

#### what I do - learning to play the church organ

My love affair with the sound of the church organ began in the mid 60's whilst at boarding school. Like a number of children who were learning the piano at the time. I happened to hear Bach's Toccata & Fugue in D minor and desperately wanted to play the Toccata, because it seemed easy and sounded great! My weekly lessons in the Congregational Church finished when Lleft school in 1968. I could play the Toccatta, but not accurately. I could make a lot of sound/noise by pulling out all the stops and impressing my school friends

That all changed in June 2022 when I met Tim Higgs, the Church Organist at St. Peter's. He went to work on trying to correct the many mistakes and bad habits I'd picked up over the past 54 years while trying to play said piece on both piano and keyboard. During the first lockdown in 2021, I'd set myself the task of learning the Fugue in D minor on the keyboard. I managed to learn most of the notes and play them..... almost in the right order!

prescribed (by Tim) fingering this whole venture seemed a very big challenge. However, I am persevering. Tim has all but given up trying to get me to use the correct feet and finger positions and while I will never become a concert organist, I enjoy what I play.

I am very lucky in being able to practice regularly at St. Peter's. It is a lovely church and the organ is as good or bad as whoever is lucky enough to play it. The church does get a steady trickle of visitors. Whilst most go unnoticed to me while practising, I do get the occasional visitor asking if I am the Vicar, the Church Organist, the Churchwarden or think I'm the Church Historian. I am quite self critical of my playing but when, to my surprise, someone who's been listening at the back says "thank you" for an unexpected bonus during their visit, I do feel perhaps my playing was not quite as bad as I thought.

The big problem came when I sat at the organ in St. Peter's. My feet had not been used for playing since 1968 and it seemed worse than trying to pat your head and rub your tummy at the same time. Coupled with trying to use both heels and toes at the right time and use the



#### **Memories of John Scott**

We said goodbye to our friend John Scott in June. John was known by many as an endlessly kind and energetic neighbour, always willing to help out: sitting on the Parish Council, lighting the beacon, rescuing cows and sheep from the river - and even prepared to put on tights for medieval banguets!

Duncan Leslie, CEO of Hever Castle says:

"He will be hugely missed. He was always quick to help with any problems and especially if we needed something moved with his telehandler. Pretty much everything of scale made of oak in the grounds had his hand on it from the many beautiful bridges, the arbour at the end of the Long Border, the pergola outside the Pavilion Restaurant to the Japanese Tea House - either he milled the timber and or helped in its construction and transport. He also kept our biomass boiler topped up each week, and always greeted staff, residents and guests with a warm friendly smile. He had a lovely sense of humour and just a wee bit of cheekiness too - we all enjoyed chatting with him - he was excellent company. I think it fair to say that here at the castle we considered him as part of the family."

Gerry and Jan Ryan say:

""He was a lovely guy, always had a smile, and a great contributor to village affairs. He will be greatly missed by many." This was the spontaneous reaction of our son, Ben, on receipt of the sad news of John's death Ben is a contemporary of Simon, John's son, and met up, (as did we) with the Scott family



– John and Pauline, daughter Caroline and Simon, when they all 'journeyed down the M6 from the Wirral with their herd of Holstein dairy cattle' (John's words!) to Polebrook Farm, in 1982. Polebrook's dairy farming activities were soon augmented to include sheep, and Pauline's included membership of Hever Church choir and the W.I. John added bell-ringing at St Peter's to his extensive list of talents which he continued for his lifetime.

John's dairy ambitions soon turned to bottling and distributing his own farm milk and cream. The installation of the bottling plant at the farm was a masterpiece of ingenuity and persistence – culminating in a temporary local electricity blackout as the new pasteurisation plant kicked in! Due to health reasons, John's massively active workload had to be reduced, so the farm staff was increased – including two 'dairymaids' – Jan Ryan and (neighbour) Sue Hayward, who struggled on



throughout unusually severe winter weather to bottle, label and prepare for delivery the 'daily pinta', (fortified by Pauline's mugs of hot chocolate).

In 1987, the weather again seriously impinged on John's career – firstly, severe

flooding called for massive efforts to rescue the neighbouring farmer's sheep from the swollen river Eden and secondly the Hurricane in October devastated the local countryside and in particular its tree population. The removal and processing of fallen timber was *de facto* a business opportunity for both John and Simon so "the Scott Partnership" was born and flourishes to this day, gradually and completely replacing the dairy business.

