So we can enjoy them in an un-anxious way.

Meanwhile good news for turtle doves - following a European Commission scheme, hunting of the doves has been banned for now in France, Spain and Portugal. The lives of over two



million birds have been saved and this should help the species recover - certainly there is a growing number in the Knepp estate in Sussex, home of a rewilding project. Now spared the European firing squad, the migrating birds are also finding more suitable habitats in the UK.

And as for us humans, unable to fluff up our feathers and tuck our heads under our wings...
Boormans serially saved the day in this area by delivering heating oil to the many who had run out due to the cold snap, including Hever Church. Thank you Boormans! And we hope you enjoy the photos in this edition of the now-distant snow in early December. The current road closures round Hever are proving less photogenic.

Finally, if you like Cezanne, and even if you feel you have seen all there is to see, do try to catch the exhibition at Tate Modern which is on until 12 March.



Cecil was born in Dublin to English parents in 1818. By her 20s she was already writing poems which were included in Church of Ireland hymn books; by the time she died in 1895 her Hymns for Little Children had reached its 69th edition. Her husband William Alexander was Archbishop of Armagh and both he and their daughter Eleanor and son Robert were also poets although their work has not stood the test of time. She was very devout and did many "good works", including opening a school for the deaf with her sister.

always features Green Hill. So
this traditional Victorian matron
has completely and enduringly
imprinted herself, rubbing
shoulders with the Latin O Come
All Ye Faithful and traditional

is partly because, although her words were simple, she was a good and evocative poet - as a child I loved to imagine and draw the purple headed mountain and river running by and the green hill without the city wall. Also the rhymes are not strained and the rhythms work well for the composers of the tunes, which are as memorable as the words.

tributes to Bob Pullin

Former resident of Hever, and retired

Managing
Director of
Hever Castle
& Gardens,
Bob Pullin,
sadly died in
December,
aged 82.

Many, many thousands of children will have been grateful to him for the water maze which invokes so much shrieking and glee from tiny wet people as they dodge the

spurts or deliberately stamp on the wrong spot and get doused. John Scott remembers him as a good and honourable friend who went out of his way to make sure that Castle and village got on well together, using local tradesmen whenever he could. The following tribute was written by his children.

Bob and his wife, Sally moved to Hever in 1985. They lived in Medley Court within the grounds of the Castle for over 20 years and both became part of the village community until Bob's retirement in 2006, when they moved to Edenbridge.



Starting his working career as a PF and Geography teacher having araduated from Loughborough University, Bob quickly moved on from a handson role. at private schools Churchers College and Bedales in Hampshire and Polytechnic in Nottingham, to a leisure advisory role for Hampshire County Council.

In the mid 70s Bob was appointed Managing Director of Queen Elizabeth Country Park in Hampshire, creating a new leisure and education centre for the area. This Iron Age farm, visitor centre and country park gave Bob the experience he needed to then become Estate Manager of Broadlands, home to Lord Mountbatten in Romsey, Hampshire. He opened the large stately home to the public whilst Lord Mountbatten was alive and organised many occasions and exhibitions where the Royal family were in attendance.

Throughout Bob's career he continued his passion for sport. In 1965 Bob joined Petersfield Cricket Club where he was the 1st team's captain for a number of seasons.

He always opened the batting and regularly topped the Club batting averages when it was in Division 1 of the Hampshire League and in their Southern League Days. Bob also played rugby for Hampshire at a time when county rugby was very competitive. Whilst at Loughborough Bob concentrated on playing soccer and played for Reading. He was also a very accomplished hockey player, and this is where he first met Sally, on the hockey pitch playing mixed hockey.

Later in life however, golf became Bob's main passion, and he loved being part of the setting up of Hever Castle Golf Course once it was bought by Broadland Properties, as well as being a member there.

During his many years at Hever Castle, Bob strove to make it an outstanding visitor attraction that appealed to all ages. With a keen interest in history and art, he was instrumental in the acquisition of many pieces that has resulted in one of the best collections of Tudor Art in the country. He worked closely with the Guthrie Family, who bought the Castle

from the Astors, to create varied and interesting attractions such as Anne Boleyn's Book of Hours exhibition, The Miniature Houses and Jane Asher Wedding Cakes Through the Ages Exhibition, as well as the water maze and a wooden maze within the children's adventure playground.

The Castle and gardens required a great deal of restoration and maintenance when it was first opened to the public. Areas of the gardens were thoughtfully re-developed and a new gift shop and Moat side Restaurant were built. Throughout his time at the Castle. Bob ensured that the integrity of the historic home and gardens was maintained and he helped to strengthen the relationship between the current owners and the Astors. Managing Director of the castle was a role that Bob was passionate about and felt honoured to have held.

Sadly, Bob had struggled with health issues for a few years, but he continued to visit the golf club with his close friends when he could. Bob passed away in hospital on 7th December 2022 and leaves behind his widow Sally, and children Gregg and Debbie. A Thanksgiving service was held at St Peters Church, Hever on 7th January 2023.


Class 3's involvement with the MP

You can almost picture it now: huddled around tiny television screens, it was with baited breath and a nervous energy in the air that the Chancellor's Autumn Statement was received last year. Scarcely since the collapse of the South Sea Company some three centuries earlier did an event quite so grip the imagination of the country's finance chiefs. Indeed, earlier that same week, Kent County Council's Leader declared his authority required immediate help to avoid filing bankruptcy notices. And since then. Thurrock Council has joined the ranks of Northamptonshire, Croydon and Slough in serving the Government with a declaration of insolvency.

