This is a year of anniversaries, notably the UK will commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Normandy Landings on 6 June 1944 with a series of major commemorations and events across the UK and in France. Also known as D-Day, the historic operation saw the Allied Forces mount a large-scale invasion of Nazi-occupied France that ultimately tipped the course of the Second World War in the Allies' favour.

...which kitchen implement would you save from the waves?

Pat Fletcher has recently moved to Edenbridge after 64 years in White Post Cottages, Four Elms. She may have downsized, but she was sure to take her mother's precious rolling pin with her. Pat and her husband Buddy came to White Post when they married in 1961. They had no electricity for the first six years, using paraffin lamps instead. It was so quiet they were surprised if a car went past and they could walk to the shops near the Four Elms crossroads, Allmans the butcher, Crystals and Brownings the general stores, and the Post Office.

When their two sons, Stephen and David, reached their teens, she started working in the National Trust restaurant at Chartwell, selling ice creams before moving into the kitchen and ending up as manager. She learnt a lot of NT recipes, and even created a few herself, at least one of which was published. A high point was being sent to learn how to make eclairs with Mr Porcherot at his french bakery shop in Edenbridge. Choux pastry is still her speciality and Pat passed her skills on to her grandaughter, Rachael, who is an accomplished baker.

Pat says she wasn't as good at sponge as her mother who made excellent cakes, and loved pastry too. She didn't have much in her life, says Pat, so as soon as she could afford it, she bought her mother a Pyrex rolling pin. Good pastry needs cold hands, and this rolling



pin could be filled with cold water for extra effect. Pat treasures it and, as the picture shows, she even has the box. She regularly used it to make mince pies for the Four Elms carol service and only stopped quite recently when her sons put their collective feet down.

Pat also fondly remembers her father. Indeed, an aluminium scoop he made, being a carpenter and excellent with his hands, passed down to her to use in the garden and is now cherished by David. These everyday items can hold great significance!

Mavis Seal

It sounds a grand thing to say but an era has ended in Hever with the death of Mavis on 2 March aged 98. Not only did she live here for many years, she was probably the last of the Astor staff who had helped to run the castle as a family home.

Mavis came to Hever from Beckenham at the end of WW2 to work for what she called "Kent War Ag", billeted at Hever Grange. This involved farm work, although she was deemed too small to do milking. She was unhappy at first as some of the girls were "a bit wild", but she enjoyed pruning apple trees and cycling up to Ide Hill to bale hay. Then one day she met Ken, a local lad working on the Castle farm, and romance blossomed, they married in 1946.

When Ken got bronchitis he went inside to help the butler, in time being promoted to the top job himself. When her children got old enough, Mavis started as a housekeeper in the Castle, she particularly remembered cleaning the teasmades in every room - the around here" were the first words we heard from Mavis as she sat in her usual spot with Ken in The Henry. While we may have achieved this, it is most certainly dwarfed by her 80. Since the beginning of the pandemic, as a family we grew closer to Mavis, initially helping her with her weekly food shop alongside Jimmy and co at Allmans and Penny. Always immaculately presented with her scarf, gloves and brooch for our excursions, whether for Covid jabs or coffee and cakes, her small set of steps always came too so she could get in and out of the car – an incredibly petite lady and a great force of nature!

Mavis' amazing memory and wonderful sense of humour really brought the stories she told to life. She lived in several houses in Hever, including ours and the Red House. An avid gardener, she taught me not only about plants but also the history of our garden. She also loved watching local wildlife - only recently we were talking about how 'her birds' were the best fed in Hever, with bird food often

height of luxury! Ken was also the chauffeur and he and Mavis would regularly drive up to Tillypronie, the family's estate in Scotland, with their silver plate in the boot - a must for entertaining guests!

Her friend Amy Davies takes up the story:

"Well, welcome – it only takes 20 years to become a local



topping her shopping list! For as long as she was able, Mavis greatly enjoyed local events including the sadly now disbanded Women's Institute, Hever Hort and the Parish Lunches. Even as she became less mobile, as an avid reader of The Link she managed to keep her finger on the pulse of all that is Hever. The main highlight of course were weekend visits from her children, Glenys and Kevin, who she loved coming to stay with her. It was a privilege to get to know them too and also to hear all about their life growing up in Hever.

Mavis will be sorely missed with many cherished memories both of our time together and the stories she shared."

