#### accidental archivist

I first heard the expression 'a portfolio career' when I studied for the Certificate of Arts Management at Sussex University in 1999. I thought it was a very smart way of describing my situation as a part-time nursery garden worker and volunteer archivist.



By 2003 I had added Hon Curator, Eden Valley Museum. I retired from the museum in 2017 but now find myself responsible for three diverse archives. In 2001 I took over the Association of British Theatre Technicians collection when they needed an archivist to sort out 40 years of accumulated papers. I got the job because, as a former stage manager, I had a good understanding of the nature of their collection: I had backstage experience. If you want to know about the development of the Exit sign or crash bars on emergency doors, consult our archive. It also includes a section of knowledgeable advice and interesting comments for many of the theatres that have been built or developed in the UK since 1962.

I now have my father, actor Frank Thornton's, 1941 - 2013 career archive to finish sorting and cataloguing. I have rescued his first scrapbook which was falling to pieces because the pages of acidic wartime paper were very brittle. Each page has now been put into the correct type of clear cover to protect it and it can now be looked at without fear of further deterioration.



He was a perfect Eeyore and wrote: "It is ironic to note that this is the first time I have received quite unreserved, and generous praise from my beloved wife & daughter. In fact, on no previous occasion have critics been so generous in praise either. It appears I have to disguise myself with a skin, hooves & grey make-up to rate such words. As my friend Eeyore would say: "Typical! Absolutely typical!".

From a letter he wrote in reply to one from a BBC executive when the run of 'Are You Being Served?' came to an end: "In practical terms a free-lance actor must go where the work

is, whether it's the West End or the Mechanic's Institute, Biker, and in my forty years I have certainly worked for many different employers in every medium. Undeniably, though, the B.B.C. figures in my files more than any other, from my first war-time propaganda broadcast in 1942 and my first T.V. at Alexandra Palace on through those happy day at the Centre with "It's A Square World" and all the other shows; so that these days I cannot help feeling a little bit of a stranger when I enter the gates of other T.V. studios. But when I point the car up Wood Lane the feeling is always that I am returning to the old alma mater." 14 July 1984



The latest assignment in my 'portfolio career' is really thrilling and is not as random as it might first appear. When the Talyllyn Railway archivist had to retire recently and a replacement not yet recruited, I offered to help out. I am a regular visitor to West Wales and until the search for someone who lives a little closer bears fruit I remain their Archives Advisor.

The Talyllyn Railway in Snowdonia was built to carry slate to the coast

from a quarry in the mountains. My great grandfather, Thomas Evans of Water Street, Abergynolwyn, worked in that quarry. I have been aware of the historic narrow-gauge trains wriggling up and down the valley since I was four years old because my grandparents, in retirement, had returned to live in the area. The line would probably have been lost to history but for an intrepid group of pioneer volunteers who formed the first Railway Preservation Society in the world in 1951. It inspired the plot for the film 'The Titfield Thunderbolt'. In 2021 we became the southern hub of the Welsh Slate Landscape UNESCO World Heritage Site. Their archive, which is stored off site, is primarily their business archive, a record of how the railway is managed, but it is also the repository for donations from its devotees which will enhance the story for future historians. The archive now has to meet the challenge of entering the digital world which will revolutionise access to its collections. www.talyllyn. co.uk

Isn't it strange how life seems to push you along in a particular direction? I currently have three diverse challenges all with the overarching theme of conserving the history of these people, industries and organisations. In addition, members of my family have always had many photographs to look at - numerous albums full of mini time machines and they also need looking after properly. More work for the accidental archivist.

#### snippets of news from Four Elms

There are many aspects of modernday living which are echoes from the dim and distant past. We can be preoccupied by the weather, the state of the roads, road traffic accidents, national or local tragedies and even good news stories. Human nature has always been the same and these same issues caused similar concerns in times gone by. Here are a few illustrations from various newspapers of the time.

#### June, 1746

"Last Tuesday afternoon was the most violent storm and tempest of thunder, rain and whirlwind I ever remember. In half an hour's time it did great damage in hop grounds, throwing down poles with bines then tearing them from their roots. It has blown down many elms; the lightening rived into splinters four oaks in the neighbourhood. For 15 minutes together there was one continued thunder without intermission, and a continual torrent of Hail, Rain and Flame. In short, I have never seen such a tempest, nor could think the heat of this climate could have produced such a one."

#### June, 1904

"On Tuesday, a six year old boy named William Richard Barnett, son of a labourer named J.W. Barnett of Four



Elms, was drowned in the Four Elms Pond. He reached home from school about 4 o'clock and then went out to play. Two hours later, his mother, desiring him home for his tea, was unable to find him. His fishing rod and his cap were lying on the bank of the pond, and a search resulted in his body being found in the water. Artificial respiration was tried for some hours, but fruitlessly. At the inquest the jury returned a verdict of accidental death."



