

I first start thinking about the new season at The Festival Theatre in January when Ailsa, the Festival Director, starts to fill me in on who will be performing. This year is particularly exciting as it's the festival's 40th birthday and we are the longest running open-air theatre in the South-East which is something to be proud of and despite recent events we haven't taken a year off!

I write my first press release in March just before tickets go on sale. This gets sent to all the local and national press including radio and television stations and online influencers to create a buzz about the programme which includes opera, plays, jazz and classical music, speakers, comedy, family favourites and the best tribute artists. Releases are then sent monthly. I have a lot to talk about this year as we are holding our first ever event at Hever Castle Golf Club with Dinner Jazz (24 June) and we are also taking family events to The Orangery at Chiddingstone Castle on Sundays in July and August.

I always like to shout about the variety of venues used in the Hever Castle arounds, not only the Two Sisters' Theatre, but also the castle can be your stunning back drop while you picnic on the main lawn and enjoy Illyria's production of Pride and Prejudice (3 Aug). Anne Boleyn's Walk provides a more relaxed setting in the woods perfect for family shows like Robin Hood (2 June) and David Walliams' Bad Dad (30 Aug) and The Loggia, Italian Gardens is very atmospheric for Shakespeare's, As you Like It (27 May) and a new ballet about the life of Florence Nightingale (10 Aug). Audiences can also enjoy a Titipu Tea in the Guthrie Pavilion where singers from Charles Court Opera will serenade a programme of Gilbert & Sullivan (4 & 18 July).

I work mainly from home, but I love any

chance to go to the office for meetings with local editors and journalists and show off the stunning gardens of Hever Castle. They all say how lucky I am to work where I do, and I couldn't agree more.

Matthew Dickins Profile

Matthew Dickins, a profile of our long serving district councillor as he steps down from his post as portfolio holder for finance and investment and deputy leader of the Council.



Matthew Dickins may not be a career politician because being a District Councillor, even a hard working and effective one, isn't a career, but he does give a good impression of one with his wide vision of society's trends and his ability to avoid answering the question!

Matthew was born near Witney in Oxfordshire in 1990 but soon moved to Horseshoe Green Farmhouse in Markbeech which was his home for 28 years. His childhood dream was to be a chef. His education started in the capable hands of Mrs Roberts's Nursery school and from there to Tonbridge School via Yardley Court prep school. He was a treble chorister in the Tonbridge School choir and despite practising every Thursday and singing every Sunday evening his passion for music was born and remains strong. He has played the organ in all the benefice churches and has many fond memories, particularly of Derek Blows' services in Markbeech. The church was ingrained in his upbringing.

After enjoying Politics at A level and setting up an IT business with the Conservative Party as a client, providing councillors with their own websites, it was his work assisting Bill Shea's son Paul to campaign in the 2010 election for a seat in East Ham that really opened his eyes. There, as he went from door to door. he witnessed what is now known as modern slavery and saw the practice of hot bedding (tenants using the same bed in a lodging house by sleeping in it at different times of day) as a part of everyday life. Paul didn't win and East Ham became the safest of Labour seats but then, as Matthew maintains as a mantra for political life, 'you win some and you lose some'. His IT business gave him an understanding of the work of local councillors and the Tory Party encouraged him to consider joining up. With the seed sown and talks with Ann Cleeve (formerly Roberts, see above) in her capacity as chair of the MB Conservative Association and to Gerry Ryan, then our SDC representative, he was persuaded to stand in the Sevenoaks Northern ward which had never returned a Tory councillor. He won, in 2011, by 7 votes. At the 2015 election he faced a dilemma, to stand again in a challenging ward that he had much enjoyed serving or put himself forward in his home ward of Cowden and Hever. As we know, to our great benefit, he chose the latter, feeling that the most useful way to learn the needs and concerns of an electorate is to live among them.

As any keen reader of his Link column will know, District Councillors may work long hours but they do so for a very modest stipend aimed at covering expenses, so the IT business continued as did new work, startlingly referred to as a side hustle (a first for the Link) with Greg Clark MP for Tunbridge Wells. In time and with only so many hours in a day this latter role prevailed and Matthew ultimately became a Senior Parliamentary Assistant fielding many of the thousands of enquiries MPs receive. Although he wasn't successful in helping the aggrieved constituent exasperated by unwelcome automatic Microsoft Windows updates, he did manage to help many embroiled in complex problems concerning social services, HMRC etc. The awful case of sexual abuse by a hospital mortuary worker required Matthew to liaise with the Speaker of the House, opposition MPs and many agencies to produce a political response to the immediate issue and a plan to try to ensure that such abuse never recurs. He feels that politics gets a bad rap as disputatious when in fact effective work is largely collegiate.