Jan Tolfree, secretary of the Hever Rose and Horticulture Society says: "Mavis was a

stalwart member and often entered classes in past shows. She donated the Mavis Seal Salver for the highest number of points in the domestic classes presented at the Spring Show. This year [6 April] will be even more important to the winner."

When the Astors sold Hever in the early 80s they made sure that the Seals were housed for life on the estate - a final gesture of thanks to a couple who had served them so well. Duncan Leslie Castle CEO writes:

"Mavis – a real loss to the Castle, she has been here so long and she was the last of the resident Astor pensioners. She and Ken had retired in 1983 when the current owners bought the estate. While she was small in stature, she was big in personality. She impressed me when I first met her and Ken 17 years ago they came across as very content and enjoyed telling me all sorts of stories about Hever in the past. Mavis clearly had a sharp mind which Amy who shopped for them confirmed as she always checked the receipts added up properly! She was also entirely able when it came to modern technology – happy with both emails and facetime. We are fortunate to have a recording of her and Ken talking about their memories of their time working for the Astors – currently playing in the Moat Room of the castle. Alas the end of an era."

All are welcome at Mavis's funeral on Wednesday 10 April in the Kent and Sussex Crematorium at 11.30, and for refreshments afterwards at the Castle.



Pat Theobald 1938-2024

Pat Theobald whose funeral was recently held at Markbeech, had been born in Hong Kong where her father was a Major in the British Army. After some vears in Africa, the family returned to the UK and Pat was to meet her husband Dick locally (in a cowshed!) as she worked for the Milk Marketing Board. A marriage of nearly 60 years followed, together with children Debbie and Lindsay and a lifelong love of the area and countryside. But whilst in later years she lost her eyesight and some mobility, it seems that Pat never lost her interest in the world around her and local matters. in Four Elms. Pat found great enjoyment in her family - Grandsons Aaron and Jordan and Great Grandchildren Grace. Georgie and Theo. Pat had a long and good life in a place she loved, surrounded by her family and close friends.





World Book Day Delights at Four Elms Primary School

At Four Elms, World Book Day was more than just a single day celebration - it was a week-long extravaganza dedicated to fostering a love for reading and creativity among students. Throughout the week, a visiting poet inspired students with their words. encouraging them to explore their own creative potential. A book swapping event allowed students to exchange stories promoting a sense of community and shared enthusiasm for reading. In addition to this, our youngest EYFS pupils had the opportunity to bring their favourite books to life through a hands-on craft and dance workshop, whilst Key Stage 1 took part in a drama workshop.

The highlight of the week was undoubtedly the costume catwalk, where students transformed into their favourite book characters and paraded their costumes for all to see. Guided by



the playful antics of Silly Billy from Stag Theatre, the catwalk was a fun celebration of books. The week culminated in a poetry slam finale, where students showcased the poems that they had been creating throughout the week. During the week, pupils also took part in a sponsored read, with the aim of raising more funds to further develop our reading areas within school.



Since then, learning experiences have resumed. Class One have been delving into Van Gogh's art, learning how to use the technique of impasto to create their

> art work. Class Two finished their previous experience with an enjoyable visit to Emmetts garden. Now, they are busy learning about the Great Storm of 1987. Class three are sampling a taste of Italy in their experience where they are learning more about countries in Europe. 'Things have improved significantly over the last year.' Ofsted Letter (February 2024)

I am pleased to be able to share some of the positive feedback from our Ofsted monitoring inspection on 1st February 2024 which acknowledges the impact of the actions taken and the progress made at Hever School over the past year. You can read the full letter on our website: <u>https://www.hever.kent.sch.uk/ofstedreports/</u>. It is a little frustrating that a monitoring visit cannot change the current judgment since this requires a full inspection; however, it is a very positive read which captures the journey we are on and the significant progress made.

Highlights include positive statements such as:

- 'Leaders have brought in clear principles for effective teaching and learning'
- 'Teachers have the knowledge of strategies to effectively support pupils with special education needs and/or disabilities'
- 'Pupils are becoming more confident and capable in mathematics due to increased opportunities to practice and because they are taught to explain how they arrive at their answers'

Understandably, the letter does not include all of the feedback given to senior leaders, governors, and representatives from the Local Authority and the Diocese on the day. I was particularly proud of the feedback on our



Early Years Foundation Stage provision where the Inspector noted that there is an appropriate mix of directed and continuous provision in Reception, that activities are purposeful and children engage in meaningful play. As a result, pupils are well-engaged, happy and safe. Across the wider school, the inspector commented on the adaptations in place to make the curriculum more challenging and noted that pupils complete tasks with confidence and discuss their learning in a knowledgeable way.