#### 1914

A serious accident occurred on Monday evening at the cross-roads in Four Elms village, when a motor car belonging to Mr. Janson of Crockham Hill ( and later, Mariners ), was going in that direction and a cart belonging to Mrs. Jewels of Hendon, was going towards Edenbridge. The motor car caught the cart, which was overturned, and the driver, named Greenstreet, thrown out and badly injured about the face and shoulder. Dr. Newington was sent for, and under his care, Greenstreet is progressing favourably."

#### March, 1915

"On Wednesday at Four Elms crossroads, a lad named Holland leading a horse drawing a cartload

of hay, fell under the wheels and sustained a broken thigh."

#### May, 1918

"A somewhat serious accident took place at Four Elms Road on Saturday. Miss Alice Cornish was driving a horse and cart containing three other persons, when the animal backed into the bank at the side of the road and the cart overturned completely. Mrs. Cornish, of Furnace House Farm, Four Elms, was trapped. She was rescued and carried home and a doctor called. She had sustained broken ribs and a smashed jaw bone. The other occupants of the cart escaped with a shaking."

#### May 1934 Alsatian's Bite Costs £206

Pax Homer, an Alsatian dog, was the cause of a lawsuit in the King's Bench Division, London.

Pax Homer belongs to Miss Bertha Margaret Wills of Four Elms Road, Edenbridge, Kent.

One evening last July Miss Emma Cadman, who is a dressmaker and also lives in Four Elms Road, went to

see Miss Wills about the making of a dress. And according to Miss Cadman, Pax Homer resented the visit. He rushed down the garden path -so she said- and bit her severely on the thigh with the result that she could not follow her employment. Mr. Justice Acton

heard the story on Wednesday when Miss Cadman claimed damages from Miss Wills. She suggested that Miss Wills knew Pax Homer was vicious because he once bit one of her maids who gave evidence. Miss Wills denied this and defended Pax Homer's character. Mr. Justice Acton said he believed the maid's evidence. He gave judgement for Miss Cadman for £206 plus costs.

#### 1939

#### Four Elms Christmas Cheer!

"Cottagers in Four Elms and Toys Hill will not lack the little luxuries that make a good Christmas, for through a provision in the will of the late Mrs. Hattie Kennedy, the gifts that she made to the villagers at Christmastide will be continued forever in memory of her parents, John and Mary Stansfield-Williams of Boones Park, Four Elms. The gifts which are distributed by the Trustees, consist of beef and groceries to 52 cottagers in the ecclesiastical parish of Four Elms and Toys Hill, and a bonus to all members of the clothing club."

#### duckling rescue at the castle

# There follows a sad story with a happy ending. Does anyone know why male ducks are so murderous?

"Kate McCaffrey, assistant curator at Hever Castle, writes:

A mother duck had been safely nesting in our Castle courtyard for a few weeks. We fed her and kept visitors away from her, so she could nest in peace. On Monday morning, her eggs hatched and seven little ducklings ventured out into the courtyard guarded bravely, of course, by their mother. We watched them try all day to climb the three steps out onto the drawbridge. At the end of the day, to cheers from everyone,

they eventually managed to follow their mother up the steps and across to the forecourt.

Very sadly, their mother was then attacked by eight drakes who pushed her into the moat and killed her. Her ducklings had also been pushed into the moat in the chaos, but we were determined, having not been able to save their mother, to save them. If they had been left to fend for themselves in the moat overnight, they very likely would not have survived. In a concerted team effort (myself, Nicola, Alison, Ben, Caz and Laura), we managed after a while to coax the scared ducklings to the side of the moat with duck food.



Nicola and Ben used a double net, pincer action to scoop our ducklings up and out of the moat.

They went straight into a box and were taken to Nick Hoggins at Delaware who will kindly look after them. We were all (including the whole castle team of stewards, and several visitors who had been watching our rescue) hugely relieved that we managed to help the ducklings and see them off to safety. What started as a rather distressing event to witness, turned into some amazing team work to save the ducklings."

#### The Repair Shop and its museum

If you haven't been to the Weald and Downland Living Museum near Chichester, you have really missed out. Thanks to the amazing energy and foresight of its founders, buildings on the verge of extinction, such as a medieval shop in Horsham, were dismantled and resurrected on site. There are buildings from every era including a little row of farm workers' cottages such as I remember from my childhood, fablon on the tables and rag rugs on the floor.

Closer to home, the tin church looks very like Hever Village Hall and one of its key buildings, Bayleaf Farmstead, comes from Bough Beech. The farmstead, dating from the early 1400s and belonging to the manor of



Brocas, was destined to be drowned when the valley was flooded to make the reservoir, so it was re-homed and saved. Now Hever has a replica in Bayleaf Hall behind the station.

If you want to visit the museum, see their website wealdown.co.uk. The museum has gardens, animals and of course a cafe too! It is also full of living history events such a cart pulled by oxen picking up rubbish and cookery displays of mediaeval food; strange combinations of meat and fruit and bone marrow.

