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## **Draft Minutes**

**Attendees:** Angela Haydon (AH) Chair, Stephen Lark (SL), Nick Roberts (NR), Phil Lindsay (PL), Angie Connolly (AC), Duncan Leslie (DL)

Also in Attendance: Rachael Turner (Clerk and RFO) and 4 members of the public (MOP).

The meeting was held in Markbeech Village Hall on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> November and commenced at 7.30 pm. During the Public Forum, the Chair read out a report from County Councillor McArthur: **School buses** – there was further debate but no change to the cuts. Discussions are continuing as to whether improvements can be made but there are shortages of both drivers and buses, plus huge increases in costs which have caused companies to cut their services back. **Homes for Ukraine** - increase in allowances for those who are hosting Ukrainian families plus there is a shortage of affordable housing. **Asylum seekers** – huge pressure on Kent and no consultation by the Home Office. Decisions are being taken that are putting people at risk. A separate report is available from Cllr McArthur. There are also high volumes of unaccompanied asylum-seeking children in the county. **KCC Budget** – there will be further difficult budget cuts made. **Warm Spaces** – a directory is available on SDC website. **Footpath improvement** some funding is available and details have been sent to the Clerk.

## Agenda

- 1) To receive apologies for absence and resolve to approve reasons given. Apologies received and approved from Rick Brookes-Smith Joanna Wade and Margot McArthur. No apologies received from Edward de Ryckman de Betz.
- 2) To receive declarations of interests in relation to Agenda items No declarations received.
- 3) Minutes of last meeting to approve and sign minutes of the meeting held on the 27<sup>th</sup> September 2022. Duly approved and signed.
- \*Planning: The planning meeting was held at 7.00 pm. Resolved to approve the comments for Hever Parish Council. Duly Approved.
- 5) Finance
  - a) Bank reconciliation prepared by the RFO, for approval by all and signed by member of FEC (SL). Duly approved and signed.
  - b) To resolve to approve for payment items of expenditure to include ratification of items made between meetings. (ALL). Duly approved.
  - c) To receive and approve the mid-year budget and forecast, as reviewed by FEC. Forecast for 22-23 looks to be within budget. Assuming there is no unexpected expenditure for the rest of the year, there will be 15k contingency to carry forward to the next year. Duly approved.
  - d) To receive and approve pay review and revised conditions for Clerk & RFO as proposed by FEC. Unanimously approved.

- e) To consider 23-24 Budget and Precept amounts recommended by FEC. Proposal to not increase and keep the Precept at £50,000. Draft budget circulated to Councillors for full consideration, discussion and approval at January meeting.
- f) CIL spend report for 21-22. Receipts for 21-22 year total £2849.18 plus a spend of £252.76 from 2020-2021. Further CIL payments have been received for 2022-2023 of £4867.14 giving a total of £7716.32 to spend on CIL projects. CIL spend Report duly approved. Clerk to notify SDC and display report on website.
  - SDC have clarified that CIL monies could be spent on Markbeech Village Hall improvements and also on Hever Village Hall rebuild.
- g) CIL Propose to give £2,500 to Hever Village Hall for rebuild. Unanimously approved.
- 6) Committee Reports
  - a) Pond the recent car accident has caused damage to the pond fencing, a bench and the millennium signpost. CCTV footage has been shared with the Police. The insurer has been notified and quotes are being obtained. NR had arranged for the debris to be removed and stored for repair. Thanks to Jason, the Pond Contractor, for his work on this too. It was raised if there was anything else that could be done to improve safety at the crossroads? There is to be a pond working party to tidy up the pond and surrounding bank on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> November. Risk Assessment will be carried out and necessary forms signed. Clerk to sort out hi- viz vests. Signs showing rules of the pond are now up on display.
  - b) Gatwick DL suggested Gatwick should be asked what they are doing to protect the area, being a AONB. DL to draft email to Tom Tugendhat. Clerk is to circulate minutes to Councillors from recent Gatwick meeting.
- \*Grant Applications Propose to approve donation to Hever Village Hall of £2,500 in grant monies, as budgeted for 22-23 year, towards the HVH rebuild. Duly Approved.
- 8) Internal Auditor Resolve to approve continued appointment of Mulberry and Co. Duly Approved. Clerk to clarify audit costs for 23-24.
- 9) Co-Opted Councillor Vacancy Consider Councillor applications and meet candidates. Two candidates were present at the meeting and both introduced themselves to the Councillors. The successful candidate will be Co-Opted as Councillor at the January meeting.
- 10) Tribute Bench Potential site. Clerk to chase up Highways for clarity on ownership of the verge as it is still unclear.
- 11) Bulk Refuse Freighter resolve to approve continuation of service 3 times a year at a cost of £1000 per annum. Duly approved.
- 12) Warm Spaces Project explore offering in community. There is currently no Warm Space offering in the Parish. Some amenities are looking in to this as an option. In the meantime, Bridges at Edenbridge are offering a warm space for locals to go. Details can be found on SDC website. Clerk to publicise.
- 13) To receive report from Clerk outlining any actions taken since the previous meeting and any other updates.
  - a) Climate Energy Action Update. It is understood Hever Village Hall is looking at the next step which is a feasibility study.

- b) Annual Safety Inspections of the Four Elms playground and Hever Trim Trail. These have been completed and there are some areas for repair. Clerk to arrange.
- c) Footpath around Hever Field informed school replacing the path is not an option at the moment. A quote has been requested from HCS so an idea of cost is gained and also for cutting the hedge.
- d) Public Footpaths Any issues blockages, incorrect signage, maintenance etc can be reported via Kent County Council website. Clerk to circulate details.
- 14) Items for information only and correspondence
  Footpaths –County Cllr. McArthur informed the Clerk there is some funding available for repairs, however priority may be given if the project is partially funded, or a contractor is sourced to do the work. There is a project soon looking to replace styles with gates. However, consultation with land owners needed will be needed. Given resource issues is this something the Clerk could assist with? Clerk to investigate.
- 15) Items for noting or inclusion on future agenda at the discretion of the Chairman.
  - a) Sevenoaks Local Plan 2040 consultation starts 16<sup>th</sup> November for 8 weeks only. Need to formulate a response from HPC. On the plan development has been highlighted in Four Elms road, Edenbridge end. Clerk to circulate details on social media and website.
  - b) Litter Picks dates to be agreed at the January meeting.