At Hever, we are committed to ensuring the children access a rich curriculum which extends beyond the National Curriculum requirements. This term this has included a number of exciting events including an inspiring Arts Week (see the next page for examples), a wealth of activities to celebrate and promote reading on World Book Day and a visit to the Science Observatory at Herstmonceux for our Key Stage 2 pupils. Next week we are looking forward to our annual Poetry Recitation Competition which develops children's oratory skills whist promoting an appreciation of poetry.

our rector's thoughts

Life is very fragile. This was brought home to me recently when, following a tiny gardening cut on her finger, my wife, Susie contracted Sepsis and needed to be in hospital for multiple operations on her left hand to remove infected material. She has now returned home from East Grinstead following reconstructive plastic surgery and is predicted to need six months to recover! We're so grateful for all the wishes of support and prayers from the community – thank you.

The fragility of life is reflected in the challenge of being three churches in a small rural community. For example, social and demographic changes such as later retirement dates and the cost of childcare mean a reducing pool of people with the time to volunteer. Nevertheless, there are benefits to volunteering: it reduces loneliness, connects us with the community, improves mental health and gives us meaning and purpose. But when it comes to the church, we're told that we live in a culture that dislikes organised religion.

Jesus' disciples were a motley crew of very different people: Matthew, a tax collector who collaborated with the Romans, Simon the zealot, who was part of a terrorist group, Peter, the impetuous fisherman and Thomas the doubter. They weren't guaranteed to get along and from time to time they didn't! Yet it was through this potentially dysfunctional community, empowered by the Holy Spirit, that God turned the world upside down (Acts 17:6).

We live in a highly individualistic world which is arguably opposed to this kind of community. We may say we're too busy and have enough friends so don't need to be part of a church. But the friends we choose can be of the same age or social group. They do not challenge us in the way we are challenged by the diverse mishmash of people, which is called the church. Sharing our lives with others can be part of the solution to such individualism. This is because it's in doing life together that we wrench our selfish eyes away from ourselves onto serving others. So do give some thought to joining us...and if you did feel able to volunteer in any way at all. do aet in touch.

Finally, April is the month for our annual meetings of our three churches. At Holy Trinity Markbeech, MarieLou Linklater is retiring as church warden after ten years in the post. We're very grateful for all that MarieLou has done; I am particularly thankful for her hard work editing and producing such excellent video recordings of services each week during the Covid period in addition to regular church warden duties. We all wish MarieLou a good break and a successful house move in due course.

gardening

On my playlist I have a song called 'Running to stand still' by U2. It could be my musical accompaniment for this time of year in our garden since, as I get older and slower, everything in our garden seems to grow more guickly. So I am still playing catchup with jobs that should have been completed before now, mainly just basic clearing up, cutting back and shaping some of our shrubs. Of course, the extraordinary rainfall we have recently had has played its part in preventing progress with these tasks, 139mm recorded for February in Markbeech, compared with just 4mm last year!

I have tried to follow Simon Sutcliffe's advice in last month's Link, i.e. time to get your seeds going! So far, culinary seeds started include broad beans (Witkein Manita), potatoes (2nd early, Kestrel) and tomatoes (Cocktail crush). Sweet peas were started in January and are doing well so far. This year it will be two varieties, 'Old fashioned Mix' and 'Miss Wilmott', plus a mixture of seeds saved from last year. There are about 60 growing, so hopefully there will be some available for sale at our **Annual Plant Sale, on 11th May, 10am, at Hever Village Hall.**

There is a proliferation of advice in the gardening sections of newspapers and magazines for jobs to do in Spring, so here are a couple of seasonal tasks to consider. No-dig beds are becoming more popular as we think more about climate change, and they are quite easy to make. Remove any perennial weeds from the bed and chop down any other vegetation. Put a layer of cardboard over



and cover with about 7cm of compost. Then just make a hole in the cardboard to take each plant. Secondly, once tulips are growing well, water every couple of weeks with liquid seaweed at the base of the plant. When flowering is complete remove the flower head but keep the leaves on so that energy goes into the bulb.

The Hever Hort year is well under way, with talks on the Ashdown Forest and the Gardens of Sissinghurst Castle under our horticultural belts. Our next event will be the **Spring Show on 7th April, at Hever Village Hall, 2pm.** As usual, we worry about whether the currently resplendent host of daffodils will still be available for the show. Let's hope so!

Happy gardening and may the weather be with you!