The typical next step after 13 years of political life is to work as a lobbyist or to stand for election to parliament but the former doesn't appeal and there's no obvious vacancy to enable the latter so pastures new are the order of the day. Matthew plans a return to Oxfordshire seemingly to be nearer the dentist who has served him since the age of 3!

I asked about memorable failures and exposed Matthew's inner Socialist - the damaging effect of treating property as an asset class and investment rather than a home has rendered this part of the country unaffordable for the many. The failure in question being that of not finding an affordable housing solution for Four Elms. The successes : being the only district in Kent to have a dedicated fly tipping team even though their work is still an uphill struggle, and his work with the High Weald area of outstanding natural beauty that tries to ensure that alterations to our landscape are sympathetic and sustainable. And what of the cheffing dreams? Cooking does seem to feature in Matthew's life but he failed to disclose a signature dish and seems more enamoured of pursuing his studies with the Wine & Spirit Education Trust. I suspect that he may not be done with politics yet but with a betting slip for Rory Stewart to lead the Conservatives in his drawer perhaps a life in gambling should be ruled out.

The UK government's new Emergency

Alerts system is now live. The system will enable people to be contacted via their mobile phone when lives are in danger and will be used to warn you in the event of emergencies, such as severe flooding. There was a national test of the system on Sunday 23rd April. Emergency Alerts are sent to all compatible mobile phones within an area of risk. They do not track your location, need your phone number, or collect personal data. Only the government and the emergency services will be able to send them. If you do not have a mobile phone, you will still be kept informed through other channels. If you get an Emergency Alert on your phone, you will hear a loud, siren-like sound. A message on your screen will tell you about the

emergency and how best to respond. You will be able to check an alert is genuine at gov.uk/alerts. You can opt out of receiving emergency alerts; for more information on how to opt out please go to gov.uk/alerts

our rector's thoughts

This month marks the coronation of King Charles III. For most of us – me included – this will be a first experience, as I was born shortly after our late Queen's coronation in 1953.

There has been guite a bit of speculation about how this might differ from 1953. The world and our country has changed dramatically over seventy years and it looks as if this coronation may be a little less grand and more inclusive, whilst maintaining the many ancient traditions. One particular change will be the fact that it will not feature the Koh-i-Noor diamond in our new Queen's crown. This diamond is controversial because of the circumstances in which it was acquired: it was seized by the East India Company in 1849 and presented to Queen Victoria. A spokesperson for the Indian prime minister, Narendra Modi, was reported as saving it "brings back painful memories of the colonial past". Nevertheless, the coronation, which is code-named 'Operation Golden Orb', will still feature many priceless jewels - the Queen will wear a modified version of Queen Mary's crown, made for the 1911 coronation and it will be full of grandeur and pageantry.

Notwithstanding these changes, at the heart of the coronation is still an Anglican service of worship. It is conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury, who will anoint the King with oil hearkening back to the anointing of Kings of Israel in the Old Testament. But there is one item given to the King which is described as 'the most valuable thing that this world affords'. You may be surprised to know that this 'most valuable thing' is the Holy Bible – a rather humble gift amongst so much wealth and power.

gardening

I am old enough to remember a big hit song from the late 1950s called 'The day the rains came down', by Jane Morgan. It would have made an appropriate musical backdrop to most of March, which had 123mm of rain in Markbeech, about five times the level for the same period last year.



Although the rain had left the grass in front of Hever village hall waterlogged, it did not detract from our Spring Show on 1st April, with the hall replete with a large variety of daffodils, tulips and many other spring flowers. There were also some splendid flower arrangements and the domestic classes were well represented with vegetarian sausage rolls, iars of lime marmalade and eight Simnel cakes. Cup winners for the show were Sue Harvey, Jane Rosam, Jean Mason and Emma Scott, Well done to all of them and to all who entered, in whatever class. It always amazes me the huge variety of shapes and colours of daffodils displayed but, in our garden, we do not have a large selection of the more unusual ones. So I have made a note to try some different varieties, with 'Tahiti' and 'Replete' top of the list.

At our last Hever Hort talk, on 19th March, Everett Leeds spoke about all

things Clematis, including hints and tips on taking cuttings. His advice is to choose a vine with a thin, new shoot growing at the end, and take cuttings which have a couple of leaves as side shoots. Put in a pot of Vermiculite (I use a mixture of Vermiculite and seed compost), cover with a clear plastic bag, leave in a warm place but not in direct sunlight, and wait! Also, do not over water. I took five cuttings of our Clematis Montana plants immediately after the talk and they seem to be thriving at the moment. Once established, they can be moved into individual pots, ready for planting out in the autumn

Speaking of plants, 13th May, 10am, sees our annual plant sale, either in Hever Village hall or on the grass outside, weather permitting. George Payne provides a lovely selection of plants and these are supplemented by a variety of flowers and vegetables grown by members, all at very reasonable prices. So come along and pick up a bargain, but don't leave it too late! Happy gardening! **Doug Bowern**