But against this backdrop of apparent chaos, there remains a beacon of cautious calm. Because as I write. I have been putting the finishing touches to Sevenoaks District Council's budget, and I can tell you it does not find itself in a similar predicament. Local authority budgets might seem a little esoteric but they're worth reflecting on since Council Tax these days is a not inconsiderable sum and we rightly wish to be confident our bins will be collected, taxis safe. restaurants clean, homeless housed, fly-tippers pursued, and so on and so forth.

Although the image with which I opened might have involved some artistic licence, it is in a spirit of neither triviality nor triumphalism that I pen these remarks. Instead it is one of reassurance. In marked contrast to

many other authorities, Sevenoaks finds itself in an enviable position partly on account of good fortune – for instance, the seemingly limitless costs of social care, highways and education are handled at county level – but principally thanks to sound financial management over the years. I shan't dwell on this since we've covered it before, rather what it means for us as taxpayers is more important.

There will be a rise in Council Tax this Spring. However, it will be well below inflation, it will be tempered by maintaining our record of embracing novel ideas to deliver savings and secure income from other sources, and it will continue to see the average household benefit from the District Council's services for less than £5 a week. Moreover, it will result in yet another balanced budget in which services are protected not only this coming financial year but for the next decade. This stability and security remain achievements unmatched anywhere else in the country and are, I know from conversations throughout our villages, welcomed.

As stimulating as it is be to be involved with exciting initiatives, often it is the more humdrum, day-to-day, competent administration which is the most important work of councillors.

our rector's thoughts

This month will mark the anniversary of Russia's invasion of Ukraine on 24th February 2022. This coincided with Ash Wednesday and at our service in St.Peter's we displayed the Ukraine flag. The following Sunday we held an evening service focusing on Ukraine, we prayed and generous gifts were made.

But looking into 2023, I read that Russia may be mobilising up to 500,000 troops and the West will be supplying heavy armour to enable the Ukrainians to fight a proxy war. We all feel the impact through the exacerbated economic crisis, which hits the poor hardest both in this country and across the world.

Over the past year people in Edenbridge and in our community have been very generous in taking in families fleeing the war in Ukraine as well as supporting the foodbank and giving in many other ways. But I suspect many of us look at the news with resignation as to what we are to do and feel powerless.

Ash Wednesday, which this year is on 22nd February, marks the start of Lent. At the service people come forward to be marked with the sign of the cross in ash often made from burning of palm crosses from the previous year. These words are said: God our Father; you created us from the dust of the earth: grant that these ashes may be for us

a sign of our penitence & a symbol of our mortality; for it is by your grace alone that we receive eternal life in Jesus Christ our Saviour....Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.

It is a reminder that we are not in control and that we are mortal. I remember a preacher once reminding me that war does not increase death; but it does bring untimely and often violent death and suffering. As Lent progresses towards Easter, the atmosphere of the season darkens and our bible readings begin to anticipate Christ's suffering and the Cross.

Someone said: Suffering is not a question that demands an answer; it is not a problem that demands a solution; it is a mystery which demands a presence. The Christian message is that in Christ, God himself suffered on the cross for us and so knows our pain. Consequently, he is able to comfort us in our sufferings.

I pray that we might know Christ's presence with us this Lent as we remember those we know who are suffering in whatever way and especially pray for an end to the war in Ukraine.

Markbeech

I feel like this Benefice is in a good place! It's beginning to feel like normal. We have got into a great groove with regular services of all kinds happening in each parish. There are regular communion services rotating around the parishes and three different styles of Family worship. gardening

It only seems like yesterday we were opening our Christmas presents and raising our glasses to another New Year! January was particularly wet and time in our gardens was limited. As we head into February, it is a prime time to get out into the garden. Firstly, there are so many plants that start to wake up to give us a visual treat and those that give a lovely scent. Secondly, there are many jobs that need doing before the onset of Spring.

It is the best time to cut back and tidy herbaceous perennials & deciduous ornamental grasses before the new emerging growth appears. Using sharp secateurs or shears, most can be cut back hard almost to ground level. The exception to the rule is evergreen grasses. They do not respond well to cutting back hard and should be tidied or combed to remove old foliage. Also. Stipa tenuissima and Pennisetum should be treated this way. We get asked plenty of times what plants we could recommend for a low maintenance garden - herbaceous perennials & grasses fit into this category one annual cut-back.

It is also a good time to prune Winter flowering shrubs such as Mahonia & Forsythia but only after they have flowered. Prune Wisteria, Buddleja and Summer flowering Clematis. Patio pots and baskets can also be planted with hardy Spring plants such as Pansies & Polyanthus. If you have a greenhouse, February is a good time to sow seeds for the coming season. This may include

veg., Summer annuals and perennials.

There are so many plants that can be enjoyed in February! It is always worth considering planting winter interest near to the house, or at least in a position that can be seen from a window. This way they can be enjoyed without the need to venture out in inclement weather!

Here's our February favourites:

- Hellebores there are so many to choose from nowadays! We recommend the 'Pretty Ellen' series – the blooms face slightly upwards
- Galanthus (Snowdrops) Snowdrops have gained in popularity in recent years, some varieties selling for 100's of pounds! We recommend Galanthus elwesii with larger blooms & glaucus foliage
- Iris reticulata Miniature bulbs that give a pop of colour in the gloomiest of months! Try varieties such as 'Harmony', 'Pixie' or 'Katharine Hodgkin'
- Cornus (Dogwood) A tough, reliable deciduous shrub with colourful stems in Winter. 'Midwinter Fire' with orange stems, 'Baton Rouge' with bright red stems & flaviramea with yellow stems
- Edgeworthia 'Grandiflora' Very interesting shrub with clove scented, nodding, bright yellow flowers.