The one part of the Museum you cannot visit is the barn which houses the popular television series The Repair Shop. You can lean over the gate and see the real thing; no further. But no matter! As I scrunched up the gravel drive to the workshop of neighbour Tony Yates who lives on Uckfield Lane, I realised that we have our very own repair shop right here.



He has done such a fine job on my much loved kitchen drainer which was in a sad state and I'm pleased to say that he is happy to take on other small projects, only things that can be delivered to him, such as chairs and small tables, for very modest prices. His number is 01732 863847.

#### our rector's thoughts

Summer is a time for sport. Our schools have their sports days and as you read this we'll be in the midst of Wimbledon – will Emma Raducanu be fit to play? Then there's the Tour de France, the Grand Prix, Open Golf at St.Andrews and England cricket test matches against South Africa and much more.

Sport demands passion, commitment and the strength of character to face both failure and success. Many competitors devote their lives to the goal of winning.

Few films have captured this quite like Chariots of Fire (1981). It tells the true story of two very different British athletes competing in the 1924 Paris Olympics.

Eric Liddell, a Scot, is a devout Christian, and wrestles with the spiritual implications of competing. Harold Abrahams is the son of a Jewish immigrant, who runs to prove his worth in the face of prejudice. Like many athletes today, Harold is driven in an almost addictive way by the overwhelming desire to prove himself. "I'm forever in pursuit and I don't even know what I am chasing." Our culture seems to value people on what they achieve rather than their intrinsic worth. But, as Harold discovers, this approach has a flipside because failure is devastating.

Eric is somehow different. His running style, with his body tilted back and mouth open, is almost bizarre. But it's a symptom of what is happening in his heart as he races. Perhaps he is looking heavenwards because he simply loves to run. "God made me for a purpose", he says, "but he also made me fast. And when I run I feel His pleasure."

It's not that Eric's journey is painless or free from conflict. But it's clear that he's free from the crushing pressure which Harold experiences. Eric doesn't need to run to feel complete – he wants to run, because he already is.

Perhaps we are all a bit like Harold, striving with all our strength to be acceptable but finding that we can never quite make it. Or maybe we look back at missed opportunities. But take a look at Eric and wonder whether there isn't an alternative to just winning or losing.

St.Paul writes to the Corinthians: Everyone who competes in the Games goes into strict training. They do it for a crown that will not last; but we do it to get a crown that will last for ever.

As we enjoy watching amazing sport this summer, let's take time to reflect what is truly of lasting worth.

God bless you and enjoy the sport!

#### gardening

As I write the weather is really starting to warm up – flaming June is starting to live up to its name!

We all know what we need to do to help bring CO2 levels down both individually and as a business. I touched on what we are doing at the nursery to improve our 'green' credentials (growing in peat-free) last time out. Following on from this, we attended the Society of Garden Designers Symposium on sustainability within our industry held at RHS Wisley.

A fantastic line-up of top garden designers including Dan Pearson, Arit Anderson (Gardeners World), Noel Kingsbury, contributing ideas on how to improve practices in sustainable garden design. Design materials such as concrete, wood & metal are vital to some garden builds. However, these materials can be detrimental to the environment. Existing concrete or bricks in a garden that is to be built can be crushed to create a new material for pathways and seating areas. Wood can be stripped and re-used and metal recycled. 'Upcycling' using existing materials lessens the impact on the environment. If new materials are used. perhaps try using local quarries - there is also an amazing new concrete product that absorbs CO2 within its lifespan!

What excites me the most as a plantsman is the practice of using sustainable planting. We're encouraged to use reliable perennial plants instead of annuals that

are ripped out twice a year for bedding schemes (a few annuals don't do any harm!). The use of indigenous plants can help the biodiversity of a garden – Common Primrose, Field Scabious, Oxeye Daisy to name a few. We're not saying fill your gardens with natives as there are also thousands of cultivated plants which are fantastic for pollinating insects. Nepeta (Catmint) for example is great for attracting Bees and is visually stunning.

Charlie Harpur, head gardener at Knepp Gardens in Horsham, Sussex gave an inspirational talk about the re-wilding project at the 3500 acre estate. Formally intensively farmed they are using grazing animals as the drivers of habitat creation. and with the restoration of dynamic. natural water courses, the project has seen extraordinary increases in wildlife. The formal gardens have also seen a transformation. Once straight lined paths and clipped Box, this has given way to drought tolerant perennials & grasses. Seed heads remain throughout the season attracting a huge diversity of insects & birds into the garden.

We don't all have huge estates, but we can all do our bit in whatever sized garden we have. Simply leaving un-mowed strips of grass and being selective with the plants we grow can attract a huge amount of wildlife to our gardens. Even plants grown in pots on balconies can act as wildlife corridors. Gardens contribute to an enormous amount of outdoor space nationally – help 'rewild'!