Knowledge of machinery in general and ownership of a great deal of kit made John's assistance popular and invaluable in many village undertakings - none less than in the production, erection, and operation of Hever's Village Beacon – first ceremonially lit to celebrate the 50th anniversary of VE Day in May 1995, and fuelled/lit/maintained whenever needed thereafter by John, Simon & co."

Jane Rosam says:

Sheep were one of Johns specialities. It was only little over a year ago when whilst I was looking after a few sheep for a friend, that unexpectedly one began to lamb. I was on the hotline to John immediately, he came round and a pair of lambs popped out. Marvellous, job done I thought - but John said "go get us a drink because I want to watch her". I did exactly that and ten minutes later John asked me for a rope. Two minutes after that John successfully delivered the triplet. "Gosh that was a long way down" he said. I was in awe. Quite how he knew, is still beyond me but John quietly knew a lot of things and was happy to share them. When Pauline died just over a year ago (her obituary is in the June 2022 Link, see www.Hever.org), John was heartbroken but still twinkled when he told me that their wedding date was set for 1 October 1970 because he reckoned that he would have finished the combining by then. Aged 80, John was still working in the business until the week he died - a real trooper and a good man. He will indeed be sorely missed.

#### farewell to Anne Cleeve

When Ann Roberts Cleeve asked you to do something, it was almost impossible to say no. I was press ganged onto the Parish Council and Jane became a poppy seller. If you visited Ann's house at poppy time, it resembled the Cabinet War Rooms, with piles of poppies, instructions and collecting boxes, strategically placed

ready for action. As well as receiving an MBE, she became President of the Hartfield and District branch of the British Legion - Andrew Izod tells me that she ran poppy day for over 50 years and raised many thousands of pounds.

Ann was also a stalwart of the Conservative Association and during her time as Chairman (not Chair "I don't like to be sat on and I'm as good as any man") she was

instrumental in selecting Tom Tugendhat for the constituency. He says: "Ann Cleeve was a remarkable person. When she saw problems, she fixed them and where she saw chaos she brought order to it. From her school in the woods, which made Markbeech a great place for young families like mine, to her commitment to the Royal British Legion, for which she was rightly decorated, she made our community a great place to live and helped so many. Ann was a committed Christian and a regular worshipper at St Lawrence, Edenbridge and will be missed by many. Our community has been lucky

to have Ann with us so long, working to the end."

Her crowning glory was of course her nursery school which she founded in 1965. not long after moving to Markbeech with her first husband. Mike. It was originally a temporary project while her sons Mark and Tim were voung but. as she told The Link in March 2019 "thev wouldn't let me

retire!" Many generations of children and adults round here are "my children" and a few years ago she celebrated the school's 50th birthday with a party for 200 pupils past and present. The most recent iteration of Ann's vision for child-centred nursery education is her forest school, run from



a lovely shepherd's hut in her garden so special is it that it was recently featured in the Daily Express.

One of my scariest ever speaking engagements was with the local women's branch of the British Legion which Ann chaired. As a lawyer, I was asked to talk about legal rights for working mothers and I was subjected to excoriating criticism about the very idea of working mothers - and the fact that Ann was the ultimate entrepreneur, managing to blend work and family cut no ice at all. We remained friends though, not least because Ann was always open to lively debate, loved to be teased and to laugh and giggle. Ann was a force of nature, indefatigably sociable, and always welcoming of visitors.

At the centre of her life were her friends and especially her family. She married John Cleeve in 2011 and they had nearly 12 very happy years together, travelling the world, erecting a marquee for a party at every conceivable opportunity and enjoying their collective brood of six sons and many grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Charlotte Desorgher remembers: "It was the day after we'd moved into Markbeech. A ring on the doorbell and an impressive-looking woman standing on the step. "Ann Greig tells me you've moved here from Four Elms and I've got to look after you! Would you like to come for drinks this evening and meet some of your other neighbours?". And

so began a 28-year deep and trusting friendship.

I think we may have seen a different side of Ann from some others. She was definitely formidable and could sometimes catch people on the wrong side, but I can tell you from the bottom of my heart that Ann's warmth, her generosity, her thoughtfulness and her love of people and parties knew no bounds. Ann relished a party like nobody else - from small dinners to celebrations of big life events. We enjoyed so many intimate supper parties around her table. And there was never a shortage of wine!

