1 October 1970, a carefully chosen date as John reckoned correctly that he would have finished the combining by then! Pauline's favourite horse O'Reilly was guest of honour and they honeymooned in Hawaii.

Their children, Caroline and Simon, were soon born and Pauline was happily grounded for a while when they were toddlers. She and John bred ponies of their own and Caroline

inherited her mother's love of horses. working now as an accountant for Tattersall's, blood stock agents in Newmarket where her partner is a trainer.

As the children grew, Pauline went

back to her muchloved work as a stewardess, a brave decision in the mid seventies: John's mother lived next door so childcare worked well

And then the family made another brave decision, this time to move SOUTH! The Wirral was getting too built up so the Scotts were looking for a farm in rural Cheshire - when Polebrook farm caught their eye.

It had been for sale in the big auction when the Astors sold the Castle and it's enormous estate but it didn't sell so they were able to buy it shortly afterwards in 1983.

The great migration included the horses of course, but also their 150 cows which arrived in three double decker wagons.

Hever proved a welcoming place and they made lots of good friends. Pauline would often recall the Haywards organising a welcome party with so many people. Over the years Pauline was involved in various parts

of community life including the WI, the Church choir and the Penshurst amateur dramatic society along with organising many memorable dinners at Hever Castle.

The farm business diversified after the

great storm of 1987 and they started a saw mill and timber business. Simon, who had done business studies at Bristol University and was working in London, wanted to come home and Hever Beavers was born. Simon gradually discovered his talent for making wooden structures and they moved away from the saw mill towards the more creative work the Scott Partnership

Living the dream in Barbados

is known for today.

Caroline and Simon remember Pauline as an amazing, encouraging mum - firm but fair. They say "the bits of wisdom we took from her were to "treat everyone the same no matter who they are" and that "everything happens for a reason"".

She will be very much missed by all of the family especially John, Caroline and Will. Simon and Denise and her two grandsons who she loved dearly, Alex and Charlie.



Throughout the whole walk I will be carrying the flag of the Cowden, Hartfield and District Branch of The Royal British Legion.

# our rector's thoughts

In my experience, June is normally a very busy month: we have Art in June locally and Wimbledon at the end of the month. This year we also have the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and our celebration of 900 years of Christian worship in St.Peter's Hever, which will be marked by a flower festival and a special service and picnic on Sunday 26th June.

Plus, on the evening before, we have a lecture by historian Dr.Lauren Mackay on the Boleyn family. It is amazing that in St.Peter's we have the tomb of the grandfather of the first Queen Elizabeth as we celebrate the Platinum jubilee of the second Queen Elizabeth.

But we all know that many of the monarchs who ruled this country fell rather short. It is an embarrassment that the creation of the Church of England came out of Henry VIII's desire to divorce Katherine of Aragon, his wife of 24 years.

However, when it comes to our current Queen, we are blessed to have a sovereign who is known for being Head of State and confidante to 14 Prime Ministers, mother and great grandmother. Despite her recent understandable struggles with age, she is still working. She continues to show an amazing commitment to her duty in accordance with the solemn vow she

made on her 21st birthday in 1947: I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service....

Whilst mainstream media always seems to downplay or ignore her Christian faith, she has consistently witnessed to Christ as her anchor, her guide and her help. In a recent broadcast she said: 'Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God.

So this June, we will be looking back with thanksgiving over 900 years for Hever church and 70 years for our Queen. Looking forward is a bit more challenging with the worsening international situation in Europe and threats of an escalating war. In 1939, the Queen's father, George VI, in his Christmas radio broadcast, quoted from a poem:

I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year, 'Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown', and he replied, 'Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be better than light and safer than a known way.'

I wish you all a very joyful celebration this June.

# gardening

It's official! What many of us, and certainly those of us in the Hever Hort, have suspected for some time has now been given scientific credence; Spring is occurring three weeks earlier than before. Wytham Woods was bequeathed to Oxford University in 1947 and, since then, has been used as a 'living laboratory' for conducting a number of scientific studies, perhaps the most important being the Great Tit study. This shows that Tits are laying their first eggs up to three weeks earlier than when the study started 75 years ago. When deciding on the dates of our shows this change to the seasons always generates discussion, but so far we have stuck to the same dates. This change was brought home to me when a few of the sweet peas I started in January were in flower at the beginning of May, earlier than before.

We are often encouraged to spend time just enjoying our gardens, as well as working in them, and Simon Sutcliffe alluded to the physical and mental benefits of gardening in the last issue of the Link. In our garden we have created a number of areas where we can sit, have a coffee (or something stronger) and relax. The picture shows our morning coffee area, with a rhododendron, climbing rose and Wisteria. The rhododendron was a one metre high youthful plant when we moved to Hawthorns nearly 19 years ago, and is now about three meters high.

There is always a proliferation of gardening advice, and a couple of

snippets on pollinators struck me as interesting. Globe thistles (Echinops) provide a massive amount of nectar, equivalent to about 30 cosmos, and plants stop producing nectar in dry weather, so it is important to keep nectarrich plants watered.

We are well into the 2022 Hever Hort season, with a couple of talks, the Spring Show and most recently, the annual Plant sale, under our horticultural belts. The rain just about held off to allow the Plant sale to be held outside. The combination of George Payne's lovely selection of perennials and bedding plants, and the home-grown contribution from Hort members was a great success, almost equalling last year's record sale.

The next big event in our calender is the Rose Show, on Saturday, 11th June, 2pm - 4pm. There will be refreshments and a raffle, so please come along (or why not enter) if you can. For more information contact Jan Tolfree on 01342 850206 or me on 01342 852 307.