When Paul and I were on holiday we always knew that everything was safe. The cats were fed and stroked, the lights switched on and off, the curtains pulled and the post taken in. We never had to ask, it was just what she did, without auestion. Other memories? Ann with her donkeys; Ann planning and planting the vegetable plots with Paul: Ann in wellington boots. Barbour hat and jacket - but never without lipstick. Ann holding a baby and gazing at it with total love and adoration. She was the best neighbour we could ever have had and her passing will leave an enormous hole in our lives. Party on in heaven Ann!"

Ann died in 6 June aged 87. There will be a thanksgiving service in September to celebrate her and, as her family say, it is so sad that the ultimate party person won't be there to join in!

#### four elms cricket club

The earliest records available indicate that cricket was played at Four Elms from 1864 with the club officially forming in 1868. The original ground was on Lord Bramwell's fields, Holmwood, adjoining the cabbage field on the site that is now Boons Estate. It moved, via Four Elms Farm "near the nurse's cottage", to its present site in April 1890 when the current pavilion was built opposite St Paul's Church and close to the Four Elms Pub. The first game was held on Wednesday 23 April 1890 played by club members.

The following appeared in the Sussex Agricultural Express on Saturday 26 April 1890.

The members of the Four Elms Cricket Club opened their new ground on Wednesday last, when a good game was played by the members, sides being chosen by Messrs.

Goodwin and L. Tillman. At the conclusion of the game the members sat down to an excellent supper, under the chairmanship of the captain, Hogben, Esq., - when a very agreeable evening was spent - Hearty votes of thanks were carried unanimously to H. Williams Esq., for his generosity in giving use of the new ground, and also in fencing it in, and to Major

#### Noise nuisance

#### 

Noise nuisance has been raised as an issue by residents several times recently and it can be troubling to the point that of interfering with our rights to quiet enjoyment of our homes. Noise nuisance is any loud or persistent noise that causes ongoing concern or affects quality of life. Sevenoaks District Council should be the first contact for reporting problems. SDC has a helpful page on this - search 'Noise and other Nuisance' on sevenoaks. gov.uk - the out of hours number to call as 01732 227000.

An App is also now available enabling users to record noise nuisance, report it directly to an officer and create a personal diary of recordings. This is not an instant intervention but is helpful in bringing noise nuisance to the attention of SDC and could be an effective deterrent if a number of residents report the same incident.

Once a report is logged via the App a letter is sent to the subject advising them of the complaint, and requests they make contact. They are not told who has made the complaint. A letter is also sent to the complainant. After 3 weeks the noise App recordings are assessed to see whether the advice given in the letter has been taken. If sufficient evidence of nuisance is obtained an Abatement Notice can then be served as a final written warning. Any further incidents would then be a breach of the Notice and an offence for which the culprit could be prosecuted.

Noise nuisance is usually assessed in terms of how occupiers/ residents are affected in their homes based on what is reasonable, and the frequency, the duration and the intensity of the activity.

#### **Annual Report**

The Chair reported it had been a busy year, with some highlights being:

- Two wonderful community celebrations for the Platinum Jubilee and King Charles III Coronation that HPC helped to sponsor
- Awarding Grants totalling £8,638.83 to local groups including Eden Valley Museum, Hever Film Club, all three village halls, Four Elms and Hever schools, Air Ambulance, Samaritans, Home-Start South West Kent, Edenbridge Foodbank. Some funding is still available so applications are welcome.
- The state of some of the public footpaths was raised. A Councillor is carrying out a survey of the 52 footpaths in the parish. HPC will look at ways to help contribute to their repair. Please raise any issues you are aware of.
- Continued funding of the Bulk Refuse Freighter. Next collection is July 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- Family fun day took place in August at Four Elms field. Another one arranged for Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup>
  August 2023.
- Volunteers helped clear debris from the pond drains and spruced-up the Four Elms pond area.
   Thanks to all who gave their time.
- Concerns were raised with Police and Kent Highways regarding accidents at Four Elms
  crossroads and traffic speed throughout the parish. HPC has submitted the annual Highway
  Improvement Plan and several meetings have taken place with Highways and speed surveys
  carried out. The outcome and plan of action are awaited.
- Volunteers from the parish participated in the annual Community Litter Pick collecting more than 50 bags of rubbish from around the parish. Thanks to all who took part.
- The internal audit reported that HPC is compliant with both financial and regulatory frameworks.
- Elections HPC had an uncontested election, with nine councillors re-elected. The annual meeting has taken place and key roles appointed. One councillor seat is vacant.
- District Councillors -Cllr James Barnett is our new District Councillor who was welcomed.
- HPC, a consultee on all planning applications within the parish, commented on 27 different Planning Applications, 9 Appeals and 1 Licencing Application. The Planning Committee volunteer their time to investigate, consider and formulate a view for the Planning Authority, Sevenoaks District Council.
- During the year Stephen Sadler, stepped down. Stephen was Chair of the Planning Committee.
   Thanks for his contribution and commitment to the residents of Hever Parish. Mark Thomas was co-opted as Councillor.

#### our rector's thoughts

Have a look at https://www. youtube.com/watch?v=C tOiQOG g4 and see the former Archbishop of York, Rt.Revd. John Sentamu, conducting outdoor full immersion baptisms on Easter day in York! This year we are conducting an outdoor baptism (more commonly known as 'christening') at our July Forest church. Hopefully it will be a lot warmer than York at Easter! This is one of three baptisms we have over the summer. Baptism isn't exclusively for small infants plus I am delighted we have two young women preparing for confirmation in September. Confirmation is a way of saying 'yes' to the promises made on our behalf when and if we were baptised as infants.

Baptism is the service of initiation into the Christian faith. It's welcoming the person baptised into the worshipping community, which is why we conduct baptisms in our mainstream services. This enables our congregation to welcome the person being baptised and promise to support and pray for them and their family in their pilgrimage of faith. Baptism is rich in symbolism and is the one rite recognised across all Christian denominations. This includes the idea of being washed clean and of receiving the outpouring of the Holy Spirit as the water is poured over the head. Particularly, if by full immersion, it symbolises being

united with Christ in his death and resurrection - a bit like being 'born again'. My earliest memory was my own baptism when I was just three vears old. The one thing I remember was the priest signing my forehead with the sign of the cross. When this is done, the priest says: Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross. But I didn't actually go on to attend church nor consider myself a Christian as I grew up. But it was when I did 'turn to Christ', as the service says, when I was sixteen that I was in due course confirmed. Looking back, I do feel that I had always belonged to Christ; it just took me thirteen years to realise it.

Please do get in touch with me for a confidential chat whether you are parents of a small or older child you would like christened or if you would like to consider baptism and/or confirmation for yourself.

Please note that our Pool service at our home in Penshurst this year will be on 16<sup>th</sup> July in place of our normal Four Elms at Four Family service. Do also consider coming to our contemporary service at Markbeech on 2<sup>nd</sup> July at 6pm when we have a live worship band, Cabin Worship, playing.

#### gardening

The Hever Hort reached a significant milestone at the recent 'meet the village' event when we 'recruited' our 100th member, probably the highest membership in the long history of our society. We held our annual Rose show on the 10th June and it was a bit worrying as the strange weather meant that entries were initially down on previous years but a late flurry of exhibits ensured an excellent show, with Hever village hall looking very colourful.



The three prize-winners were; Sue Theobald for the best bowl of roses, Mary Peacock for the best exhibit of sweet peas, and Jane Rosam for the most points in the flowering classes. Well done to them, to all who entered, and all those who helped to make the show a big success. Just a special mention to Mary for her sweet peas, which were the most wonderful we have seen for some time. We now have a bit of a breather before the **Summer show on 19th August, 2pm.** 

The June RHS Garden magazine had an article on clay soil, rock hard in summer and sticking to our spades in

winter, and predominant in this area. Although notoriously hard to work, it is rich in nutrients and can be made easier to dig by the addition of compost or fine wood chips. I have even added some pea shingle to improve its workability. The article suggests a number of plants suitable for growing in clay, so I have just picked out a few. Geranium magnificum is recommended which has a profusion of purple flowers and, if trimmed in early summer, gives a second flush of flowers later in the season. Pulmonaria 'Trevi Fountain' is another recommendation with beautiful blue flowers in spring, and can also provide colour to a shaded area. We have peonies which do well in our garden, even though they are quite short lived, and Paeonia 'Coral Charm' is commended for its ability to thrive on clay and has a lovely combination of peach and coral flowers. All these recommended flowers are adm (award of garden merit). which means they have been given a seal of approval by the RHS that the plant will perform well in the garden.


